FSU SWEEPS WESTERN MICHIGAN; HOSTS BEMIDJI STATE IN NON-LEAGUE PLAY

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will take a break from Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) play for the next two weeks, starting this weekend (Nov. 18-19) as the Bulldogs face the nationally-ranked Bemidji (Minn.) State University Beavers in Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:05 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 5:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewigleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 4-2-4 overall and 3-1-4 in the CCHA with a CCHA home-and-home series sweep of the Western Michigan Broncos last weekend (Nov. 11-12). The Bulldogs won 6-0 in last Friday (Nov. 11) at Big Rapids and then registered a 5-3 come-from-behind triumph in Saturday's (Nov. 12) rematch at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich. FSU was among other teams receiving votes in the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV, USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine*, and *Inside College Hockey* polls this week.

➤ Last season, Ferris State was 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites.

Bemidji State is 7-1-0 overall and 3-1-0 in College Hockey America (CHA) to date following a league series sweep of Wayne State last weekend (Nov. 11-12) at the Michigan State Fairgrounds Coliseum in Detroit, Mich. The Beavers, who have a current three-game winning streak, are ranked 14th nationally by *Inside College Hockey* and 16th in the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll this week. BSU was among teams receiving votes in the *USA*

Today/USA Hockey Magazine poll.

➤ A season ago, Bemidji State compiled a 23-13-1 overall record which included a first-place 16-4-0 mark in the CHA. The Beavers not only captured their second straight CHA regular-season title but won the 2005 CHA Tournament and made the program's first-ever NCAA Division I Championship Tournament appearance. BSU suffered a 4-3 over-time loss to eventual two-time defending national champion Denver (3/26) at the NCAA Northeast Regional in Amherst, Mass.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 212-251-44 (.462) – (4-2-0 vs. Bemidji State – 1-1-0 Home, 3-1-0 Away). Bemidji State – **Tom Serratore** (Bemidji State, 1987), 5th season, 76-59-17 (.556) – (2-2-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT BEMIDJI STATE: The Beavers are ranked sixth nationally in scoring offense (3.88 gpg.) and are tied for fifth in scoring defense (2.00 gpg.). Junior forward Luke Erickson (4-6-10), a 2004-05 All-CHA First Teamer, along with sophomore forward Jake Bluhm (6-3-9) are the top scorers. In goal, junior Layne Sedevie (4-0-0, 1.50 GAA, .940sv%) and sophomore Matt Climie (3-1-0, 2.50 GAA, .921sv%) have split time. Sedevie is listed fourth nationally in both goals-against average and save percentage while Climie was tabbed as the 2005 CHA Preseason Player of the Year.

GAMES THIS WEEK

➤ **Three Garner Weekly Awards** – Senior right wing **Greg Rallo** (Gurnee, Ill.), freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe** (Almont, Ontario), and freshman center **Dan Riedel** (Rochester Hills) have all been honored by the CCHA for their performances last week. Rallo was named the league's Offensive Player of the Week with seven points (2-5-7) in three games while O'Keefe picked up Goaltender of the Week accolades after going 2-0-1 in net with a 1.62 goals against average and a .943 saves percentage in 185 minutes of action. Riedel was selected the Rookie of the Week as a result of totaling seven points (1-6-7) in the three outings. O'Keefe, who was rated as the eighth-best incoming freshman goaltender by Inside College Hockey for this season, was recognized as the CCHA's Rookie of the Week earlier this season (10/24).

➤ **Off To A Fine Start** – Ferris State's 10 league points in eight CCHA games this season is just eight shy of matching its entire 18 points total from the 2004-05 campaign. The Bulldogs were 7-17-4 in 28 league encounters a season ago.

➤ **Miller Time** – Sophomore center **Adam Miller** (Livonia) went three straight games (11/5-11) with two points apiece. He had a point and an assist in back-to-back outings against Alaska Fairbanks (11/5) and Michigan State (11/8) before scoring twice versus Western Michigan (11/11). He went scoreless in the series finale at WMU (11/12). Miller (6-2-8) is four points away from matching his 12 points (2-10-12) output in 36 2004-05 contests.

➤ **No "Sophomore Jinx"** – Sophomore defenseman **Jim Jorgensen** (Sault Ste. Marie) has seven points (0-7-7) in 10 games this year after putting together a 2-4-6 chart in 34 outings last season. He has tallied at least a point in five outings, which included four assists during a three-game point streak (11/5-11/11).

➤ **Warming Up** – **Dan Riedel** had a combined seven points (1-6-7) in the two-game set against Western Michigan last weekend, highlighted by Saturday's four-point (1-3-4) outing at WMU. In his previous eight games this year, Riedel generated four points (1-3-4).

➤ **Scoring Leaders** – The Bulldogs' top three scoring leaders to date in **Greg Rallo** (3-9-12), **Dan Riedel** (2-9-11), and junior left wing **Matt Verdone** (6-4-10) have combined for 37.5% (33-88) of the team's points production and 34.4% (11-32) of the squad's goal-scoring output.

➤ **Top Non-League Performers** – **Greg Rallo** has compiled 20 career points (7-13-20) in 35 non-league contests while junior right wing **Zac Pearson's** (White Lake) 14 career non-league points total in 22 games also ranks among the team's best points getters.

➤ **Did You Know?** – The Bulldogs are 18-10-0 (.643) all-time against College Hockey America (CHA) teams and 12-14-4 (.467) overall versus Minnesota schools.

➤ **Impressive Frosh Class** – Ferris State's incoming freshmen class for the 2005-06 season is ranked 10th best among the nation's top 15 recruiting classes according to *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) 2005 Recruiting Rankings. Besides O'Keefe, **Dan Riedel** was listed seventh on INCH's Top 20 Incoming Forward Rankings while frosh defenseman **Chris Zarb** (Waterford) landed into 11th place on the top 15 incoming defensemen chart.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I Coach of the



Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

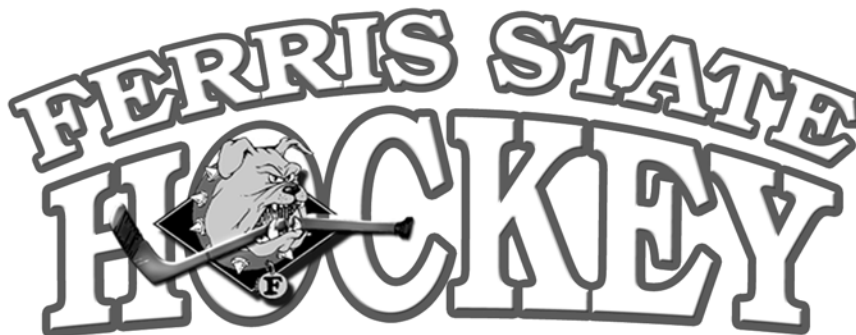
