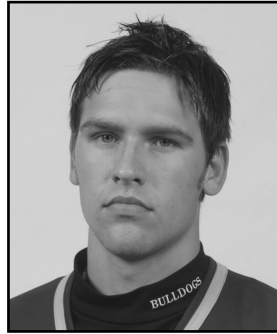


THE 2004-05 BULLDOGS

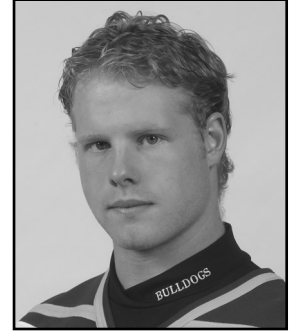

Owned the distinction of being the only unanimous selection to the 2003-04 SJHL All-Star Game . . . Chosen as the SJHL's top forward last season . . . Honored twice (2002-04) as team's Most Valuable Player and served as team captain in 2003-04 . . . Racked up 92 points with a league-high 43 goals and 49 assists in 60 games for 2003-04 season . . . Produced 27 goals and assists apiece for 54 points in 58 contests in 2002-03 . . . Garnered 16 points on six goals and 10 assists in his initial season (2001-02) with Melville . . . Scored 19 goals with as many assists for the Tisdale (Sask.) Trojans of the Saskatchewan Hockey Association in 2000-01 campaign . . . A 2002 graduate of Melville Comprehensive School . . . Competed in in badminton and golf four years apiece and two years in football.
