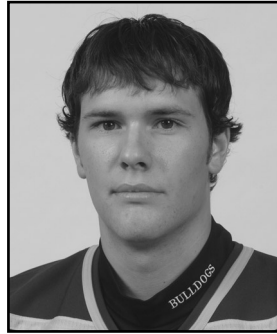


THE 2004-05 BULLDOGS

2004-05: Excellent skater . . . Offensively-skilled defenseman . . . Makes good decisions on the ice . . . Handles the puck well . . . Supplies depth and consistency to the blueline . . . Should vie for considerable ice time . . . Displays good hands and instincts.

HIGH SCHOOL/JUNIOR: Received North American Hockey League All-Rookie Team plaudits in 2003-04 while skating for the Soo (Mich.) Kewadin Indians . . . Coached by Joe Shawhan . . . Registered 31 points with eight goals and 23 assists in 55 outings for 2003-04 campaign as his season-point total ranked eighth best on the squad while tying for 10th overall among the NAHL's defensemen . . . Helped lead the Indians to a 44-6-6 overall mark in 2003-04 . . . Teammate of FSU goaltender Derek MacIntyre . . . Played an instrumental role in helping the Indians to a runner-up finish at the 2002-03 USA Hockey Junior A National Championship Tournament after being called up at the conclusion of the Midget AAA season . . . Produced 45 points with 15 goals and 30 assists in 60 contests for the Soo Midget AAA team in 2002-03 . . . A 2003 graduate of Sault Area High School . . . Played prep baseball during freshman and sophomore seasons.

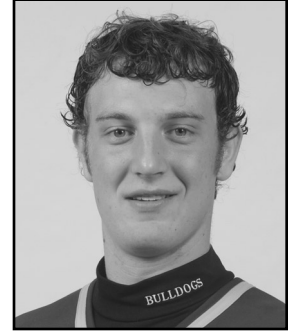

Goaltender

2004-05: Highly-touted netminder . . . Possesses excellent skills . . . Expected to challenge for number one position . . . Technically-sound with quick reflexes . . . Butterfly-style goaltender . . . Has the potential to develop into one of the program's best netminders . . . Selected nation's fifth-best incoming freshman netminder by *Inside College Hockey* . . . An eighth-round (234th overall) selection by the San Jose Sharks in the 2004 National Hockey League Entry Draft . . . Was listed 21st among goaltenders in the NHL's Central Scouting Services final draft rankings.

HIGH SCHOOL/JUNIOR: Starred for the Soo (Mich.) Kewadin Indians of the North American Hockey League . . . Played under coach Joe Shawhan . . . A 2003-04 All-NAHL Second-Team and NAHL All-Rookie Team honoree . . . Held distinction of being the only NAHL player to earn both league all-star and all-rookie team kudos . . . Compiled a 31-3-2 record in net with a 1.77 goals against average (65 goals allowed) and a .924 saves percentage (786 saves) to go with four shutouts in 39 appearances in 2003-04 campaign . . . Placed second among the league's goaltenders in victories and tied for fourth in saves percentage . . . Honored as the NAHL North Division's Defensive Player of the Month for February 2004 . . . Notched a 2.54 goals against average with a .900 saves percentage and six shutouts for the Little Caesar's Midget Team in 2002-03 season . . . Graduated in 2004 from Sault Area High School . . . Competed in golf two years (2000-01).

Needs to continue improving strength and conditioning to attain maximum productivity.

HIGH SCHOOL/JUNIOR: Spent the 2003-04 season with the Des Moines (Iowa) Buccaneers of the United States Hockey League . . . Coached by Bob Ferguson . . . Named squad's Rookie of the Year in 2003-04 after tying for third in team scoring with 22 goals and 24 assists for 46 points in 54 contests . . . Also posted a +4 efficiency rating and tallied seven power-play markers . . . His 2003-04 season goal total represented the second best among the team's leaders . . . Finished the 2003-04 regular season tied for 21st in league scoring and ranked in a 13th-place tie among the USHL's top goal scorers . . . Chosen team Most Valuable Player in 2002-03 season while skating for the Little Caesar's Midget Major squad . . . Racked up a combined 160 points with 64 goals in 85 total outings from 2002-03 as Little Caesar's registered a 63-17-5 record . . . Was the leading scorer of the 2002-03 Calgary Max Tournament . . . A 2003 graduate of Livonia Stevenson High School . . . Prepped by Ed Shepfer . . . Also participated in baseball as a sophomore.

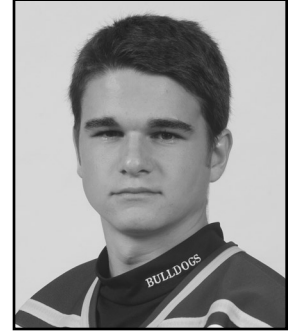
