THE BROADCAST: No Ferris State Hockey radio broadcast will be available for this weekend's non-league series at Robert Morris. However, live video streaming of both contests can be accessed at www.rmucolonials.com.

• **RECORDS:** Ferris State opened the 2008-09 season with a non-league series split against the Canisius Golden Griffins last weekend (Oct. 10-11) at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs are listed among other teams in this week's (10/14) *U.S. College Hockey Online/CBS College Sports XXL* Poll with seven points. Ferris concluded the 2007-08 season with an 18-16-5 overall record and placed fifth in the final CCHA regular-season standings at 12-12-4 (28 points). FSU sported a 9-6-3 home mark a season ago and was 6-4-1 in non-league affairs.

• **Robert Morris** began its 2008-09 campaign last Saturday (Oct. 11) with a 3-1 non-conference loss to Merrimack at the Lawler Arena in North Andover, Mass. The Colonials, who were tabbed to finish tied for third in the 2008 College Hockey America (CHA) Preseason Coaches Poll, were 15-15-4 overall with a third-place 10-7-3 league mark. RMU notched a 6-6-1 record in home outings last season.

THE COACHES: **Ferris State – Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 17th season, 258-303-56 (.464) – (0-0-0 vs. Robert Morris – 0-0-0 Home, 0-0-0 Away, 0-0-0 Neutral). **Robert Morris – Derek Schooley** (Western Michigan, 1994), 5th season, 49-76-13 (.402) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State). Schooley was named the first head coach in Robert Morris history. Prior to RMU, Schooley spent four years at the Air Force Academy as an assistant coach before spending one season at Air Force as an associate head coach. He was a four-year letter-winner (1990-94) as a defenseman at Western Michigan.

• **Successful Season** – Ferris State's 18 victories (18-15-5 overall) for the 2007-08 season not only exceeds its win total of the previous 2006-07 campaign (14-22-3 overall), but surpasses the 17 victo-

ries (17-15-8 overall) in the 2005-06 season which is the Bulldogs' most successful season since the historic 2002-03 season. Ferris State has won at least 10 games per campaign 30 straight times to date. The 1999-00 squad compiled a 21-16-2 overall mark.

• **Taking The Fifth** – Ferris State's fifth-place CCHA finish last season (12-12-4 CCHA - 28 points) represented the program's highest placing since the 2002-03 CCHA regular-season championship season in which the Bulldogs were 22-5-1 in the CCHA (45 points). Besides the 2002-03 campaign, the 1990-91 squad finished with a third-place 15-12-5 league mark (35 league points). The 2007-08 squad bettered the 2005-06 team's sixth-place tying 27 league points (10-11-7 CCHA).

• **Home Improvement** – Ewingleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glay-vin*) Ice Arena, presently in its 34th season of operation, underwent a 3.3 million dollar renovation project this past summer. Renovations included new rink slabs for both the main and half ice sheets along with new dasher boards and installation of tempered glass panels. Locker room renovations, new lighting along with new heating, ventilation, and air conditioning equipment were installed.

• **Versus Robert Morris** – This weekend's series marks the first-ever meetings between the two teams. Ferris State sports a 10-4-1 (.700) all-time against current College Hockey America competition, which includes a 5-1-0 road record.

• **Scouting Robert Morris** – The Colonials are led offensively by senior forward and 2008-09 All-CHA Preseason Team selection Chris Margott (18-26=44 in 2007-08), who finished third in league scoring last season and was a 2007-08 All-CHA Second-Team pick. He's the program's all-time leader in points (92), goals (43), and assists (49). Senior forward Jason Towsley (9-15=24), sophomore forward Nathan Longpre (7-17=24), and sophomore defenseman Denny Urban (6-15=21) are other top returning scorers. Sophomore Jim Patterson (0-2-0, 4.48 GAA, .850sv%) and junior Wes Russell (0-2-1, 5.18 GAA, .848sv%) are the returning goaltenders.

➤ **Returning Firepower** – Ferris State returns 14 of its top 15 points leaders from last season, including junior right wing **Cody Chupp (Big Rapids)**, who had a career-high and squad-best 30 points (11-19=30) in 39 games a season ago. Overall, the Bulldogs welcome back 88.9% (97-109) of their goal-scoring output and 80.6% (224-278) of their points production from last season.

➤ **Lighting The Lamp** – Senior right wing **Justin Lewandowski (Naperville, Ill.)** has posted at least a point in 10 of his last 15 games to date after tallying a lamplighter in the season opener against Canisius last Friday (10/10). Fifteen of Lewandowski's 26 career points in 78 outings have been on goals.

➤ **Seeing Red** – Sophomore defenseman **Zach Redmond (Traverse City)**, a 2007-08 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention Team pick and FSU's 2007-08 Rookie of the Year Award winner, led all Bulldog defensemen in scoring last season with 19 points (6-13=19) in 37 contests. He placed sixth in team scoring and produced the second-highest points total among Ferris' freshmen a season ago. Redmond, who was drafted in the seventh round of the 2008 NHL Entry Draft with the 184th overall pick by the Atlanta Thrashers, attained honorable mention honors on the 2008-09 CCHA Preseason All-Conference Team as selected by the league's 12 head coaches.

➤ **Impressive Frosh Class** – The Bulldogs' freshman class is ranked 15th in the nation by *Inside College Hockey.com (INCH)*. *INCH* compiled its 2008 recruiting rankings with extensive input from college and junior coaches along with professional scouts. Individually, goaltender **Taylor Nelson (Regina, Saskatchewan)** is rated the fourth-best incoming rookie netminder after sophomore **Pat Nagle (Bloomfield)** earned the same distinction a season ago.

➤ **Power-Play Production** – Ferris State's four power-play goals on nine chances against Canisius (10/11) represented the team's most since 1/16/06 when the Bulldogs converted four-of-eight extra-skater advantage opportunities in a 6-5 league triumph at Bowling Green State.

➤ **CCHA Honor Roll** – **Zach Redmond** along with center **Justin Menke (Shamrock, Saskatchewan)** and goaltender **Pat Nagle (Bloomfield)** were all named to the 2007-08 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention Team. Center **Aaron Lewicki (Livonia)** was FSU's CCHA Scholar-Athlete of the Year representative and **Bob Daniels** was among three finalists for the league's Coach of the Year Award.

➤ **Road Openers** – Ferris State is 8-18-3 overall (.328) in road-opening contests dating back to the 1979-80 campaign and is 3-4 in its last seven such encounters. FSU dropped a 2-0 decision at Union in its road opener last season (10/12). Ferris State's last road-opening win was in the 2006-07 season when the Bulldogs registered a 2-1 league victory at Western Michigan (10/20).

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 17th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2008-09 campaign, Daniels ranked tied for 14th among active NCAA Division I men's hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004 and recorded his 250th win this season (Feb. 8) after producing a 5-3 victory at Notre Dame.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
