FERRIS STATE MEETS NOTRE DAME FOR THE FIRST TIME THIS SEASON

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will tangle with the University of Notre Dame Fighting Irish for the first time during the 2005-06 season this weekend (Feb. 10-11) in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) home-and-home series. Ferris State visits Notre Dame this Friday (Feb. 10) in Notre Dame, Ind., before hosting the Irish this Saturday (Feb. 11) in Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Joyce Center (2,713)/Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewingleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

BROADCAST INFORMATION: All of Ferris State's 2005-06 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. Live internet stats are available by going to <http://ccha.collegesports.com> and click on Games/Results section near the CCHA standings. **TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2005-06 Ferris State Hockey home games are available by contacting the Ewingleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 14-10-6 overall and 9-8-5 in the CCHA after registering a home-and-home league series sweep of Western Michigan last weekend (Feb. 3-4). The Bulldogs, who are 6-4-2 in their last 12 outings to date, are ranked 20th in this week's *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)* poll and are among teams receiving votes in the *Inside College Hockey (INCH)* poll.

➤ Last season, Ferris State finished 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites for the 2004-05 campaign.

Notre Dame is 9-16-3 overall and 7-12-3 in the CCHA after suffering a pair of league losses to nationally-ranked Michigan State last weekend (Feb. 3-4) in a home-and-home series. UND dropped a 3-2 home decision to the Spartans last Friday (Feb. 3) in Notre Dame, Ind., and then was dealt a 2-1 setback in Saturday's (Feb. 4) contest held at MSU's Munn Ice Arena in East Lansing, Mich. The Irish are 5-8-1 at home and 4-8-2 on the road this season. UND is 3-5-2 in its last 10 appearances to date.

➤ A season ago, Notre Dame posted a 5-27-6 overall mark and finished 12th place in the CCHA at 3-20-5.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 222-259-46 (.465) – (22-12-4 vs. Notre Dame – 14-8-3 Away, 6-4-1 Home, 2-0-0 Neutral). Notre Dame – **Jeff Jackson** (Michigan State, 1978), 1st season, 9-16-3 (.375); Career: 191-68-28 (.714) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State). Jackson was 17-1-3 against Ferris State in his six seasons (1990-96) as head coach at Lake Superior State.

ABOUT NOTRE DAME: Freshman right wing Erik Condra (5-21–26) leads eight Fighting Irish skaters in double-figure point totals this season. Condra currently ranks 10th nationally among rookies in points per game (0.93 avg.). Junior left wing Josh Sciba (13-11–24), senior right wing Tim Wallace (10-9–19), and sophomore right wing Mark Van Guilder (4-14–18) are among Notre Dame's top scoring leaders. Junior goaltender David Brown (6-13-3, 2.75 GAA, .906sv%) has been the regular in net this campaign with freshman Jordan Pearce (3-3-0, 3.42 GAA, .873sv%) also receiving some playing time.

TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 7

➤ **Winnik Honored By The CCHA** – Senior defenseman **Andrew Winnik (Mississauga, Ontario)** has been named this week's CCHA Defenseman of the Week as announced by the league office. Winnik recorded an assist in last Friday's (2/3) 4-2 win at Western Michigan while posting a plus three efficiency rating in both series contests versus the Broncos this past weekend (2/3-4). Winnik has compiled a career-high five points (0-5-5) in 26 games this season.

➤ **Season Victory Total** – Ferris State's 14 victories to date this season (14-10-6 overall) surpasses the team's win total from all of last season (13-22-4 overall).

➤ **Century Mark Club's Newest Member** – Senior center-right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** became the 34th player in Ferris State history to register 100 career points with a pair of goals in last Saturday's (2/4) 7-2 win over Western Michigan. Rallo has currently totaled 101 career points in 142 outings, which ranks 33rd on the school's all-time scoring list. The FSU assistant captain's team-leading 32 points in 30 games this season marks a career best, bettering his 29 points in 41 contests for the 2002-03 campaign.

➤ **Close Encounters** – 12 of Ferris State's last 15 contests have been decided by two goals or less as the Bulldogs are 6-4-2 (.583) in those contests. Four of the last nine have been determined by a single goal.

➤ **Season Improvement** – Ten Ferris State skaters have exceeded their season points total from the 2004-05 season. **Greg Rallo (32-22)** and junior left wing **Eric Vesely (13-3)** both lead the way with 10 more points than in the 2004-05 campaign.

➤ **Latest Pairwise Rankings** – The Bulldogs are presently listed 13th in the latest 2005-06 *U.S. College Hockey Online* Pairwise Rankings (PWR). Wisconsin and Minnesota are both tied for first-place honors. The Pairwise Ranking is a system which attempts to mimic the method used by the NCAA Selection Committee to determine participants for the NCAA Division I men's hockey tournament. Sixteen teams are selected to participate in the NCAA-I men's ice hockey tourney. FSU made its first and only appearance in the 2002-03 season and advanced to the West Regional's championship game.

➤ **Shooting Display** – The Bulldogs have outshot their opponents in six of the last seven contests and are averaging 35.7 shots on goal (250 total) to the opposition's 26.4 shots per game (185 total) during that seven-game span. Ferris sports a 4-2-1 record in those seven encounters.

➤ **20 Points Or More** – Ferris currently has four individuals with at least 20 points this season – Greg Rallo (15-17-32), junior left wing **Mark Bomersback (12-13-35)**, freshman center **Dan Riedel (8-15-23)**, and junior right wing **Zac Pearson (4-18-22)**. The four have combined to generate 41.9% (102-243) of the squad's points production and 41.1% (39-95) of the team's goal-scoring output.

➤ **A Numbers Comparison** – Freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almont, Ontario)** has posted a 6-4-1 record with a 2.45 goals-against average (27 goals allowed) and a .915 save percentage (289 saves) in his last 11 appearances. In his previous 12 outings this season, O'Keefe was 5-3-4 with a 2.74 goals-against average (32 goals allowed) and an .898 saves percentage (283 saves). The Bulldogs averaged 3.60 goals (54) in their initial 15 outings this season and are averaging 2.73 goals (41 total) in games 16-30.

➤ **Offensive Explosion** – FSU's seven lamplighters against Western Michigan last Saturday (2/4) is not only a season high, but the most since 10/23/04 when the Bulldogs notched a 7-2 non-league triumph at Bemidji State.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

The Bulldogs claimed a 1-0 win at ND in the most recent outing (2/13/99).
