FERRIS STATE DROPS TWO ON THE ROAD; NORTHERN MICHIGAN UP NEXT

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will conclude Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) action for 2005 this weekend (Dec. 9-10) as the Bulldogs host the Northern Michigan University Wildcats in a two-game series at Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday - 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewingleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

BROADCAST INFORMATION: All of Ferris State's 2005-06 league games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the play-by-play. Those contests can also be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. Live internet stats are available by going to the CCHA website at <http://ccha.collegesports.com> and clicking on the Games/Results section near the CCHA standings.

TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2005-06 Ferris State Hockey home games is available by contacting the Ewingleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday - 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (EST) and Saturday (home games only) - 12 to 5 p.m. (EST).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State sports a 7-5-4 overall mark and is 3-3-4 in CCHA play this season after dropping a pair of league contests to nationally-ranked Nebraska-Omaha last weekend (Dec. 2 & 4) at the Qwest Center Omaha in Omaha, Neb. FSU, which was ranked 19th nationally last week (Nov. 28) in two polls, only received votes this week (Dec. 5) in the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll.

☛ Last season, Ferris State was 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites.

Northern Michigan is 7-7-0 overall and 4-6-0 in the CCHA after splitting a two-game league series against Alaska Fairbanks two weeks ago (Nov. 25-26) at UAF's Carlson Center in Fairbanks, Alaska. NMU, which is 4-4-0 on the road this season and 2-6-0 in its last eight outings overall, also was among teams receiving votes in this week's (Dec. 5) *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll.

☛ The Wildcats were 22-11-7 overall, which included a third-place 17-7-4 CCHA mark last season. NMU has won 20 or more games in a season for four years in a row and six of the past seven seasons.

THE COACHES: Ferris State - **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 215-254-44 (.462) - (11-15-1 vs. Northern Michigan - 3-8-1 Home, 7-7-0 Away, 1-0-0 Neutral). **Northern Michigan** - **Walt Kyle** (Northern Michigan, 1981), 4th season, 72-51-13 (.577) - (5-2-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT NORTHERN MICHIGAN: The Wildcats have four double-figure point getters, led by senior forwards Andrew Contois (5-9-14) and Dirk Southern (4-10-14). Senior forward Jamie Milam (4-7-11), brother of former FSU defenseman Troy Milam (1999-03), and junior forward Darin Olver (4-6-10) are the other NMU points leaders. Senior Nathan Oystriick (2-5-7), a 2004-05 All-CCHA First-Teamer and the CCHA's Best Defensive Defenseman Award winner last season, is the squad's top scoring defenseman. Sophomore goaltender Bill Zaniboni (5-5-0, 2.46 GAA, .904sv%) has been the Wildcats' primary netminder this season and ranks 20th among the nation's goals-against average leaders. He's backed up by freshman Derek Janzen (2-2-0, 3.27 GAA, .891sv%). NMU is currently tied for 22nd nationally in scoring defense (2.79 gpg.). Walt Kyle will serve as head coach of the U.S. National Junior Team which will compete at the 2006 International Ice Hockey Federation World Junior Championships (Dec. 26-Jan. 5) in both Vancouver and Kelowna, British Columbia.

☛ **Turning It Up**— Senior right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** has compiled 15 points (8-7-15) in his last eight contests, which includes five multi-point game efforts. Rallo, who needs nine more points (9-11-20) to match his career high of 29 points (15-14-29) set in his 2002-03 freshman campaign, has accumulated 89 career points (38-51-89) in 128 contests. Rallo is 12 goals shy of moving into a 20th-place tie with Tom Rudrud (1979-83) and Ed Turner (1976-80) among the school's all-time goal-scoring leaders. Rudrud tallied 50 markers in 141 career outings while Turner competed in 84 games.

☛ **So Far, So Good** – Ferris State's 10 league points in 10 CCHA games this season is eight shy of matching its entire 18 points league total in 2004-05. The Bulldogs were 7-17-4 in 28 league encounters a season ago.

☛ **Home Production** – **Greg Rallo** has totaled a team-leading eight points (4-4-8) in seven home outings this season and has registered 41 career points (17-24-41) in 60 home encounters to date.

☛ **Goal Scorer** – Sophomore right wing **Matt Stefanishion's (Daysland, Alberta)** seven points in 15 outings this season have all occurred on goals. His 19 career lamplighters in 49 contests presently accounts for 67.9% (19-28) of his career points total.

☛ **Making A Point** – Junior center-left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** has at least a point in seven of his last eight contests and has amassed 13 points (5-8-13) in that eight-game span.

☛ **A Career Best** – Junior left wing **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** scored his career-high eighth goal of this season at Nebraska-Omaha last Sunday (12/4) to eclipse his seven lamplighters in 39 contests last campaign. Verdone, who recorded a combined six goals in a two-game span earlier this season (10/15-21), has 12 points (8-4-12) in 14 games this year and is three shy of equalling last season's career-best 15 points (7-8-15) output.

☛ **Season Improvement** – Ferris State has scored eight more goals (57) in its initial 16 contests this season compared to 49 lamplighters at this point in 2004-05. The Bulldogs also have allowed eight fewer goals this season. Individually, **Greg Rallo** has 15 more points (9-11-20) this season to date after garnering five (1-4-5) in 10 games the previous campaign. **Mark Bomersback** presently has 15 points (6-9-15) in 16 outings this season and had 14 points (4-10-14) in the previous campaign.

☛ **Top Scorers** – The Bulldogs' junior class is presently leading the team in scoring this season with 50 points, which includes team highs in both goals (23) and assists (27). The group is averaging 3.65 points per game this campaign.

☛ **Annual Holiday Event** – Ferris State will conduct its annual Teddy Bear Toss this Saturday (12/10) against Northern Michigan in which fans bring a teddy bear to throw onto the ice during intermission with the items being donated to Toys for Tots for this holiday season.

☛ **Impressive Frosh Class** – Ferris State's incoming freshmen class for the 2005-06 season is ranked 10th best among the nation's top 15 recruiting classes according to *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) 2005 Recruiting Rankings.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

The 2005-06 season marks the sixth year of the Perani Cup Three Stars, which is awarded following each CCHA regular-season game. Players from each school earn points throughout the season each time they're named a "star of the game" (5 points, for 1st star, 3 points for 2nd star, and 1 point for 3rd star). At season's end, the
