FERRIS ADVANCES TO CCHA PLAYOFF QUARTERFINALS AT MICHIGAN

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will participate in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Playoff Quarterfinal round this weekend (March 10-12) against the nationally-ranked University of Michigan Wolverines in Ann Arbor, Mich. The seventh-seeded Bulldogs advanced after registering a league playoff first-round series sweep of Ohio State while the third-seeded Wolverines received a first-round bye.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday, Saturday & Sunday (if necessary) - 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Yost Ice Arena (6,637).

TELEVISION BROADCAST: This Friday's (March 10) game will be televised live on FSN Detroit. Calling the action will be Ken Daniels with Fred Platsch serving as the analyst and Shireen Saski as rinkside reporter.

RADIO BROADCAST: All of Ferris State's 2005-06 CCHA Playoff games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State improved to 17-13-8 overall and was 10-11-7 in the CCHA this season following a 2-1 victory over Ohio State last Saturday (March 4) in game two of a best-of-three CCHA Playoff First-Round series at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs, who are midst a current four-game unbeaten streak (3-0-1), are ranked 19th in this week's (March 6) *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll.

● Last season, Ferris State was 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark.

Michigan is 18-13-5 overall and was 13-10-5 in the CCHA this season. The Wolverines dropped a 4-3 overtime league decision to Ferris State in the regular season finale (Feb. 25) at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. UM, which was idle last weekend, is ranked 14th this week (March 6) in the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* poll, 15th in the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll, and 16th in the *Inside College Hockey* poll.

◆ A season ago, Michigan was 31-8-3 overall with a first-place 23-3-2 CCHA mark. The Wolverines captured both the CCHA regular season and CCHA Playoff titles in 2004-05. UM also made its NCAA-record 15th straight NCAA Tournament appearance last season and has won two national titles (1996 & 1998) during the streak.

THE COACHES: Ferris State - **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 224-262-48 (.464) - (10-26-2 vs. Michigan - 4-15-0 Away, 6-9-1 Home, and 0-2-1 Neutral). Michigan - **Gordon "Red" Berenson** (Michigan, 1962), 22nd season, 582-276-63 (.666) - (48-21-2 vs. Ferris State). Berenson is UM's all-time winningest coach.

ABOUT MICHIGAN: Junior forward T.J. Hensick (14-33-47), a 2004-05 All-CCHA First-Team honoree, and senior forward Andrew Ebbett (11-25-36) are among 12 Wolverines with double-figure points totals. Sophomore forwards Kevin Porter (16-18-34) and Chad Kolarik (11-21-32) along with freshman defenseman Jack Johnson (9-21-30) are other top scorers for UM, which is fourth nationally in scoring offense (3.69 gpg.). Johnson is listed ninth nationally among rookies in scoring (0.91 gpg.) and tied for sixth among defensemen. Freshman Billy Sauer (11-6-4, 3.04 GAA, .898sv%) is the Wolverines' primary goaltender with senior Noah Ruden (7-7-1, 2.83 GAA, .911sv%) serving as the backup.

GAMES THIS WEEK

CCHA PLAYOFFS SECOND ROUND

➤ **Better Than Before** – Ferris State's 17 victories this season (17-13-8 overall) not only surpasses the team's win total from all of last season (13-22-4 overall) but is the most in a season since the 2002-03 campaign (31-10-1 overall). This season's win total currently ties for the ninth most season wins in Ferris history.

➤ **Fit To Be Tied** – The Bulldogs' eight ties this campaign represents a school single-season record, eclipsing the previous Bulldog mark set by the 1991-92 squad which finished 13-18-7 overall with a sixth-place 11-15-6 CCHA record under former head coach Bob Mancini.

➤ **Close Encounters** – 18 of Ferris State's last 23 contests have been decided by two goals or less as the Bulldogs are 8-6-4 (.556) in those contests. Ten of the last 17 outings have been determined by a single goal or less, which includes six of the last seven games to date (2-2-2 record).

➤ **Hot Goaltender** – Freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almont, Ontario)** is 3-0-1 with a 1.71 goals-against average (seven goals allowed) and a .945 save percentage (120 saves) in his last four appearances in net. In his prior four outings, O'Keefe went 0-3-1 with a 3.20 goals-against average (13 goals allowed) and an .869 save percentage (86 saves). He recorded a season-high 44 saves against Ohio State last Saturday (3/4) which eclipsed his 35 stops at Bowling Green State earlier this season (1/16). O'Keefe, who was ranked eighth in the preseason among the nation's top rookie netminders by *Inside College Hockey*, has totaled 10 30 or more save game performances this season.

➤ **Center of Attention** – Freshman center **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** brings a team-high four-game point streak into this Friday's (3/10) playoff contest at Michigan. Riedel, the Bulldogs' third-highest scorer this season with 29 points, has eight points (3-5-8) in his last nine outings. He needs six more points to tie Ted Zofchak (1975-76), Tom Rudrud (1979-80), and Rod Schluter (1984-85) for 10th place among FSU's single-season freshmen points leaders. Riedel was listed seventh on *Inside College Hockey's* top 20 incoming forward rankings this preseason.

➤ **Clutch Performer** – Junior right wing **Zac Pearson (White Lake)** has been a key Ferris performer in overtime contests over the last two seasons. Pearson accounted for the game winner in a 1-0 overtime win at Ohio State last season (3/12) in CCHA Playoff action to force a series' deciding third game and notched the game-winning tally in overtime at Michigan in the regular-season finale (2/25) to secure a home-ice first-round playoff berth. Pearson was a tri-recipient of FSU's Most Improved Player Award last season.

➤ **Shooting Display** – The Bulldogs have outshot their opponents in eight of their last 11 contests, including six consecutive games at one stretch (1/28-2/17). Ferris is averaging 31.4 shots on goal (345 total) to the opposition's 27.5 shots on net (302 total) during that 11-game period.

➤ **Frankly Speaking** – Redshirt freshman center **Matt Frank (Billings, Mont.)** has notched three points (2-1-3) in his last three games after posting two points (0-2-2) in his previous 11 outings. Frank, who had a goal and an assist in last Friday's (3/3) CCHA Playoff game-one win over Ohio State, snapped a 20-game non-goal streak with a third-period lamplighter at Michigan (2/25). Prior to that goal, the last time he netted a marker was at Nebraska-Omaha earlier this season (12/2).

➤ **Rallo Inching Up FSU Record Book** – Senior center **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** currently ranks tied for 29th place with Ed Turner (50-56-106; 1976-79) in Ferris State's record book with 106 career points (45-61-106) in 150 contests. The assistant captain is four points shy of tying Rod Taylor (77-33-110; 1987-90) for 28th place. Rallo's 45 career lamplighters is 26th highest on the Bulldogs' all-time goal-scoring list. He's one marker away from tying Jeff Jestadt (46 goals; 1988-92) for 25th place and needs three more goals to move into a 24th-place tie with Joel Irwin (48 goals; 1995-98). Rallo's seven game-winning goals presently ties him with six others for 16th place on Ferris' career leaders list. His 37 points (16-21-37) in 38 games this season is a career high, bettering his 29 points (15-14-29) set during his freshman year in 2002-03.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

• **CCHA Playoff History** – Ferris is 16-43-3 (.282) all-time in CCHA Playoff action, which includes a 2-6-0 record (.250) in second or higher round competition. The Bulldogs are 6-39-0 on the road, 8-0-0 at home, and 2-4-0 at neutral sites. Ferris State is 0-4-0 all-time versus Michigan in the CCHA Playoffs with the last meeting occurring at the 2003 CCHA Championship game (3/22) when the Bulldogs dropped a 5-3 decision to the Wolverines. The last playoff series in Ann Arbor was in 2001 (3/9-10) when Michigan swept a pair of games, 8-3 and 3-0. The teams also met in a 1991 playoff semifinal (3/8) at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich., with the Wolverines prevailing 4-2.

• **Did You Know?** – The last and only time Ferris State has won a CCHA Playoff road series was in the 1979-80 season (3/7-8/80) when the Bulldogs swept Ohio State in a two-game quarterfinal-round series which was determined by total goals in the series. Ferris skated to a 4-4 overtime deadlock in the opener and then registered an 8-4 triumph over the Buckeyes in game two.

• **Rallo Named FSU's CCHA Scholar-Athlete** – Senior center **Greg Rallo** has been chosen as Ferris State's CCHA Scholar-Athlete of the Year for the 2005-06 season in an announcement made Tuesday (March 8) by the league office. Rallo, a marketing major, is among 12 outstanding student-athletes who will vie for the 2005-06 CCHA Scholar-Athlete of the Year Award which will be announced at the 2006 CCHA Awards Banquet on Thursday, March 16, at the Fox Theatre in Detroit, Mich. Nominees must have a cumulative grade point average of 3.25 through the fall term of the selection year to receive their school's Scholar-Athlete of the Year honor. Junior defenseman **Joe Van Culin (Monticello, Minn.)** was FSU's selection a season ago.

• **On The Road** – Ferris State is averaging 3.06 goals per away contest this season (52 total) to its opponent's 3.24 markers (55 total) in 17 road encounters to date. The Bulldogs are operating at 18.0% (20-111) on the power play and 84.2% (85-101) in penalty-kill efficiency. FSU has been outscored 42-35 (+7 goals) in the opening two periods and has a 17-13 goals advantage in both the third and overtime periods, which includes a 16-13 edge in the third frame. Ferris has outshot the opposition by 65 shots on goal (523-458) this campaign on the road.

• **Top Three Scorers** – Ferris State's top three points leaders this season, **Greg Rallo** (16-21-37), **Mark Bomersback** (15-15-30) and **Dan Riedel** (10-19-29) have combined for 32.5% (96-295) of the squad's points production and 35.7% (41-115) of its goal-scoring output.

• **A Year Ago** – **Greg Rallo** (0-7-7) is the Bulldogs' top returning points producer in March outings for the 2004-05 campaign. He had six points (4-2-6) in nine 2002-03 contests.

• **Top March Scorers** – **Greg Rallo** (6-10-16, 20 GP) and **Jeremy Scherlinck** (0-6-6, 15 GP) are Ferris State's current leading scorers in all-time March games.

• **What A Difference A Season Makes** – 12 of 22 Ferris State skaters have exceeded their season points production from the previous 2004-05 campaign. **Greg Rallo** is the team's leader at +15 (37-22) while **Eric Vesely** is second at +13 (16-3).

• **Historic Season** – Ferris State's 31-10-1 overall record in the 2002-03 campaign represented the best mark ever in the program's history at the NCAA-I level. The 1979-80 squad under Rick Duffett compiled a 26-11-1 overall record (11-9-0 CCHA), which marked the Bulldogs' first season as a CCHA member. FSU was the nation's first team to reach the 30-win plateau and participated in the NCAA Championship Tournament for the first-time ever, losing 7-4 in the West Regional Final to 2002-03 National Champion Minnesota in Minneapolis, Minn. Ferris also claimed its first-ever CCHA Regular-Season Championship title in 2002-03 with a first-place 22-5-1 league record (45 league points).
