FSU'S UNBEATEN STREAK ENDS; AT NEBRASKA-OMAHA THIS WEEK

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will take to the road this week, Jan. 7-8, as the Bulldogs go up against the University of Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) two-game series at Omaha, Neb.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday – 8:05 p.m. (EST) /Qwest Center Omaha (14,700).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 9-9-2 overall and 5-8-1 in the CCHA following a league home series split with Alaska Fairbanks last weekend (Jan. 2-3) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs registered a 7-5 win over the Nanooks in last Friday's (Jan. 2) series opener before being dealt a 4-0 loss in Saturday's (Jan. 3) rematch which snapped their eight-game (6-0-2) unbeaten streak. Ferris is 3-6-1 in road encounters this campaign to date.

◆ A season ago, Ferris State enjoyed its most successful season in the program's NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

Nebraska-Omaha, which was idle last week, is presently 5-12-3 overall with a 3-9-2 CCHA mark. The Mavericks went 1-1-0 in their most recent action (Dec. 27-28) at the Denver Cup in Denver, Colo. UNO claimed a 5-2 victory over Yale in the tourney's semifinal round contest before falling 6-3 to nationally-ranked Denver in the championship game. The Mavericks are 1-4-2 in their last seven appearances to date. UNO has produced a 3-5-2 home record this season.

◆ Nebraska-Omaha compiled a 13-22-5 overall record with a 10th-place 9-17-2 CCHA mark a season ago.

BOB DANIELS: The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among

active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 137-162-31 (.462) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 189-216-35 (.469) – (4-7-1 vs. Nebraska-Omaha – Away 1-3-0, Home 3-4-1). **Nebraska-Omaha – Mike Kemp** (Gustavus Adolphus, 1975), 7th season, 102-126-25 (.453) – (7-4-1 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT NEBRASKA OMAHA: The Mavericks feature six current skaters with double-figure point totals led by freshman forward Scott Parse (10-10-20) and senior defenseman Mike Gabinet (3-11-14). Senior forward Andrew Wong (5-8-13) along with junior forward Dan Hacker (7-5-12) and frosh forward Kaleb Betts (4-8-12) are other leading UNO point getters. A trio of goaltenders – freshman Chris Holt (3-7-1, 3.12 GAA, .904sv%), senior Brian Haaland (1-3-1, 3.07 GAA, .899sv%) and frosh Kris Tebbs (1-2-1, 2.64 GAA, .904sv%) have all received action.

BULLDOG BITES: Senior center **Brett Smith (Guelph, Ont.)** has a team-high seven points (3-4-7) in 10 road encounters this season . . . Sophomore right wing **Nick Scheible's (Big Rapids)** six points (4-2-6) in 15 contests this campaign exceeds his season total of four points (1-3-4) in 16 outings a season ago . . . In its last nine games, Ferris has outscored its opponents 36-23 which includes 16-6 in the third period. During that span, **Brett Smith (6-8-14)** and senior defenseman **Simon Mangos (2-8-10)** are the top points leaders while junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** is 6-1-2 with a 2.51 goals against average and a 920 save percentage . . . Brown, the school's all-time

winningest netminder with a 49-32-3 career to date, notched his second career point with an assist in Friday's contest versus Alaska Fairbanks. He posted an assist in a 3-2 home triumph over Michigan State (3/1/02) . . . Ferris is 48-53-10 (.477) in January contests dating back to 1990 and has compiled a 21-31-4 (.411) road ledger during that span . . . The Bulldogs' fourth forward line of freshman left wing **Eric Vesely (1-2-3)**, sophomore center **Matt Rutkowski (0-3-3)** and **Nick Scheible (2-1-3)** combined for nine points (3-6-9) in Friday's outing after entering the contest with a combined eight points (2-6-8) this campaign . . . The Bulldogs are averaging 37.4 shots per game (262 total) in their last seven contests . . . Ferris had its season-high eight-game (6-0-2) unbeaten streak snapped with Saturday's loss to the Nanooks. Both FSU and North Dakota boasted the nation's second-highest undefeated streak going into Saturday's contest. The Bulldogs put together a 12-game winning streak last season (2/1-3/21) . . . Frosh left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alta.)** has seven points (5-2-7) in his last seven games after garnering five points (2-3-5) in his previous 13 contests . . . Eight (3-5-8) of sophomore right wing **Greg Rallo's** nine points (3-6-9) this season have occurred in league contests

VESELY PICKS UP CCHA HONOR: **Eric Vesely** has been selected this week's CCHA Rookie of the Week following his three-point (1-2-3) performance in the Bulldogs' victory over Alaska Fairbanks last Friday. Vesely, who didn't register a point in Saturday's affair, notched a plus two efficiency rating in the series opener.
