THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team returns to the ice this weekend (Nov. 30-Dec. 1) for a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home-and-home series versus the Western Michigan University Broncos. Ferris State hosts WMU in this Friday's (Nov. 30) series opener at Big Rapids, Mich., before the Bulldogs skate on the Broncos' home ice in this Saturday's (Dec. 1) finale at Kalamazoo, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewingleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493) & Saturday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Lawson Ice Arena (3,667).

THE BROADCAST: All of Ferris State's 2007-08 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. **VIDEO WEBCASTS:** A live video and audio webcast is available for all 2007-08 Ferris State home hockey games through B2Networks for a charge of \$6 per contest. Just click on the B2Networks icon which is located at www.ferris.edu/sports to access. **TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2007-08 Bulldog home hockey games can be purchased by contacting the FSU Athletics Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State, which was idle last weekend, is 5-6-1 overall and 4-4-0 in the CCHA as a result of splitting a league road series with Nebraska-Omaha two weeks ago (11/16 & 18) at the Qwest Center Omaha in Omaha, Neb. FSU prevailed 5-1 over the Mavericks in the series opener (11/16) before suffering a 2-0 loss in the finale (11/18). Ferris, which is 4-3-0 in its last seven outings to date, is 2-3-1 at home and 3-3-0 on the road to date this campaign.

☛ Ferris State compiled a 14-22-3 overall record a season ago, which included a ninth-place 10-16-2 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 9-8-1 at home, 5-14-1 on the road, and 0-0-1 at neutral sites for the 2006-07 campaign.

Western Michigan is 4-8-0 overall and 2-6-0 in the CCHA to date after splitting a two-game league home series against Ohio State last weekend (11/23-24) at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich. The Broncos posted a 4-2 victory over the Buckeyes in last Friday's (11/23) opener before suffering a 3-0 loss on Saturday (11/24). WMU sports a 1-5-0 road mark and is 3-3-0 at home this season.

☛ A season ago, Western Michigan compiled an

18-18-1 overall record with a sixth-place 14-13-1 CCHA ledger.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 16th season, 244-292-52 (.459) – (23-24-2 vs. Western Michigan – 13-9-1 Home, 10-14-1 Away, 1-1-0 Neutral). **Western Michigan – Jim Culhane** (Western Michigan, 1987), 9th season, 132-163-30 (.452) (14-16-0 vs. Ferris State). Culhane, who played at WMU from 1983-87, is the first former varsity player to serve as the program's head coach. He went on to play five professional seasons, which included a stint with the NHL's Hartford Whalers in 1989-90.

ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN: Junior right wing Patrick Galivan (2-12=14) and junior left wing Jeff LoVecchio (5-5=10) along with freshman center Max Campbell (3-6=9) lead the Broncos in scoring. Galivan is tied for 34th place among the national scoring leaders and is tied for top honors in assists (1.00 avg.). Sophomore Riley Gill (4-6-0, 3.01 GAA, .900sv%) and freshman Jerry Kuhn (0-2-0, 3.27 GAA, .881sv%) have shared goaltending duties this season. WMU ranks tied for 36th nationally in scoring offense (2.50 gpg.) and is 44th in scoring defense (3.17 gpg.)

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 16th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-08 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

• **30th Anniversary** – The 2007-08 season represents the 30th anniversary for the Ferris State men's ice hockey program competing at the NCAA Division I level. The Bulldogs registered a 10-24-0 overall record in the 1978-79 season which marked their NCAA Division I debut.

• **Season-Best Match** – Freshman goaltender **Pat Nagle's (Bloomfield)** 31 saves in the Bulldogs' 5-1 win at Nebraska-Omaha (11/16) matched a single-season high. Nagle, who was selected fourth among the top 10 incoming goaltenders for the 2007-08 campaign by *Inside College Hockey.com*, turned aside 31 shots in a home league contest versus Notre Dame (10/26).

• **The Newcomers** – Ferris State's eight-member freshman class has accounted for 17.1% (14-82) of the team's points production this season. Freshman defenseman **Zach Redmond (Traverse City)** has five points (2-3=5) in 10 contests to lead all FSU freshmen.

• **Frankly Speaking** – Junior right wing **Matt Frank's (Billings, Mont.)** three points (1-2=3) in 12 outings this season is one shy of equaling his 2006-07 season total of four points (1-3=4) in 33 contests. The two-time (2006-07 and 2007-08) FSU assistant captain's best season was in 2005-06 when he registered 12 points (4-8=12) in 34 contests.

• **Tech Nets First One** – Freshman defenseman **Scott Wietecha (Wolverine Lake)** tallied his first collegiate lamplighter in the win at Nebraska-Omaha (11/16) with a first-period power-play marker which also represented the game winner.

• **A Productive Start** – Junior defenseman **Evan Case (Grosse Pointe Woods)** matched his career single-season high with his fourth point (0-4=4) of the season on an assist at Nebraska-Omaha (11/16). Case, who has played in all 12 contests this season, had four points (1-3=4) in 28 games last season.

• **Five For Five** – Sophomore center **Cody Chupp (Big Rapids)** has compiled five points (2-3=5) in his last five games after starting this season with three points (1-2=3) in his initial seven contests. Chupp's three points (1-2=3) occurred in a two-game non-league home series against Wayne State (10/19-20).

• **Mighty Mitch** – Junior goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almonte, Ontario)** is 44 saves away from tying Jeff Blashill (1994-98; 1,666 career saves) for eighth place on Ferris State's all-time career saves leaders list. O'Keefe has presently amassed 1,622 career stops in 68 games. The 2005-06 FSU Rookie of the Year is currently seventh among the school's netminding leaders in minutes played with a 3,973 career total and is 51 shy of tying Jeff Blashill's sixth-place 4,024 total minutes.

• **The Nominee** – Senior defenseman **Adam Welch (Hastings, Minn.)** has been nominated for the Lowe's Senior CLASS (Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying In School) Award. The award, which was first created in 2001, is designed to honor the attributes of seniors who remain committed to their university and elect to pursue the many rewards that a senior season can bring. Welch is a three-year team captain and only the fourth skater in FSU history to serve in that capacity for more than two seasons. He earned his first point of the 2007-08 season with a helper at Nebraska-Omaha (11/16).

• **Did You Know?** – Junior left wing **Brendan Connolly (Canmore, Alberta)** has chalked up a team-best seven points (4-3=7) in six November games this season after totaling two points (0-2=2) in six October outings. Last season, Connolly went scoreless in five November contests after garnering six points (2-4=6) in seven October matchups. He was profiled in *Inside College Hockey.com's* 2007-08 Player Preview this past summer.

- ◆ Ferris State and Western Michigan will meet for the 112th and 113th times this weekend in a series which dates back to the 1977-78 season. The Broncos presently have a 64-41-6 lead over the Bulldogs in the all-time series.
- ◆ **OVERTIME** -- Ferris State has compiled a 2-1-5 record in such contests versus Western Michigan.
- ◆ **THE SITE** -- Ferris State is 24-24-3 at home, 16-36-3 on the road, and 1-4-0 at neutral sites against Western Michigan.
- ◆ **BOB DANIELS vs. WESTERN MICHIGAN** -- 23-24-2 overall (13-9-1 at home, 9-14-1 on the road, and 1-1-0 at neutral sites).

SERIES NOTES – Ferris State is 19-15-1 (.557) against Western Michigan in the last 35 meetings between the two teams. The Bulldogs are 10-5-1 at home, 8-9-0 on the road, and 1-1-0 at neutral sites versus the Broncos during that period.
