### FERRIS STATE REMAINS FIRST IN THE CCHA; WESTERN MICHIGAN UP NEXT

**THIS WEEK:** The nationally-ranked Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will seek to maintain its first-place standing in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) this weekend (Feb. 15-16) as the Bulldogs tangle with the Western Michigan University Broncos in a home-and-home series. Ferris hosts WMU this Saturday (Feb. 15) in Big Rapids, Mich., before traveling to Kalamazoo, Mich., Sunday (Feb. 16) in a matinee series finale.

**FSU TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for the remaining 2002-03 regular-season home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m.

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State improved to 21-8-1 overall and 16-5-1 in the CCHA following its two-game series sweep of Lake Superior State last weekend (Feb. 7-8) at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. The Bulldogs claimed a 7-1 triumph over the Lakers in last Friday's (Feb. 7) opener and then notched a 5-1 victory in Saturday's (Feb. 8) finale. This week, Ferris is ranked ninth in both the *Inside College Hockey.com* and *U.S. College Hockey Online* polls while moving up to 10th in the *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine* poll. Ferris, which is 9-3-1 in its last 13 outings, is 10-4-1 at home, 11-3-0 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites this season.

◆ A season ago, Ferris State was 15-20-1 overall with a ninth-place 12-15-1 CCHA record.

**Western Michigan** is 13-14-1 overall and 11-9-0 in CCHA play as a result of suffering a pair of one-goal league losses to 10th-ranked Ohio State last weekend (Feb. 7-8) at OSU's Value City Arena in Columbus, Ohio. The Broncos lost a 3-2 overtime decision last Friday (Feb. 7) and then were dealt a 3-2 setback by the Buckeyes in Saturday's (Feb. 8) rematch. WMU, which is 6-3-0 in its last nine appearances, sports a 3-10-1 mark in away contests and is 10-4-0 at home.

◆ Western Michigan finished 19-15-4 overall and 13-12-3 (sixth place) in the CCHA last season.

**BOB DANIELS:** The sixth head coach in the program's history, Daniels became FSU's winningest coach following a 7-0 regular-season finale (3/4/00) win at Western Michigan to surpass the program's inaugural coach Rick Duffett (1975-82; 119-83-7). Daniels is first among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 126-154-30 (.455) league mark.

**THE COACHES: Ferris State – Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 11th season, 170-205-33 (.457) – (11-18-2 vs. Western Michigan – Home 6-7-1, Away 4-10-1, Neutral 1-1-0).

**Western Michigan – Jim Culhane** (Western Michigan, 1987), 4th season, 67-67-16 (.500) – (8-4-0 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN:** Freshman center Vince Bellissimo (15-10-25) and junior right wing Dana Lattery (16-8-24), who ranks 10th nationally in goals per game this week, are the Broncos' leading point getters. WMU features the nation's 20th-best scoring offense (3.42 gpg.). In goal for Western is junior Mike Mantua (8-9-0, 3.61 GAA, .880sv%) and frosh Scott Foster (5-5-1, 3.61 GAA, .872sv%).

**BULLDOG BITES:** FSU's 21 victories (21-8-1) equals the most wins since 1999-00 when the Bulldogs posted a 21-16-2 mark. Ferris also compiled a 21-16-4 record in 1992-93. The Bulldogs are now within two victories of matching their second-best season in the program's history – 23-14-5 in '90-91 . . . Seven of freshman center **Greg Rallo's** (Gurnee, Ill.) 10 goals this season have occurred on the power play . . . Senior left wing **Chris Kunitz** (Regina, Sask.), who has 90 goals in 140 career games, is three shy of tying Rod Schluter (1984-89) for second place on FSU's all-time goal-scoring list. Kunitz will also be featured on the front cover of an upcoming *USA College Hockey Magazine* issue . . . Junior defenseman **Simon Mangos** (Caledon, Ont.) has 11 points (6-5-11) in his last 14 outings, including five (2-3-5) in his past four games. In his initial 16 contests this season, Mangos totaled three points (1-2-3) . . . **Kunitz's** 57 points (26-31-57) this campaign represents the ninth best single-season scoring output in the program's history. He's two points shy of tying Murray Winnicki (1985-86) and John DePourcq (1989-90) for seventh place . . . Sophomore goaltender **Mike Brown** (Calgary, Alta.) is one victory away from tying Dave Swierpel (1975-77; 32-10-1) for third place on FSU's all-time wins list. Brown owns a 31-21-1 career mark to go along with a 2.53 goals against average and a .915 save percentage in 55 outings . . . Sophomore left wing **Carter Thomson's** (Milden, Sask.) third-period goal at Lake Superior State Saturday snapped a personal 19-game non-goal scoring streak. His last marker this season was against Bowling Green State (10/18) . . . Senior defenseman **Troy Milam** (Lake Orion) is a point away of tying Keith Sergott (1992-96) for 10th place on Ferris' all-time leading point leaders list among defensemen. Milam, who has a career-best 24 points (5-19-24) in 30 games this season, has amassed 71 career points (19-52-71) in 143 outings . . . FSU's win at LSSU on Saturday was its 16th in conference play this season, which surpassed the previous high of 15 wins (15-12-5 - 3rd place CCHA) set in 1990-91 . . . The Bulldogs are operating at 83.8% (31-37) on the penalty kill over their last six encounters. Conversely, Ferris has converted 13.5% (5-37) of its power-play opportunities . . . Sophomore center **Jeff Legue** (Cornwall, Ont.) has 17 more points (20-22-42) this campaign than in his previous season (6-19-25).

**HOBEBY BAKER AWARD CANDIDATE:** Chris Kunitz, a CCHA First-Teamer last season as a result of scoring a league-high 25 goals, is a 2002-03 Hobey Baker Memorial Award candidate. A season ago, he totaled 38 points on a career-best 28 goals and 10 assists in 35 games. He has a league-best 57 points with 26 goals and 31 assists in 30 contests this season. Kunitz currently ranks first with 27,500 points in phase two of the voting for the Hobey Baker Award. Once the nominating phase is completed, fans will be casting ballots along with the 60 NCAA Division I college hockey head coaches to determine the Top 10 Finalists, which will be announced in March.
