FERRIS TRAVELS TO OHIO STATE AS REGULAR SEASON DRAWS NEAR A CLOSE

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team take to the road this weekend (Feb. 17-18) as the Bulldogs square off against the Ohio State University Buckeyes in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) two-game series in Columbus, Ohio. The two-game set marks the only regular-season meetings between the two teams for the 2005-06 campaign.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:05 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 8:05 p.m. (EST)/Value City Arena (17,500).

TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2005-06 Ferris State Hockey home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 14-12-6 overall and 9-10-5 in the CCHA after dropping both league games of a home-and-home series against Notre Dame last weekend (Feb. 10-11). Ferris State, which is 6-6-2 in its last 14 outings to date, is among those teams receiving votes in this week's *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)* poll. The Bulldogs are 7-5-2 in away encounters this campaign.

➤ Last season, Ferris State finished 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites for the 2004-05 campaign.

Ohio State is 14-15-4 overall and 10-12-2 in the CCHA following Tuesday's (Feb. 14) 6-3 league loss to nationally-ranked Miami (Ohio) at MU's Goggin Ice Arena in Oxford, Ohio. OSU suffered a 4-2 non-league setback to nationally-ranked Wisconsin last Saturday (Feb. 11) in the Frozen Tundra Hockey Classic at Lambeau Field in Green Bay, Wis. The Buckeyes are 7-6-3 in home outings this season and 3-6-1 in their last 10 encounters to date, which includes a current four-game losing streak.

➤ A season ago, Ohio State compiled a 27-10-4 overall mark with a second-place 21-5-2 CCHA

record. OSU qualified for the NCAA Tournament for the third consecutive season.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 222-261-46 (.463) – (16-25-2 vs. Ohio State – 5-15-0 Away, 11-9-2 Home, 0-1-0 Neutral). **Ohio State** – **John Markell** (Bowling Green State, 1979), 11th season, 214-188-36 (.529) – (22-13-1 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT OHIO STATE: Sophomore forward Tom Fritsche (10-16-26), a 2004-05 CCHA All-Rookie selection, is tops among 12 skaters in double-figure points this season. Junior forward Andrew Schembri (9-11-20) along with sophomore forward Domenic Maiani (5-13-18) and junior forward Mathieu Beaudoin (8-8-16) are also high on the points leaders list as are junior defenseman Sean Collins (7-9-16), a 2004-05 All-CCHA Honorable Mention pick, and senior forward Rod Pelley (7-7-14), a 2004-05 All-CCHA Second-Team honoree. Senior goaltender Dave Caruso (12-14-4, 2.05 GAA, .918sv%) ranks sixth nationally this week in goals-against average and 17th in save percentage. Ohio State is listed fifth among the nation's top scoring defenses (2.12 gpg).

➤ **Better Than Before** – Ferris State's 14 victories to date this season (14-12-6 overall) surpasses the team's win total from all of last season (13-22-4 overall).

➤ **Drought Ends** – Sophomore defenseman **Adam Welch's** (Hastings, Minn.) power-play goal in last Friday's setback at Notre Dame represented his marker since Dec. 11, 2004 when he tallied his lone lamp-lighter of the 2004-05 campaign at Miami (Ohio). The FSU captain's nine points (1-8-9) in 32 games this season marks a career season high, bettering his six points (1-5-6) in 36 games for the 2004-05 campaign.

➤ **Close Encounters** – 13 of Ferris State's last 17 contests have been decided by two goals or less as the Bulldogs are 6-5-2 (.538) in those contests. Five of the last 11 have been determined by a single goal.

➤ **Shooting Display** – The Bulldogs have outshot the opposition in their last six outings to date and are averaging 33.7 shots on goal (202 total) during that span. Ferris is 2-4-0 in those last six contests.

➤ **Climbing The Ladder** – Senior center **Greg Rallo** (Gurnee, Ill.) presently is tied for 32nd place with Andrew Black (57-45-102; 1985-88) among Ferris State's all-time points leaders and is two shy of moving into a tie for 31st place with former FSU All-America defenseman John Gruden (40-64-104; 1990-94). Rallo has totaled 102 career points (44-58-102) in 144 contests to date, which includes a season-high 33 points (15-18-33) in 32 games this season.

➤ **Coming Around** – Sophomore left wing-center **Adam Miller** (Livonia) has recorded five points (2-3-5) in his last four CCHA appearances after producing two points (1-1-2) in his previous 13 league contests this campaign. Miller's 18 points (9-9-18) in 32 outings this season already exceeds his 12 points (2-10-12) in 36 games for the 2004-05 campaign.

➤ **Nearing A Milestone** – Junior right wing **Zac Pearson** (White Lake) is presently three points shy of registering his 50th career point. Pearson has produced 47 career points (13-34-47) in 102 contests, which includes a personal season-best 22 points (4-18-22) in 32 outings this season.

➤ **Scoring Leaders** – Ferris' top three points leaders this season – **Greg Rallo** (15-18-33), junior left wing **Mark Bomersback** (13-13-26), and freshman center **Dan Riedel** (8-16-24) have currently combined for 32.9% (83-252) of the squad's points production and 36.7% (36-98) of the team's goal-scoring output.

➤ **A Did You Know?** – The Bulldogs have allowed 12 less goals this season (92 total goals) in their initial 32 games than compared to 104 total lamp-lighters for the 2004-05 campaign over the same time period.

➤ **King Of The Road** – **Greg Rallo** has posted a team-leading 17 points (7-10-17) in 14 road games this season to date. A season ago in 16 away contests, the assistant captain totaled 11 points (3-8-11).

➤ **Goal Scorers** – Ferris State has three individuals with double-figure goals this campaign – **Greg Rallo** (15), **Mark Bomersback** (13) and junior left wing **Matt Verdone** (13), who have combined to generate 41.8% (41-98) of the Bulldogs' goal scoring.

➤ **Scoring Threat** – **Mark Bomersback** has been one of the Bulldogs' top offensive producers in the last eight contests with seven points (4-3-7) during that span, which includes a two-goal performance vs. Lake Superior State (1/21) and two assists vs. Western Michigan (2/4). Bomersback has tallied at least a point in 17 of his 32 games played in this season and his 26 points (13-13-26) in 32 outings this year represents a career single-season best.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
