FERRIS SKATES AGAINST MICHIGAN IN HOME-AND-HOME SERIES THIS WEEKEND

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will go up against the nationally-ranked University of Michigan Wolverines this weekend (Nov. 7-8) in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home-and-home series. This Friday's (Nov. 7) contest will take place at Big Rapids, Mich., with Saturday's (Nov. 8) series finale to be held in Ann Arbor, Mich. The series represents the only regular-season meeting between the teams in the 2003-04 campaign.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewingleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493); Saturday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Yost Ice Arena (6,637).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 2-6-0 overall with a 1-5-0 CCHA mark to date after suffering a pair of league losses to Michigan State last weekend (Oct. 31-Nov. 1) in a home-and-home series. The Bulldogs were dealt an 8-0 setback by the Spartans in last Friday's (Oct. 31) series opener at MSU's Munn Ice Arena in East Lansing, Mich. Ferris then came out on the short end of a 4-2 decision in Saturday's (Nov. 1) encounter at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich.

◆ A season ago, Ferris State registered its most successful season in the program's 25-year NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

Michigan, which has a current six-game winning streak, improved to 7-1-0 overall and is 3-1-0 in the CCHA after recording a 6-2 non-league victory over Niagara last Saturday (Nov. 1) at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. The Wolverines, who are 6-0-0 at home this season, are ranked fourth this week in the *U.S. College Hockey Online, USA Today/American Hockey Coaches Association* and *Inside College Hockey.com (INCH)* polls.

◆ Michigan concluded the 2002-03 campaign at 30-10-3 overall and placed second in the CCHA with an 18-7-3 league mark. The Wolverines were the Mason Cup CCHA Tournament Champions last season as UM won its sixth league tourney title. Michigan made a NCAA Division I record 13th consecutive appearance in the NCAA Tournament and

participated in the NCAA Frozen Four for the third straight season in the 2002-03 campaign.

BOB DANIELS: The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 133-159-30 (.459) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 182-213-33 (.464) – (7-24-1 vs. Michigan – Home 4-9-0, Away 3-13-0, Neutral 0-2-1). **Michigan – Gordon "Red" Berenson** (Michigan, 1962), 20th season, 513-242-53 (.668) – (46-18-1 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT MICHIGAN: Sophomore forwards Jeff Tambellini (6-3-9), a second-team All-CCHA pick last season, and Andrew Ebbett (4-5-9) along with freshman forward T.J. Hensick (2-6-8) are the Wolverines' leading scorers. Sophomore goaltender Al Montoya (7-1-0, 2.62 GAA, .900sv%), who received CCHA All-Rookie Team laurels in 2002-03, is the regular in net.

BULLDOG BITES: Sophomore left wing-center **Nick Scheible (Big Rapids)** scored his second goal of this season against Michigan State last Saturday to exceed his one goal output in 16 outings a season ago. Both of his lamplighters this campaign have occurred at home - vs. Western Michigan (10/11). Scheible's first collegiate marker came at MSU last season (12/7) in a 5-3 victory . . . The Bulldogs started out the month of November with a 4-2 home loss to Michigan State Saturday. Last season, Ferris compiled a 6-2-0 (.750) November record which included a 4-1-0 home mark . . . Junior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** notched his 50th career point with a

power-play tally in last Saturday's contest. York presently has compiled 11-39-50 in 78 career games. With his current 227 career penalty minutes total on 88 penalties, York is tied with Rod Taylor (1987-91) for 15th place on the all-time school's penalty leaders list and is three shy from tying Colin Dodunski (1991-95) for 14th place. York is ninth among FSU's career penalty minutes leaders for defensemen . . . Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)** is one victory shy of becoming the all-time winningest netminder in FSU history. Brown is 42-29-1 in 74 career appearances to date and is tied with Rob Hughston (1981-85; 42-53-7) for top honors . . . Juniors forwards **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** and **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ontario)** combined for 22 points (10-12-22) in Ferris' first eight contests last season. Legue (7-4-11) and Nesbitt (3-8-11) each recorded the team's second-highest point total in that period a season ago. This campaign, the pair have combined for eight points (2-6-8) in the team's initial eight outings . . . The last time FSU started out a season winning two games or fewer was in 1993-94 when the Bulldogs were 1-7-0 in their first eight contests. Ferris went on to a 14-23-1 overall record, which included a seventh-place 12-17-1 league ledger. FSU's five losses in CCHA play this campaign already equals its entire league total (22-5-1) a season ago . . . The Bulldogs' 35 shots on goal versus Michigan State Saturday was its second highest total this season, trailing its 36-shot output in the season home opener against Western Michigan (10/11). The Bulldogs are averaging 25.5 shots on goal (102 total) in their last four games compared to 27.0 (108 total) in the initial four outings this season . . . Ferris' 8-0 setback at Michigan State was their first shutout loss since 3/2/02, when the Spartans blanked them 2-0 at Munn Ice Arena. The last team, other than MSU, to blank FSU was Miami (Ohio), 1-0, on 11/11/01.
