### FERRIS STATE RETURNS TO CCHA PLAY AGAINST WESTERN MICHIGAN

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team is back in Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) action this weekend (Jan. 30-31) as the Bulldogs go up against the Western Michigan University Broncos in a home-and-home series. Ferris State hosts WMU this Friday in Big Rapids, Mich. before traveling Saturday to Kalamazoo, Mich.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday - 7:35 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493); Saturday - 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Harry W. Lawson Ice Arena (3,667).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is 12-11-3 overall with a 7-10-1 CCHA mark following a win and a tie in a non-league series against Findlay last weekend (Jan. 23-24) in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs are 8-3-2 in their last 13 contests, which includes a 4-2-1 home ledger. Ferris is presently 7-4-2 at home and 4-7-1 on the road this campaign.

☛ A season ago, Ferris State enjoyed its most successful season in the program's NCAA-I history with a school-record 31-10-1 overall mark. The Bulldogs claimed their first-ever CCHA Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league record. FSU also made its initial NCAA-I Championship Tournament appearance and earned the distinction of being the nation's first team to attain 30 wins in a season.

**Western Michigan** is 13-11-3 overall and 9-8-2 in the CCHA following a pair of losses to nationally-ranked Michigan last weekend (Jan. 23-24) in a home-and-home league series. Western suffered a 4-1 home setback to the Wolverines in last Friday's (Jan. 23) opener at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich. The Broncos then dropped a 7-0 decision to the Wolverines in Saturday's (Jan. 24) matchup at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. WMU, which is 4-3-1 this month, is 4-7-2 on the road and 9-4-1 at home this season. ☛ Western Michigan compiled a 15-21-2 overall mark and finished with an eighth-place tying 13-14-1 CCHA record a season ago.

**BOB DANIELS:** The 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* last

season. Daniels, who ranked 23rd among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering this campaign, is the all-time winningest coach in FSU history. Daniels is tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA wins with a 139-164-31 (.463) league mark.

**Western Michigan - Jim Culhane** (Western Michigan, 1987), 5th season, 82-85-20 (.492) - (9-7-0 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN:** The Broncos, who feature the nation's 16th-ranked scoring offense (3.26 gpg.), are led by senior left wing Dana Lattery (12-17-29). Sophomore forwards Vince Bellissimo (9-18-27) and Brent Walton (10-14-24) are also among nine Broncos with double digits in points. Lattery ranks 20th nationally (1.21 ppg.) and is fourth among the CCHA's overall points leaders. Sophomore goaltender Scott Foster (10-8-3, 3.33 GAA, .877sv%) is the regular with senior Mike Mantua (2-2-0, 3.42, .894sv%) serving as the understudy this season.

**BULLDOG BITES:** Junior left wing **Carter Thomson (Milden, Sask.)** tallied his career-high fifth goal on the season against Findlay last Friday. Five of his seven points have occurred on goals this campaign . . . Ferris is 9-3-3 in its last 15 outings and has outscored its opponents 53-41. Senior right wing **Derrick McIver (Thunder Bay, Ont.)** has totaled 13 (8-5-13) of his season's 16 points (9-7-16) this season during that 15-game period . . . Junior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ont.)** needs seven more points to reach the century mark. He presently has 36-57-93 in 104 career contests . . . Junior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alta.)**, who turned aside a season-high tying 39 shots on goal in Saturday's game, is averaging 27.0 saves (189 total saves) in his last seven appearances. The 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) All-America

First-Team selection picked up his school-record leading eighth career shutout as a result of Saturday's outcome . . . Senior defenseman **Simon Mangos (Caledon, Ont.)** recorded his 50th career point (23-27-50) with a pair of power-play goals in Friday's contest against Findlay. The FSU assistant captain currently is sixth in career goal scoring by Ferris defensemen and needs three goals to tie Ron Andrzejewski (1976-80) for fifth place . . . Ferris State played its second scoreless overtime contest in its program's history at home versus Findlay Saturday. The Bulldogs were involved in a scoreless home draw against Michigan State (12/8/00) as both FSU's Phil Osaer and MSU's Ryan Miller were perfect in goal . . . Ferris competed in its fourth overtime contest this season against Findlay Saturday and are 1-3-0 in such outings. In the last three campaigns (2001-04), FSU is 2-4-2 (.375) in its last eight overtime appearances (2-0-3 at home) . . . Senior center **Brett Smith (Guelph, Ont.)** has registered at least a point in every series this season with the exception of Michigan State (10/31-11/1). Smith has notched a season-high combined four points in two series this campaign - (2-2-4) vs. Niagara (11/28-29) and (1-3-4) at Bowling Green State (12/5-6) . . . Ten (2-8-10) of junior center **Jeff Legue's (Cornwall, Ont.)** 18 points (6-12-18) this year have occurred on the power play . . . Mike Brown, who had a school single-season high 1,154 saves last season in 41 contests, is 118 saves shy of moving into a tie with Rob Hughston (1984-85; 797 in 31 games) for seventh place on the season best charts . . . **Simon Mangos** has garnered multiple points in five of this season's six games in which he's tallied a point. The last time Mangos netted a pair of lampighters in a contest was last season (1/10) against Notre Dame . . . **Jeff Legue** has accumulated a team-high 21 points (6-15-21) in 22 career January contests while **Derrick McIver** has 18 (10-8-18) in 28 outings. Legue notched 12 points (5-7-12) in nine games last January which ranked second to Chris Kunitz's 18 points (9-9-18). Legue has six points (1-5-6) in eight games to date this month.
