## GAMES 7-8 ▲ 2007-08 SEASON

**THIS WEEKEND:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team ventures to Columbus, Ohio, this weekend (Nov. 2 and 4) for a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series versus the Ohio State Buckeyes. The contests represent the only 2007-08 regular-season meetings between the two teams.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday and Sunday – 7:05 p.m. (EDT) & 2:05 p.m. (EST)/Value City Arena (17,500).

**THE BROADCAST:** All of Ferris State's 2007-08 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at [www.ferris.edu/sports](http://www.ferris.edu/sports). **VIDEO WEBCASTS:** A live video and audio webcast is available for all 2007-08 Ferris State home hockey games through B2Networks for a charge of \$6 per contest. Just click on the B2Networks icon which is located at [www.ferris.edu/sports](http://www.ferris.edu/sports) to access.

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State improved to 2-3-1 overall and 1-1-0 in the CCHA after upsetting nationally 12th-ranked Notre Dame, 3-0, last Saturday (10/27) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. Ferris dropped a 3-2 home decision to the Fighting Irish in the Bulldogs' CCHA opener last Friday (10/26). FSU is presently 0-2-0 on the road, 2-1-1 at home, and 0-0-0 at neutral sites this season.

☛ Ferris State compiled a 14-22-3 overall record a season ago, which included a ninth place 10-16-2 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 9-8-1 in home contests for the 2006-07 campaign.

**Ohio State** dropped to 2-4-0 overall and is 0-2-0 in the CCHA after suffering a pair of non-conference losses to nationally-ranked Minnesota last week (10/25-26) at UM's Mariucci Arena in Minneapolis, Minn. OSU suffered a 3-1 loss to the Gophers last Thursday (10/25) and then were dealt a 2-1 setback in Friday's (10/26) series finale. The Buckeyes, who are presently midst a four-game losing string, were among teams receiving votes in both the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* and *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* polls this week. OSU is 0-1-0 at home, 0-3-0 on the road, and 2-0-0 at neutral sites to date this campaign.

☛ Ohio State finished the 2006-07 campaign at 15-17-5 overall with a seventh-place 12-12-4 CCHA mark.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels**

(Michigan State, 1982), 16th season, 241-289-52 (.459) – (20-26-3 vs. Ohio State – 5-16-1 Away, 15-9-2 Home, 0-1-0 Neutral). **Ohio State – John Markell** (Bowling Green State, 1979), 13th season, 232-213-42 (.519) – (23-17-2 vs. Ferris State). Markell has led the Buckeyes to five NCAA Tournament appearances and boasts six 20-or-more win seasons during his tenure at OSU. He was tabbed the 1997-98 CCHA Coach of the Year and was a runner-up for national coach of the year honors.

**ABOUT OHIO STATE:** The Buckeyes are paced in scoring by senior forward Tommy Goebel (2-2=4) while freshman forward Peter Boyd (2-1=3), senior forward Tom Fritsche (1-2=3), senior defenseman Kyle Hood (1-2=3), and senior forward Matt McLivane (1-2=3). Sophomore goaltender Joseph Palmer (2-4-0, 3.18 GAA, .896sv%) has played exclusively in net for the Buckeyes to date this campaign. Fritsche received the 2007 Terry Flanagan Memorial Award for perseverance and dedication. The Buckeyes presently rank 47th in scoring offense (1.83 gpg.) among the national statistical leaders and are tied for 39th in scoring defense (3.17 gpg.). OSU is tied for 18th nationally in power-play efficiency (16.7%; 5/30) and is tied for 32nd place in penalty-killing (86.7%; 26/30).

• **O'Keefe Picks Up CCHA Weekly Honor** - Junior goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almonte, Ontario)** has been selected as this week's (10/29) CCHA Goaltender of the Week after stopping all 37 shots in a 3-0 league home win over nationally-ranked Notre Dame last Saturday (10/27) while receiving Perani Cup First Star of the Game recognition. The Ferris State netminder garnered CCHA Goaltender of the Week kudos last season (11/27/06) after earning both CCHA Goaltender of the Week (11/14/05) and CCHA Rookie of the Week (10/24/05) plaudits in the 2005-06 campaign.

• **Whitewashed** - Ferris State's 3-0 home triumph over nationally-ranked Notre Dame last Saturday (10/27) marked the Bulldogs first shutout of the Fighting Irish since Feb. 13, 1999, when FSU skated to a 1-0 road decision. Ferris has prevailed in four of the six shutouts in its all-time series versus Notre Dame.

• **Puck Stopper** - **Mitch O'Keefe** registered his fourth career shutout with last Saturday's (10/27) victory over Notre Dame and already has matched his one shutout season total in 29 outings a season ago. The 2005-06 FSU Rookie of the Year, is within two shutouts of moving into a second-place tie with Vince Owen (1997-01) and Phil Osaer (1998-01) on the program's all-time leaders list.

• **November Is Miller Time** - Senior left wing **Adam Miller (Livonia)** has amassed nine points (5-4=9) in 19 November games during his Bulldog career, which includes eight points (4-4=8) in nine 2005-06 November encounters. Miller notched one point (1-0=1) in four outings last November with a lamplighter in a home match versus Michigan (11/18).

• **Nearing The Top 10** - **Mitch O'Keefe** is 20 saves away from tying for 10th place among Ferris State's all-time saves leaders with Glenn Raeburn (1985-87; 1,561 career saves). O'Keefe owns a present 22-31-11 career mark with a 2.78 goals-against average (175 goals allowed) and a .898 save percentage (1,541 saves) in 64 contests.

• **30th Anniversary** - The 2007-08 season represents the 30th anniversary for the Ferris State men's ice hockey program competing at the NCAA Division I level. The Bulldogs registered a 10-24-0 overall record in the 1978-79 season which marked their NCAA Division I debut.

• **Making His Case** - Sophomore defenseman **Matt Case (Plymouth, Minn.)** has posted five points (1-4=5) in his last three outings and registered his second multiple-point game this season with two assists in the win over Notre Dame last Saturday (10/27). Case's five points (1-4=5) in as many games this campaign is five shy of matching his 2006-07 season total of 10 points (4-6=10) in 29 contests.

• **Shortie Strikes** - Ferris State's two short-handed goals against Notre Dame last Saturday (10/27) by junior center **Matt Frank (Billings, Mont.)** and freshman center **Justin Menke (Shamrock, Saskatchewan)** marked the team's first multi short-handed goal contest since the 2005-06 season when the Bulldogs tallied a pair of shorties in a 6-3 non-league decision at Mercyhurst (11/25/05). Frank and Eric Vesely accounted for FSU's short-handed lamplighters in that contest.

• **Productive Penalty-Killing** - The Bulldogs are operating at 89.2% (33-37) efficiency on the penalty kill this season in its initial six contests. A season ago at this time, Ferris had an 87.8% (36-41) success rate in penalty-kill situations.

• **Making A Point** - Sophomore center **Aaron Lewicki (Livonia)** has a point in four (1-3=4) of his last five games after picking up an assist in both games of the Notre Dame series.

## HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association

(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 16th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-



place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-08 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
