### FERRIS OFF TO MICHIGAN STATE FOR CCHA TOURNEY'S FIRST ROUND

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team begins Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Tournament First-Round action this weekend (March 12-14) versus the Michigan State University Spartans in a best-of-three series at East Lansing, Mich. The Bulldogs are the 10th seed while the Spartans are seeded third in the 12-team field.

**CCHA FIRST-ROUND TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for this weekend's CCHA Tourney series at Michigan State are presently on sale and can be purchased by contacting the MSU Athletics Ticket Office at 1-800-GO-STATE.

**TELEVISION COVERAGE:** This Saturday's contest at Michigan State represents this weekend's televised CCHA Game of the Week and can be viewed live on FOX Sports Net Detroit.

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State concluded its 2003-04 regular season at 15-18-3 overall and 10-17-1 in the CCHA after suffering a pair of league losses against the Northern Michigan Wildcats last weekend (March 5-6) at NMU's Berry Events Center in Marquette, Mich. The Bulldogs, who are 1-6-0 in their past seven outings, are 4-12-1 on the road this season. A season ago, Ferris State turned in its most successful season in the program's NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

**Michigan State** is 21-15-2 overall and 17-9-2 in the CCHA to date after picking up three league points versus archrival Michigan last weekend (March 5-6). The Spartans skated to a 4-4 overtime tie last Friday at MSU's Munn Ice Arena and then claimed a 1-0 decision in Saturday's rematch with the Wolverines at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich.

MSU was 23-14-2 overall and 17-10-1 (fourth place) in the CCHA a season ago.

**BOB DANIELS:** The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey

Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 142-171-31 (.458) league mark.

**ABOUT MICHIGAN STATE:** The Spartans are led by junior forward and 2002-03 CCHA First-Teamer Jim Slater (17-28-45). Junior forward Mike Lalonde (21-15-36) along with freshman forward Tommy Goebel (14-15-29) and freshman defenseman A.J. Thelen (2-5-7) are other leading MSU scorers. Freshman Dominic Vicari (13-11-1, 2.10 GAA, .925sv%) and junior Matt Magliaccio (8-4-1, 2.74 GAA, .915sv%) are the Spartans' goaltenders.

**BULLDOG BITES:** Freshman left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alta.)** snapped a 14-game non-goal scoring streak last Friday at Northern Michigan . . . Junior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ont.)** registered his 100th career points with an assist in last Friday's contest and has 100 career points (40-60-100) in 114 outings to date . . . Senior right wing **Derrick McIver (Thunder Bay, Ont.)** is three points shy of matching his career-high 23 points (10-13-23) set in the 2001-02 season. The FSU team captain has totaled 20 points (10-10-20) in 36 appearances this campaign . . . Fifteen (6-9-15) of sophomore right wing **Greg Rallo's (Gurnee, Ill.)** 16 points

(6-10-16) this season have occurred in CCHA play. Rallo, who has 45 career points (21-24-45) in 77 games, is five away from notching his 50th career point . . . Senior center **Brett Smith (3-9-12)** and **Derek Nesbitt (4-7-11)** are the Bulldogs' leading point producers in 17 road affairs this campaign. Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** is 4-12-1 with a 3.40 goals against average (54 goals allowed) and a .881 save percentage (401 saves) in away games this season . . . **Jeff Legue** has compiled a team-best 11 points (2-9-11) in six CCHA Tournament outings while **Derek Nesbitt** ranks second on the squad with eight points (3-5-8) in six games . . . Junior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** has four points (1-3-4) in his last four contests after being sidelined the previous 10 due to an injury . . . Ferris' top three point leaders to date - **Brett Smith (13-19-32)**, **Jeff Legue (11-15-26)** and **Derek Nesbitt (11-15-26)** have combined for 32.4% (84-259) of the team's points output and 34.7% (35-101) of its goal production.

**IN THE CCHA TOURNAMENT:** Ferris State is 13-39-3 (.264) all-time in CCHA Tournament play, which includes an 11-33-3 record (.266) in first-round competition. Ferris is 5-35-0 on the road, 6-0-0 at home and 2-4-0 at neutral sites. A season ago, FSU posted a 3-1 league tourney mark as the Bulldogs swept Lake Superior State in a two-game opening-round home series (3/14-15) by 6-1 scores. Ferris then advanced to the championship game of the CCHA Super 6 Championship Tourney for the first time in 23 seasons as a result of skating to a 4-2 semifinal victory over Northern Michigan (3/21) at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich. The Bulldogs dropped a 5-3 decision to Michigan in the championship contest (3/22).

Ferris State is presently 3-9-0 all-time versus Michigan State in the CCHA Tourney. The Bulldogs were swept by the Spartans (3-1 and 2-1) in the last postseason meetings (3/13-14/98) between the teams at East Lansing. FSU's first-round series against MSU marks the sixth time the two schools will meet with the Spartans having swept the initial five series.
