FERRIS AT NOTRE DAME THIS WEEK; SATURDAY'S GAME TO BE TELEVISIED

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will travel to Notre Dame, Ind., this weekend (Feb. 13-14) for a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series versus the University of Notre Dame Fighting Irish.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday - 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Joyce Athletic Center (2,713).

TELEVISION COVERAGE: This Saturday's contest at Notre Dame is the last of two televised CCHA Games of the Week this weekend and can be viewed live on FOX Sports Net - Detroit.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 14-13-3 overall and 9-12-1 in the CCHA following a league home series split against nationally-ranked Ohio State last weekend (Feb. 6-7) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs are 10-5-2 in their last 17 games, which includes a 3-2-1 road mark. Ferris sports a 4-8-1 record in away contests this campaign.

◆ A season ago, Ferris State turned in its most successful season in the program's NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

Notre Dame is 13-11-4 overall and 9-10-3 in the CCHA after suffering a pair of league setbacks to nationally-ranked Miami (Ohio) last weekend (Feb. 6-7) at MU's Goggin Ice Arena in Oxford, Ohio. The Fighting Irish dropped a 5-2 decision to the RedHawks in last Friday's (Feb. 6) series' opener and then fell 2-0 to Miami in Saturday's (Feb. 7) finale. ND, which is 1-4-1 in its last six outings, is 8-1-2 at home this campaign. Notre Dame was among those teams receiving votes in this week's *U.S. College Hockey Online.com* poll.

◆ Last season, Notre Dame compiled a 17-17-6 overall record with a fifth-place tying 13-12-3 CCHA mark. The Irish were 7-7-3 at home, 10-9-2 on the road and 0-1-1 at neutral sites.

BOB DANIELS: The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey

Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 141-166-31 (.463) league mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State - Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 12th season, 194-220-36 (.471) - (20-10-4 vs. Notre Dame - Home 6-4-1, Away 12-6-3, Neutral 2-0-0). **Notre Dame - Dave Poulin** (Notre Dame, 1982), 9th season, 127-166-44 (.442) - (6-15-4 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT NOTRE DAME: The Irish, who have eight individuals with double-digit points, are paced offensively by senior right wing Rob Globke (16-13-29). Senior center Aaron Gill (11-16-27) along with sophomore left wing Mike Walsh (10-8-18) and junior right wing Cory McLean (7-11-18) are other top ND points leaders. Freshman David Brown (9-5-3, 2.15 GAA, .928sv%) is the primary goaltender and is backed up by junior Morgan Cey (3-5-1, 2.39 GAA, .926sv%).

GAMES THIS WEEK

BULLDOG BITES: Junior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ont.)** registered his first career hat trick in last Friday's contest versus Ohio State and is the second Bulldog skater to accomplish the feat this season. Junior center **Mike Kinnie (Shelby Township)** had three goals in a non-league win over Niagara (11/29) . . . The Bulldogs are averaging 3.18 goals per game (35 total) in 12 games (6-5-1) in the new year. FSU has allowed 3.25 goals (39 total) in that span. Ferris is operating at 12.7% (9-71) efficiency on the power play and is 75.7% (53-70) in penalty-kill situations during the 12-game stretch. Senior center **Brett Smith (4-6-10)** and **Jeff Legue (5-5-10)** are the team's leading scorers in that period . . . Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)** is 76 saves away from

tying Mike Williams (1986-90) for second place among the school's all-time saves leaders. Brown has totaled 2,580 career saves in 96 outings while Williams recorded 2,656 saves in 103 career appearances . . . Ferris' top three point getters this season, **Brett Smith (13-17-30)**, **Jeff Legue (10-12-22)** and junior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (9-13-22)** have combined for 32.3% (74-229) of the squad's total points production . . . The Bulldogs are averaging 3.44 goals (55 total) in 16 home contests this campaign compared to 2.23 (29 total) in 13 road affairs for a 1.21 differential . . . Ferris' 6-0 loss to Ohio State Saturday represents the fourth time this season in which the Bulldogs have been shutout. The last time FSU was blanked four times was 2000-01 (13-20-5 overall record) . . . Ferris notched its seventh short-handed marker of the season on **Jeff Legue's** shortie in last Friday's encounter. The Bulldogs' seven short-handers equals last season's output in 42 games. Senior right wing **Derrick McIver (three)** and **Legue (two)** have combined for five of the squad's seven lamplighters . . . **Brett Smith (Guelph, Ont.)** has compiled a team-high 10 points (3-7-10) in 13 road outings this campaign and has six points (0-6-6) in his last five away contests after garnering four (3-1-4) in his previous eight games . . . **Derek Nesbitt**, who has 96 career points (38-58-96) in 108 contests, is four points shy of attaining his 100th career point. The 2002-03 CCHA Honorable Mention pick has 22 points (9-13-22) in 30 outings this season, which surpasses his 21-point total (9-12-21) set in his freshman year (2001-02). He produced a career-best 53 points (20-33-53) in 42 games a season ago which ranks tied for 15th among FSU's single-season points leaders . . . In their last six contests, the Bulldogs are averaging 5.7 penalties (34 total for 68 minutes) per outing in comparison to 11.2 penalties (67 total for 158 minutes) in their previous six appearances.
