BULLDOGS TAKE ON ALASKA-FAIRBANKS IN TWO-GAME CCHA HOME SET

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team takes on the nationally-ranked University of Alaska Fairbanks Nanooks this weekend (Nov. 4-5) in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series at Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:05 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 5:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewigleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 2-1-2 overall and 1-0-2 in the CCHA with a 2-1 home-opening league decision over Bowling Green State last Saturday (Oct. 29) in Big Rapids, Mich. The league tilt last Thursday (Oct. 27) at Bowling Green State was suspended after the first period due to ice problems because a pipe in the floor was punctured and leaked refrigerant coolant onto the ice surface.

● Last season, Ferris State finished 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites for the 2004-05 campaign.

Alaska Fairbanks is 3-2-1 overall and 1-1-0 in the CCHA after splitting a home league series with nationally-ranked Michigan last weekend (Oct. 28-29) at UAF's Carlson Center in Fairbanks, Alaska. The Nanooks upset the nationally number-one ranked Wolverines 4-2 last Friday (Oct. 28) before suffering a 4-0 loss to UM in Saturday's (Oct. 29) rematch. UAF is ranked 17th by *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV*, 18th in the *Inside College Hockey* poll, and among teams receiving votes in the *USA Today/American*

Hockey Magazine's poll.

● Last season, Alaska Fairbanks posted a 17-16-4 overall record and placed eighth in the CCHA standings at 11-14-3.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 210-250-42 (.460) – (19-16-1 vs. Alaska Fairbanks – 11-2-0 Home & 8-14-1 Away). **Alaska Fairbanks** – **Tavis MacMillan** (Alaska Fairbanks, 1994), 2nd season, 20-18-5 (.523) – (2-0-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT ALASKA FAIRBANKS: The Nanooks are paced in scoring by three skaters – junior defenseman Nathan Fornataro (1-4-5), sophomore left wing Kyle Greentree (1-4-5), and sophomore center Ryan McLeod (1-4-5). Junior center Curtis Fraser (2-2-4) is also among the squad's leading point getters. Sophomore Wylie Rogers (3-2-0, 2.38 GAA, .925sv%) is Alaska Fairbanks' primary goaltender and ranks 20th nationally in save percentage. Rogers was a 2004-05 CCHA All-Rookie Team selection while Greentree recorded league all-rookie honorable mention accolades. Freshman Chad Johnson (0-0-1, 2.77 GAA, .927sv%) is Rogers' backup in goal. The Nanooks currently rank tied for 19th among the national leaders in scoring defense (2.50 avg.).

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

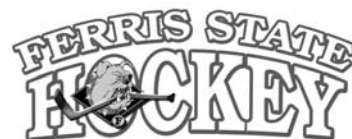

• **Productive Month** – Ferris State closed out the month of October with a 2-1-2 overall record (.600) after compiling a 2-6-0 mark (.250) in the previous season.

• **Solid Performer in Net** – Freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almont, Ontario)** is averaging 24.0 saves per game (72 total) in his last three appearances. O'Keefe, who has stopped at least 21 shots on goal in his last three outings to date, concluded October with a 1.92 goals against average and a .912 saves percentage in four contests. He currently ranks 15th nationally in goals-against average (1.92). O'Keefe, who was the CCHA's Rookie of the Week (10/24), was rated as the eighth best incoming freshmen goaltender by *Inside College Hockey* (INCH).

• **Significant Goal** – Junior left wing **Eric Vesely (Woodstock, Ill.)** tallied his first career game-winning goal in Ferris' 2-1 home victory over Bowling Green State last Saturday (10/29). Vesely's two lampshooters in five games this year equals his goals production in 32 contests from a season ago.

• **His Month** – Junior left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** has totaled a combined nine points (3-6-9) in November games encompassing the last two seasons. He compiled five points (1-4-5) in seven 2003-04 contests and then chalked up four points (2-2-4) in six outings a season ago.

• **Good Start** – Senior defenseman **Andrew Winnik's (Mississauga, Ontario)** three points (0-3-3) in five games this year already matches his season's production in his first two campaigns (2002-03 and 2003-04). Winnik notched three points (2-1-3) in 24 outings for 2002-03 and garnered the same points total (0-3-3) in 22 contests for the 2003-04 season.

• **Home Openers** – With its 2-1 home-opening win against Bowling Green State last Saturday (10/29), Ferris State is now 5-9-1 (.367) in home openers since the 1990-91 campaign. The victory was only the Bulldogs' second in the last eight home-opening encounters.

• **A Comparison** – The Bulldogs are operating at 15.2% (5-33) efficiency on the power play in their first five games this season and are 83.8% (31-37) on the penalty kill. In its initial 10 outings last year, Ferris was at 13.7% (10-73) success rate in power plays and 84.6% (77-91) in penalty-kill situations.

• **Did You Know?** – Junior left wing **Matt Verdone (2-0-2)** and sophomore defenseman **Adam Welch (0-2-2)** are the Bulldogs' top returning points leaders from last season's two-game set versus Alaska Fairbanks.

• **Early Games** – Ferris State, which hosts Alaska Fairbanks this Saturday (Nov. 5) in an early start time (5:05 p.m.) contest, went 0-2-0 in those outings last season with a 4-3 overtime loss to Ohio State (10/16) and then suffered a 4-2 setback to Bowling Green State (2/5).

• **Impressive Fresh Class** – Ferris State's incoming freshmen class for the 2005-06 season is ranked 10th best among the nation's top 15 recruiting classes according to *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) 2005 Recruiting Rankings. Besides O'Keefe, freshman right wing **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** was listed seventh on INCH's Top 20 Incoming Forward Rankings while frosh defenseman **Chris Zarb (Waterford)** landed into 11th place on the top 15 incoming defensemen chart.

- ◆ **BOB DANIELS vs. Alaska Fairbanks** -- 19-16-1 overall (11-2-0 at home and 8-14-1 on the road).
