FERRIS FACES BOWLING GREEN STATE IN HOME-AND-HOME SERIES

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will face off against the Bowling Green State University Falcons this weekend (Oct. 27 & 29) in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home-and-home series. This Thursday's (Oct. 27) contest will be held at Bowling Green, Ohio, with Saturday's (Oct. 29) rematch taking place in Big Rapids, Mich. This Saturday's encounter represents the Bulldogs' 2005-06 season home opener.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:05 p.m. (EDT)/BGSU Ice Arena (5,000) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EDT)/Ewigleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 1-1-2 overall and 0-0-2 in the CCHA to date after skating to a pair of overtime ties (4-4 and 1-1) against Lake Superior State last weekend (Oct. 21-22) at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich.

● Last season, Ferris State finished 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites for the 2004-05 campaign.

Bowling Green State is presently 0-3-1 overall and 0-1-1 in the CCHA this season after going 0-1-1 in a home-and-home league series with nationally-ranked Ohio State last weekend (Oct. 20-21). The Falcons dropped a 7-2 home decision to the Buckeyes in last Thursday's (Oct. 20) series opener and then skated to a 2-2 overtime tie last Friday (Oct. 21) at OSU's Value City Arena in Columbus, Ohio. BGSU is 0-3-0 at home and 0-0-1 on the road this campaign.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 209-250-42 (.459) – (18-15-6 vs. Bowling Green State – Away 8-10-3, Home 10-5-3). **Bowling Green State** – **Scott Paluch** (Bowling Green State, 1991), 4th season, 35-62-17 (.382) – (1-5-2 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT BOWLING GREEN STATE: Sophomore forwards Jonathan Matsumoto (4-4-8) and Alex Foster (1-5-6) are currently the Falcons' leading scorers. Senior Jon Horrell (0-2-1, 4.00 GAA, .877sv%) is BGSU's primary netminder this season and was selected as this week's CCHA Goaltender of the Week. He made 41 saves in Friday's 2-2 overtime tie at Ohio State

● **O'Keefe Earns CCHA Honor** – Freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almont, Ontario)** has been named this week's CCHA Rookie of the Week for his last weekend's performance at Lake Superior State. He blocked 45-of-50 shots on goal for a .900 save percentage in 130 total minutes of action. O'Keefe, who picked up his first collegiate win in the Bulldogs' 5-2 triumph over Army (10/15) in the consolation game of the Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede with an 11-save effort, was ranked as the eighth-best top freshman netminder by *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* for 2005-06.

2005-06 CCHA STANDINGS



HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association (AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-place 22-5-1 league mark.



For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

• **Scoring Machine** – Junior left wing **Matt Verdone's** (Summertown, Ontario) team-high seven points (6-1-7) in four outings this season represents 20.6% of the team's points production and 50.0% of the Bulldogs' goals output. He along with junior right wing **Zac Pearson's** (White Lake) five assists (0-5-5) have generated 35.3% (12-34) of Ferris' scoring total this campaign

• **Good Behavior** – The Bulldogs have been assessed 16 less penalties in their first four games this season (39 to 55) and 26 less penalty minutes (92 to 118). FSU has also allowed six less goals this campaign (11 to 17) while scoring one more lamplighter (12 to 11) than a season ago during the four-game span.

• **Miller Matches** – Sophomore center **Adam Miller's** (Livonia) two goals this campaign already equals his total in 36 contests a season ago when he produced 12 points (2-10-12). Miller accounted for Ferris' lone tally in last Saturday's overtime tie at Lake Superior State and netted his first goal of this campaign with a power-play marker versus New Hampshire (10/14) in the 2005-06 season opener.

• **Hall of Famer** – Associate head coach **Drew Famulak** was inducted into the Lake Superior State Athletics Hall of Fame as part of the 1987-88 NCAA Division I Championship squad. Famulak, who's in his 13th year at Ferris State, played right wing for the LSSU's 1988 NCAA-I Championship team and also won a pair of NCAA Division III national titles at Wisconsin-Stevens Point.

• **Closing In On Career Mark** – Senior center **Greg Rallo** (Gurnee, Ill.) is four points shy of notching his 75th career point and currently has compiled 71 points (29-42--71) in 116 career appearances. Rallo recorded 29 (15-14--29) of his 71 career points during his freshman year in the 2002-03 season.

• **Productive Line** – The Bulldogs' top forward line of **Verdone**, **Pearson** and freshman center **Brendan Connolly** (Canmore, Alberta) has accounted for 44.1% (15-34) of the squad's points production and 58.3% (7-12) of the team's goal scoring to date this season.

• **500th Game** – Head coach **Bob Daniels**, the winningest coach in Ferris State history, coached in his 500th game at FSU in last Friday's 4-4 overtime tie at Lake Superior State.

• **Late Home Opener** – Ferris State's season home opener this Saturday (Oct. 29) against Bowling Green State is the Bulldogs' latest home-opening contest since 1993-94 (10/29) when the FSU dropped a 4-1 league decision to Lake Superior State. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home a season ago.

• **Did You Know?** – Sophomore right wing **Matt Stefanishion** (Daysland, Alberta) racked up a team-best four points (3-1-4) in last season's two-game series against Bowling Green State. He tallied his first career hat trick (3-0-3) in the series' opener (2/4) versus the Falcons.

• **Impressive Frosh Class** – Ferris State's incoming freshmen class for the 2005-06 season is ranked 10th best among the nation's top 15 recruiting classes according to *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) 2005 Recruiting Rankings. Besides O'Keefe, freshman right wing **Dan Riedel** (Rochester Hills) was listed seventh on INCH's Top 20 Incoming Forward Rankings while frosh defenseman **Chris Zarb** (Waterford) landed into 11th place on the top 15 incoming defensemen chart.

The 2005-06 season marks the sixth year of the Perani Cup Three Stars, which is awarded following each CCHA regular-season game. 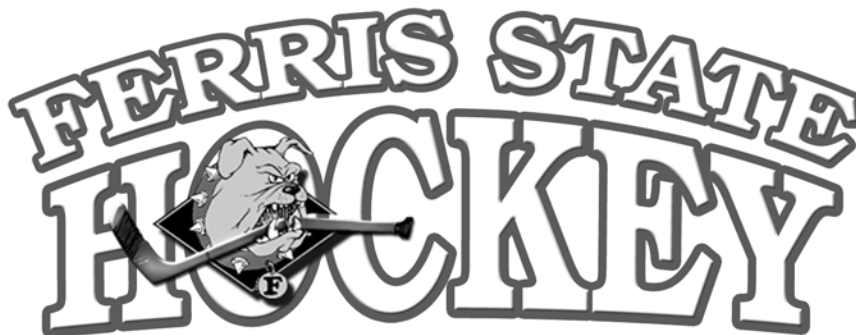
