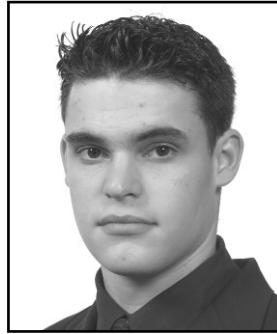


THE 2002-03 BULLDOGS

Defenseman

2002-03: Developing talent . . . A mobile "defensive" defenseman . . . Will supply depth on the blue line . . . Tall and rangy . . . Displays great poise with the puck and is an intelligent decision maker . . . Excellent passer . . . Good skater for his size . . . Should receive playing time in penalty-kill situations . . . Expected to add a physical presence to defensive unit upon gaining increased strength.

PRIOR TO FSU: A two-year (2000-02) member of the North American Hockey League's Capital Centre Pride in Lansing, Mich. . . . Coached by Jeff Blum . . . Posted 30 points (tied for eighth on team) with 10 goals and 20 assists in 45 games in 2001-02 . . . Registered five power-play lamp-lighters last season . . . Totaled nine goals (eight power-play markers) with 15 assists for 24 points in 27 outings with the Pride in the 2000-01 season . . . Produced 35 points on 10 goals and 25 assists with the Metro AA Jets in the 1999-00 as squad compiled a 38-5-2 overall record . . . Competed for Belle Tire Bantam A Team in 1998-99, scoring 11 goals with 20 assists for 31 points as team notched a 24-1-0 overall ledger.

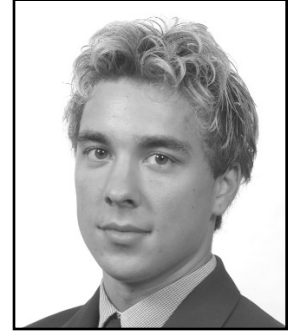

2002-03: Talented newcomer . . . Crafty centermen . . . Feisty, competitive individual who plays with a lot of heart . . . Excellent playmaker . . . Excels in pressure situations . . . Makes players around him better . . . Contending for playing time early in the season . . . Needs to continue increasing strength.

PRIOR TO FSU: Skated three seasons (1999-02) for the Cornwall (Ontario) Colts of the Central Junior A Hockey League . . . Coached by Al Wagar . . . A teammate of current FSU player Jeff Legue in the 2000-01 season . . . Played an integral part in helping the Colts record their second consecutive CJHL Championship title in 2000-01 and win the 2000 CJHL/Eastern Canadian Championship crown . . . Recipient of the Alf Taylor Trophy as the CJHL's top scorer with a 122-point total on league highs in goals (51) and assists (71) in 55 regular-season contests . . . A 2001-02 CJHL All-Star First-Team selection . . . Awarded the Jim Farelli Memorial Trophy as the CJHL's MVP last season and finished runner-up for the best junior player in Canada en route to leading Cornwall to a 46-7-2 overall mark as the Colts were the CJHL's highest-scoring team . . . Two-time (2000-02) CJHL points leader and top goal scorer . . . Attained rookie-of-the-year laurels with the Streetsville (Ontario) Derbys in 1998-99 and Cornwall in 1999-00 . . . Registered 75 points for the 2000-01 season with 37 points and 38 assists in 49 games and garnered 70 points on 34 goals with 36 assists in 53 outings during his first year (1999-00) with Cornwall . . . Notched 60 points (32-28-60) in 52 games for Streetsville in 1998-99.

PERSONAL: Born 6/29/81 in Montreal, Quebec . . . Son of Ron and Birute Vokey . . . Father works for the Canadian Pacific Railway . . . Has an older sister . . . A 1999 graduate of Iona Catholic Secondary School in Mississauga, Ont. . . . Enjoys roller blading . . . Shoots: left . . . Career exploration major.
