### FERRIS STATE CONCLUDES HOMESTAND AGAINST NIAGARA THIS WEEKEND

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will conclude its four-game homestand this weekend (Nov. 28-29) as the Bulldogs host the Niagara University Purple Eagles in a non-league series at Big Rapids, Mich.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday - 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday - 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (pronounced A-VAH-glave-in) (2,493).

**THE RECORDS: Ferris State** stands at 4-8-0 overall and 3-7-0 in the CCHA to date after recording a league home series split against Nebraska-Omaha last weekend (Nov. 21-22) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs dropped a 4-1 decision to the Mavericks in last Friday's opener before notching a 4-0 triumph in Saturday's finale.

◆ A season ago, Ferris State registered its most successful season in the program's 25-year NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

**Niagara** improved to 6-5-0 overall and 4-0-0 in College Hockey America (CHA) as a result of sweeping a league series against Air Force last weekend (Nov. 21-22) at AFA's Cadet Ice Arena in Air Force Academy, Colo. The Purple Eagles claimed a 3-2 overtime victory in last Friday's contest and then garnered a 5-2 triumph over the Falcons in Saturday's finale. NU, which is 4-2-0 on the road this season, has won four of its last five contests to date.

◆ The Purple Eagles were 15-17-5 overall and 11-4-5 (second place) in the CHA last season.

**BOB DANIELS:** The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also

honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 135-161-30 (.460) league mark.

**THE COACHES: Ferris State - Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 184-215-33 (.464) - (2-0-0 vs. Niagara - Home 0-0-0, Away 2-0-0). **Niagara - Dave Burkholder** (Rochester Institute, 1984), 3rd season, 40-37-6 (.518) - (0-2-0 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT NIAGARA:** The Purple Eagles have three individuals with double-digit point totals this season - junior forward Barret Ehgoetz (9-9-18), who ranks fifth nationally in points (1.64 avg.) along with freshman forward Jeremy Hall (8-6-14) and senior forward Chris Welch (4-8-12). Senior forward Joe Tallari (1-5-6) was selected the 2002-03 CHA Player of the Year as a result of his conference record 54 points (26-28-54). NU has played three goaltenders this campaign - sophomore Jeff VanNynatten (4-2-0, 3.00 GAA, .902sv%), senior Rob Konk (1-2-0, 2.63, .899sv%) and freshman Allen Barton (1-1-0, 4.00 GAA, .869sv%).

### GAMES THIS WEEK

**BULLDOG BITES:** Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** set a school record for most career shutouts with his seventh one in Saturday's 4-0 triumph over Nebraska-Omaha. Brown, the all-time winningest netminder in Ferris State history with a current 44-31-1 career mark in 78 contests, had shared the mark of six with Vince Owen (1997-01) and Phil Osaer (1998-01). He tied the Bulldog single-season mark with four shutouts in 41 appearances a season ago . . . Ferris' 48 shots on goal in Friday's outing was a team season high and represented the most since last season when the Bulldogs recorded 61 at Connecticut (12/30/02) in the UConn Classic. In its last five contests, FSU is averaging 36.8 shots on net (184 total) per game . . . Senior center **Brett Smith (Guelph, Ont.)** has compiled a team-best seven points (3-4-7) in five home encounters this campaign. He needs seven more points (5-5-10) to match his career-high 17 points (8-9-17) set in 42 games last season . . . Senior right wing **Derrick McIver's (Thunder Bay, Ont.)** short-handed tally versus Nebraska-Omaha was a career first. The Bulldogs' two shorties in 12 games this season matches their total in the same period a season ago . . . Senior defenseman **Simon Mangos (Caledon, Ont.)** snapped an 11-game point drought with a goal and an assist in Saturday's victory. As a freshman in 2000-01, Mangos went 12 contests (12/29-2/10) without a point. The assistant captain is one goal away from tying George Harrison (1977-81) and Paul Pickard (1979-81) for ninth place in career goals scored among FSU's all-time defensemen leaders . . . Sophomore defenseman **Andrew Winnik (Mississauga, Ont.)**, who returned to the ice after missing the last five games due to injury, responded with his second point (assist) of this season in Saturday's encounter. His season point total this campaign is one shy of matching his total of three points (1-2-3) in 24 outings a season ago . . . **Mike Brown's** shutout of Nebraska-Omaha last Saturday was the third of his career against the Mavericks. He posted back-to-back shutouts (5-0 and 4-0) in last season's home series (2/28-3/1) sweep of UNO . . . Junior left wing **Carter Thomson (Milden, Sask.)** tallied his third goal of the season in Saturday's encounter which equals his career season high set a season ago in 35 games. All of his three season points have occurred on goals scored . . . Ferris is 16-7-0 all-time against College Hockey America (CHA) competition which included a 3-2-0 mark last season. The Bulldogs have played all six CHA members – Air Force, Alabama-Huntsville, Bemidji State, Findlay, Niagara and Wayne State . . . Junior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ont.)** is eight points shy of reaching
