FERRIS STATE MAINTAINS HOLD ON FIRST PLACE; HOSTS NORTHERN MICHIGAN

THIS WEEK: The nationally-ranked Ferris State University men's ice hockey team concludes its four-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) homestand this weekend (Jan. 17-18) as the Bulldogs host the Northern Michigan University Wildcats in a two-game set at Big Rapids, Mich. The series marks the first and only meetings between the two teams in the 2002-03 regular-season campaign.

FSU TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2002-03 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday - 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) - 12 to 5 p.m.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 16-5-1 overall and 11-2-1 in the CCHA as a result of posting a 1-0-1 league series mark against Notre Dame last weekend (Jan. 10-11) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs won 6-3 in the series' opener last Friday (Jan. 10) and then skated to a 4-4 overtime deadlock versus the Fighting Irish in Saturday's (Jan. 11) finale. Ferris is ranked 10th this week by both *U.S. College Hockey Online* and *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine*. The *Inside College Hockey.com* poll has the Bulldogs listed 11th. FSU is 8-3-1 at home, 8-1-0 on the road and 0-1-0 at neutral sites this season.

➤ A season ago, Ferris State was 15-20-1 overall with a ninth-place 12-15-1 CCHA record. FSU was 10-6-0 at home, 5-13-1 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

Northern Michigan is 10-9-1 overall and 8-6-0 in the CCHA following a pair of league losses to Bowling Green State last weekend (Jan. 10-11) at the BGSU Ice Arena in Bowling Green, Ohio. The Wildcats, who are midst a three-game losing skid, suffered a 3-2 setback to the Falcons in last Friday's (Jan. 10) contest and then was dealt a 5-3 loss in Saturday's (Jan. 11) rematch. NMU is 3-6-0 on the road, 6-2-0 at home and 1-1-1 at neutral sites this season.

➤ Northern Michigan compiled a 26-12-2 overall mark last season and placed third in

the CCHA with a 16-10-2 league mark.

BOB DANIELS: The sixth head coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's winningest coach following a 7-0 regular-season finale (3/4/00) win at Western Michigan to surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-7). Daniels ranks first among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 121-151-30 (.450) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State - Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 11th season, 165-202-33 (.454) - (9-10-1 vs. Northern Michigan - Home 2-5-1, Away 7-5-0). **Northern Michigan - Walt Kyle** (Northern Michigan, 1981), 1st season, 10-9-1 (.525) - (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT NORTHERN MICHIGAN: The Wildcats, who have seven players with double-digit point totals, are led by senior forwards Chris Gobert (7-19-26) and Mike Stutzel (14-8-22). Freshman forward Dirk Southern (4-13-17), along with senior forwards Terry Harrison (8-7-15) and Bryce Cockburn (6-8-14) are other top NMU point leaders. Junior Craig Kowalski (9-8-1, 2.58 GAA, .907sv%) is the Wildcats' top goaltender.

GAMES THIS WEEK

BULLDOG BITES: Ferris State's league-high 23 points is two shy of matching last season's ninth-place 25-point total. The Bulldogs are also one league win shy of equaling last season's 12 league victories . . . Junior center **Brett Smith (Guelph, Ont.)** has totaled a career-high 11 points (5-6-11) in 22 contests this season, which surpasses his previous high of six points in 37 outings during the 2000-01 campaign. Smith combined for 11 points (6-5-11) in 73 games during his first two seasons at FSU . . . Sophomore goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** ranks ninth among Ferris netminders in career victories with a 26-18-1 career mark in 47 appearances and is one shy of tying Jeff Blashill (1994-98) for eighth place. Brown's 16 wins this season represent the program's second highest single-season victory total and is one shy of the record set by Dave Swierpel in 1976-77 . . . Senior left wing **Chris Kunitz (Regina, Sask.)** has registered 18 points (6-12-18) during a personal season-high eight-game point streak . . . **Kunitz** has

80 goals in 132 career games and needs three more to surpass Jim Baker (1978-82) for fourth place on the school's all-time list. He also ranks 12th among the Bulldogs' career points leaders with 139 total (80-59-139) . . . Ferris' 4-4 result against Notre Dame Saturday was its first tie of this season and the Bulldogs' lone deadlock last campaign occurred against the Irish, 3-3, (11/10/01) . . . FSU has outscored the opposition 30-9 in its last five outings and is averaging 6.0 goals a game during that span . . . Ferris is 6-1-1 against its CCHA "cluster" opponents - Notre Dame, Western Michigan and Bowling Green State . . . The Bulldogs are 14-3-1 when **Chris Kunitz** gets a point and 10-0-0 when scoring a goal . . . In NCAA-I national team rankings through Jan. 12, FSU ranks second in scoring offense (4.68), third in scoring margin (2.41), seventh in scoring defense (2.27), tied for seventh in winning pct. (.750) and 10th in both penalty-killing pct. (.850) and power-play pct. (.243) . . . **Chris Kunitz** is tied for second among the NCAA-I leaders in points (1.95) and ranks third in assists (1.23). He's tied with sophomore center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ont.)** for 15th in goals (0.73). **Legue** has notched a point in 12 of his last 13 contests while garnering 19 points (9-10-19) in that period, which includes six multi-point game efforts . . . Senior defenseman **Troy Milam (Lake Orion)** is eight points (18-46-64) shy of tying Keith Sergott (1992-96; 72 career points) for 10th place among FSU's all-time leading scoring defensemen.

HOBEBY BAKER AWARD CANDIDATE: **Chris Kunitz**, a CCHA First-Teamer last season as a result of scoring a league-high 25 goals, is a 2002-03 Hobey Baker Memorial Award candidate. A season ago, he totaled 38 points on a career-best 28 goals and 10 assists in 35 games. He has a league-best 43 points with 16 goals and 27 assists in 22 contests this season.
