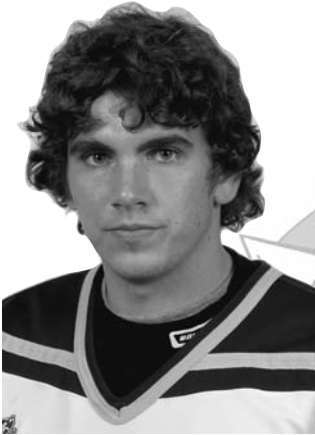

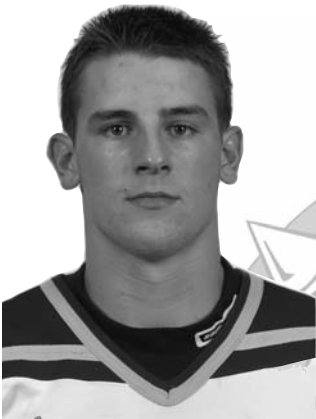

2007-08: A solid "defensive" defenseman . . . Should be a solid contributor on the blueline throughout the upcoming season and also is a proven offensive threat . . . 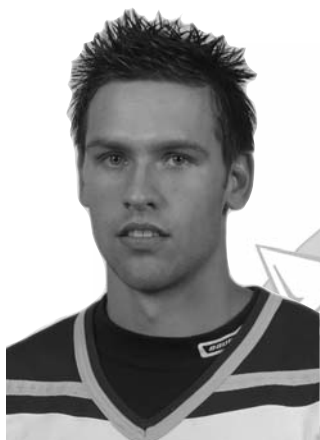

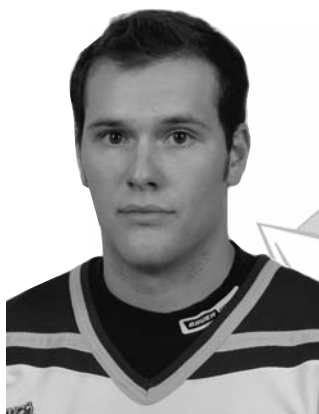
