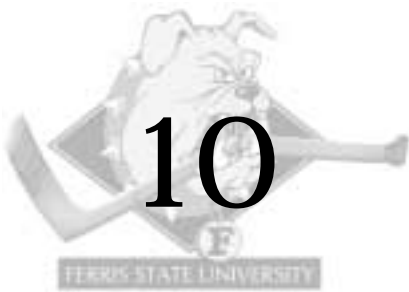


THE 2001-02 BULLDOGS

Defenseman

2001-02: A hard-nosed player who will be counted on for solid play . . . Capable of contributing offensively and is equipped with good offensive instincts . . . Excellent skater who can generate scoring opportunities . . . Handles the puck well . . . Has the ability to play at defense or forward, which allows for flexibility in the lineup . . . Plays the game with a passion . . . Should receive ice time both the power play and penalty kill units.

2000-01: Tallied six points with two goals and four assists in 38 contests . . . Recorded season-best two points (1-1-2) against Colgate, including notching the game-winning goal . . . Had the game-winning marker against Bowling Green State (2/17) . . . Picked up an assist at Nebraska-Omaha (10/27).

1999-00: Finished 10th in team scoring with season-best 18 points . . . Placed tied sixth on the squad with nine power play points (1-8-9) . . . 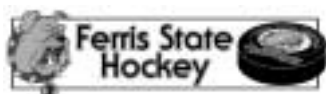

2001-02: An All-CCHA candidate . . . Highly-skilled competitor . . . Offensive catalyst of the team . . . Displays good hands and on-ice vision.

2000-01: Compiled a career-best 32 points to place second in team scoring . . . Ranked tied for 21st among the CCHA's overall scoring leaders . . . Placed tied for second on the squad with eight multi-point games, including three points (1-2-3) vs. Miami (Ohio) (1/12) . . . Scored two goals at St. Cloud State (10/14) . . . 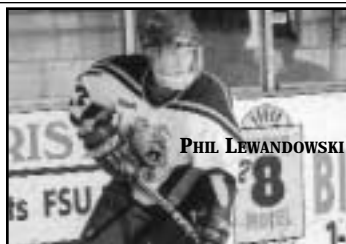
