FERRIS STATE TAKES WINNING STREAK TO ALASKA FAIRBANKS THIS WEEKEND

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team hopes to continue on the winning path this weekend (Nov. 1-2) as the Bulldogs battle the University of Alaska Fairbanks Nanooks in Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) action at Fairbanks, Alaska.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State, which is ranked 13th in both the *U.S. College Hockey Online* and *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* polls this week and 12th in the *Inside College Hockey.com* poll, won its fifth straight contest to date in improving to 5-1-0 overall and 4-0-0 in the CCHA as a result of registering a CCHA league road series sweep of Notre Dame last weekend (Oct. 25-26) at ND's Joyce Athletic Center in Notre Dame, Ind. The Bulldogs skated to a 5-2 triumph in last Friday's opener and then notched a 4-1 decision in Saturday's rematch with the Fighting Irish. Ferris State is 2-0-0 on the road and 3-1-0 at home this year. Last season, Ferris State had a 15-20-1 overall record and placed ninth in the CCHA at 12-15-1. FSU was 10-6-0 at home, 5-13-1 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

Alaska Fairbanks is presently 1-4-1 overall and 0-3-1 in the CCHA following a pair of league losses to nationally-ranked Michigan last weekend (Oct. 25-26) at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. The Nanooks suffered a 5-2 setback to the Wolverines last Friday and then were dealt a 6-2 loss in Saturday's series finale. UAF, which is 0-3-1 in its last four appearances, is 1-0-1 at home and 1-3-0 on the road this campaign.

UAF posted a 22-12-3 overall mark last season, which included a fourth-place 15-10-3 CCHA record. The Nanooks hosted a CCHA Tournament First-Round series for the first time in the program's history and lost a 6-5 overtime decision to Ohio State at the CCHA Super Six quarterfinals.

BOB DANIELS: The sixth head coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's winningest coach following a 7-0 regular-season finale (3/4/00) win at Western Michigan to surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-7). Daniels ranks first among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 114-149-29 (.440) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State - Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 11th season, 154-198-32 (.442) - (16-11-1 vs. Alaska Fairbanks - Away 6-10-1, Home-10-1-0). **Alaska Fairbanks - Guy Gadowsky** (Colorado College, 1989), 4th season, 38-60-15 (.403) - (3-7-0 vs. Ferris State). Gadowsky was honored as the 2001-02 CCHA Coach of the Year.

ABOUT ALASKA FAIRBANKS: The Nanooks are paced in scoring by junior left wing Ryan Campbell (2-3-5). Freshman center Russell Spence (1-3-4) and sophomore right wing Aaron Voros (1-3-4) are other top UAF points leaders. The primary netminders for the Nanooks this season have been junior Preston McKay (1-3-0, 4.20 GAA, .870sv%) and senior Lance Mayes (0-1-1, 2.66 GAA, .929sv%).

BULLDOG BITES: Senior left wing **Chris Kunitz's** (Regina, Sask.) four-goal output at Notre Dame moved him into a tie with John DePourcq (1987-91) for eighth place among the school's all-time goal-scoring leaders. Kunitz has registered 73 goals in 116 games while DePourcq notched his career total in 145 contests. Kunitz is one goal shy of tying Peter Lowden (1983-87) for seventh place and three away from matching Paul Cook's (1979-83) sixth-place 76-career goal total. . . . FSU's top forward line of Kunitz (9-8-17), sophomore center **Jeff Legue** (7-4-11) and sophomore right wing **Derek Nesbitt** (2-7-9) have combined for 59.7% (37-62) of the team's current total points production. . . . The Bulldogs are averaging 6.0 goals per game (30 total) and 38.4 shots (192) on goal during their five-game win string. . . . **Kunitz** has tallied four consecutive two-goal game efforts to date this season while compiling 16 points (8-8-16) during that period. . . . Ferris' 5-1-0 start represents its best since 1983-84 when the Bulldogs won seven of their first eight. The '83-84 squad went on to finish 18-20-3 overall, which included a sixth-place tying 13-15-2 league mark. . . . **Jeff Legue** (Cornwall, Ont.) and **Derek Nesbitt** (Egmondville, Ont.) both have present season-opening six-game point streaks. Legue has 11 points (4-7-11) while Nesbitt has produced nine points (2-7-9). . . . Senior defenseman **Troy Milam** (Lake Orion) has six points (0-6-6) in his last three games, which includes a three-game point string and back-to-back multi-point games. He had a personal career-high three assists at Notre Dame (10/25).

ALL-AMERICA CANDIDATE: **Chris Kunitz**, who earned All-CCHA First-Team honors last season as a result of scoring a league-high 25 goals, is a 2002-03 All-America candidate. A season ago, he totaled a career-high 38 points on a career-best 28 goals and 10 assists in 35 games. A two-time CCHA Offensive Player-of-the-Week selection last winter, Kunitz ranked fourth nationally in goals (0.80 gpg) and tied for fourth in game-winning goals (six).

BROWN AND KUNITZ NAMED AGAIN: **Mike Brown** (Calgary, Alta.) and **Chris Kunitz** have been named the CCHA Defensive and Offensive Player of the Week, respectively, for the second straight week. Brown became just the second player in CCHA history to capture an award for three consecutive weeks, joining Nebraska-Omaha goaltender Dan Ellis, who was honored with three straight Defensive Player of the Week selections last season. In the Notre Dame series, Brown blocked 63-of-66 shots on net for a .955 save percentage while allowing just one even-strength goal. Kunitz scored two goals and assisted on two others each night in the two-game set. He scored the first two goals in last Friday's encounter and then accounted for the last two Bulldog markers, including a short-hander, in Saturday's affair.

The 2002-03 season marks the third year of the Perani Cup Three Stars, which is awarded following the conclusion of each CCHA regular-season game. Players from each school earn points throughout the season each time they are named a "star of the game" (5 points for 1st star, 3 points for 2nd star, and 1 point for 3rd star).
