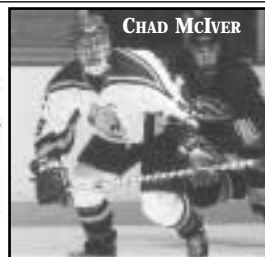

2001-02: Strong, physical defenseman . . . Team captain . . . Will provide leadership on the blueline . . . One of the best conditioned athletes in the CCHA . . . One of the CCHA's top "defensive" defenseman . . . Slated to play regular shift on the blueline and on the penalty kill unit . . . Mobile and exceptional skater for his size . . . Has impressive strength and agility.

2000-01: Posted a career-high tying six points (all assists) in 34 contests to place tied for 10th in team scoring . . .
