FERRIS STATE ENTERTAINS CCHA LEADER MIAMI (OHIO) THIS WEEKEND

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team continues its string of skating against nationally-ranked Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) opponents as the Bulldogs host the Miami (Ohio) University RedHawks this weekend (Jan. 27-28) at Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewingleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

BROADCAST INFORMATION: All of Ferris State's 2005-06 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. Live internet stats are available by going to the official CCHA website at <http://ccha.collegesports.com> and click on Games/Results section near the CCHA standings.

TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2005-06 Ferris State Hockey home games is available by contacting the Ewingleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 12-8-6 overall and 7-6-5 in the CCHA with a 2-1 league triumph over nationally-ranked Michigan State Monday (Jan. 24) at MSU's Munn Ice Arena in East Lansing, Mich. The Bulldogs are 4-2-2 in their last eight outings to date. FSU is among teams receiving votes in both of this week's *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* and *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)* polls.

➤ Last season, Ferris State finished 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites for the 2004-05 campaign.

Miami (Ohio) is currently 17-4-4 overall and 14-3-2 in the CCHA after extending its winning streak to two with a league series sweep of Western Michigan last weekend (Jan. 20-21) at MU's Goggin Ice Arena in Oxford, Ohio. The RedHawks sport a 4-1-1 record in their last six encounters to date. Miami is ranked third this week in all three major national polls – *Inside College Hockey*, *USA Today/American Hockey Magazine*, and *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)*.

➤ Miami was 15-18-5 overall with a seventh-place

11-13-4 mark in the CCHA a season ago.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 220-257-46 (.465) – (13-21-6 vs. Miami – 7-9-3 Home, 6-11-3 Away, 0-1-0 Neutral). **Miami (Ohio)** – **Enrico Blasi** (Miami, 1994), 7th season, 121-111-23 (.520) – (9-5-2 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT MIAMI (OHIO): Senior defenseman Andy Greene (7-16-23), a two-time (2003-04 & 2004-05) All-CCHA First-Team selection, is tops among nine RedHawks' skaters with double-digit points this season. Sophomore forward Nathan Davis (12-9-21) and sophomore defenseman Mitch Ganzak (1-20-21), a 2004-05 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention pick, also among the team's top points leaders. Greene's 0.92 points per game average is tied for seventh nationally in points per game among defensemen while Ganzak is tied for 11th place at 0.88 ppg. Sophomore goaltender Charlie Effinger (7-1-3, 1.51 GAA, .940sv%) is second among the national leaders in both goals-against average and save percentage. Freshman Jeff Zatkoff (10-3-1, 1.93 GAA, .928sv%) has also seen extensive action in goal. The RedHawks are third nationally in scoring defense (1.80 ppg.). Assistant coach Jeff Blashill, who's midst his fourth year at Miami, was a four-year letterwinner (1994-98) at Ferris State as a goaltender.

➤ **Better Than Before** – Ferris State's 19 league points in 18 CCHA games this season surpasses last season's 18 league points total (7-17-4 record).

➤ **Hobey Baker Candidate** – Senior center **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** is among 193 players who have advanced to the preliminary voting phase in the 2006 Vote for Hobey. To reach the Preliminary Voting ballot, players must have received nominations from at least 25 fans during Vote for Hobey's Nominating Phase. The Preliminary Voting will run through March 5, giving fans the opportunity to help determine the 10 finalists for the Hobey Baker Award. The fans' tally will be combined with the votes of the 59 Division I head coaches to determine the 10 finalists for the award.

➤ **CCHA Rookie of the Week** – Freshman center **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** is this week's CCHA Rookie of the Week following his four-point (3-1-4) effort at Bowling Green State (1/16). The weekly award is the second this season for Riedel, who totaled seven points (1-6-7) in the three mid-November outings, to garner the CCHA honor. He scored the game winner at Michigan State (1/24).

➤ **The 20-Point Club** – Ferris States' three 20 or plus points producers this season, **Greg Rallo** (12-17-29), junior left wing **Mark Bomersback** (12-10-22), and freshman center **Dan Riedel** (7-14-21) have combined for 33.9% (72-212) of the team's points output and 37.3% (31-83) of the squad's goal-scoring production.

➤ **Closing In On 100** – **Greg Rallo** is two points shy of recording his 100th career point. Rallo has presently totaled 98 career points (41-57-98) in 138 contests. He needs 22 more points to move into a 23rd-place tie with Dean Cowling (1985-89; 120 career pts.) on the school's all-time scoring leaders list.

➤ **Fit To Be Tied** – Ferris State's 2-2 overtime tie against Lake Superior State last Friday (1/16) represented the team's sixth this season. The last time FSU skated to at least six ties in a season was in the 1998-99 campaign when the Bulldogs registered a 14-16-6 overall mark. The school record is seven set in the 1991-92 season (13-18-7 overall). Incidentally, Ferris went the entire 1986-87 campaign without a tie (16-27-0).

➤ **Tough Slate** – The Bulldogs have or will play five teams currently ranked among the top 15 teams in the nation. This past weekend (1/20-21) in Big Rapids, Ferris State took three of four league points against nationally-ranked Lake Superior State. FSU skated to a 3-3 overtime tie with top-ranked Boston College at the Wells Fargo Denver Cup (12/30) and also knocked off two-time defending national champion Denver, 3-2, in the third-place game of the Wells Fargo Denver Cup (12/31). Others on the list include Miami, Michigan, and New Hampshire. Ferris' only loss to a nationally-ranked team was a 4-2 season-opening setback to New Hampshire (10/14) at the Mutual of Omaha Maverick Stampede Tourney.

➤ **Close Encounters** – 10 of Ferris State's last 11 contests have been decided by two goals or less as the Bulldogs are 5-3-2 (.600) in those contests. Four of the last five have been determined by a single goal.

➤ **Sideline** – Sophomore right wing **Matt Stefanishon (Daysland, Alberta)** will be sidelined indefinitely after suffering an injury to his wrist in last Friday's (1/20) against Lake Superior State. Stefanishon has totaled 13 points (9-4-13) in 23 outings to date this campaign.

➤ **Career Best** – **Mark Bomersback's (Rochester, Alberta)** 12 lamplighters in 26 games this year is a career best, bettering his eight goals in 37 outings in the 2003-04 campaign. Bomersback has 22 points (12-10-22) this season, one shy of matching his career-high 23 points (7-16-23) in the 2004-05 campaign. He has three goals in his last two outings, including a pair against Lake Superior State (1/21).

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
