FERRIS STATE TANGLES WITH WESTERN MICHIGAN IN HOME-AND-HOME SERIES

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team continues Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) action this weekend (Nov. 11-12) with a home-and-home series against the Western Michigan University Broncos. Ferris hosts WMU this Friday (Nov. 11) in Big Rapids, Mich., before traveling to Kalamazoo, Mich., on Saturday (Nov. 12) to take on the Broncos in the weekend series finale.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is currently 2-2-4 overall and 1-1-4 in the CCHA following a 2-2 overtime tie against nationally sixth-ranked Michigan State Tuesday (Nov. 8) at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids.
● Last season, Ferris State finished 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites for the 2004-05 campaign.

Western Michigan sports a 2-4-0 overall mark with a 2-2-0 ledger in CCHA play to date this season. The Broncos were swept in league action last weekend (Nov. 4-5) by Lake Superior State, 10-0 and 3-1, at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo. The week prior (Oct. 28-29), Western Michigan registered a home league series sweep of then nationally fourth-ranked Ohio State with a pair of victories by scores of 5-1 and 5-4.
● A season ago, Western Michigan posted a 14-21-2 overall record with a 10th-place tying 8-18-2

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 210-251-44 (.459) – (16-21-2 vs. Western Michigan – 10-8-1 Home, 6-13-1 Away, 1-1-0 Neutral). **Western Michigan** – **Jim Culhane** (Western Michigan, 1987), 7th season, 102-117-23 (.469) – (12-10-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN: Junior center Paul Szczechura is currently the Broncos' leading scorer with nine points (1-8-9) in six contests. Senior right wing Brent Walton (3-4-7) and senior left wing Mike Erickson (2-3-5) are also among WMU's top points leaders. Sophomore Daniel Bellissimo (2-3-0, 3.54 GAA, .897sv%) has been the Broncos' primary goaltender this campaign. Walton compiled a team-leading 50 points (21-29-50) in 37 contests a season ago while Szczechura was third in team scoring with 29 points (6-23-29) in 37 games. Senior Scott Foster (0-1-0, 9.00 GAA, .571sv%) and freshman Ryan Mensing (0-0-0, 15.09 GAA, .333sv%) have appeared in one outing apiece.

TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 8

Michigan State 2, at Ferris State 2 OT*

- **Nearing A Milestone** – Senior right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** enters this Friday's contest one point shy of recording his 75th career point. Rallo has 74 career points (30-44-74) in 120 contests to date. He posted a career-high 29 points (15-14-29) in 41 games during his freshman year in 2002-03.
- **His Month** – Junior left wing **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** has a combined 10 points (4-6-10) in November games over the last two seasons. He registered five points (1-4-5) in seven 2003-04 contests and had four points (2-2-4) in six outings a season ago. Bomersback snapped a four-game non-scoring streak with a lamplighter versus Alaska Fairbanks last Saturday.
- **Project Completed** – Ferris State recently completed its "Wall of Champions" lockerroom project, which showcases the Bulldogs' 2002-03 CCHA Championship title along with various regular-season tournament titles won in the program's history, most recently back-to-back (2004-05) Badger Hockey Showdown Championship crowns. The FSU Blueline Club provided financial assistance to the project.
- **On-ice Improvement** – Sophomore defenseman **Jim Jorgensen (Sault Ste. Marie)** has totaled five points (0-5-5) in eight games this season and is midst a two-game point string (0-2-2). In 34 contests a season ago, he compiled six points (2-4-6) in 34 outings.
- **All Tied Up** – Ferris State skated to its second consecutive tie to date with Tuesday's 2-2 overtime deadlock against Michigan State, which represents the Bulldogs' fourth tie in eight games this campaign. The last time FSU participated in as many extra-session contests this early in a season was in 2000-01 when the Bulldogs participated in three consecutive overtime encounters (0-1-2) in their first five games. Ferris State, which competed in eight extra-session games in that particular season, finished the 2000-01 campaign at 13-20-5 overall and 9-15-4 in the CCHA.
- **Top Home Scorer** – Sophomore center **Adam Miller (Livonia)** is presently Ferris State's top points leader at home this season with four points (2-2-4) in as many contests. He has totaled six points (4-2-6) in eight games this season after posting 12 points (2-10-12) in 36 contests for the 2004-05 campaign.
- **Solid Performer In Net** – Freshman goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almont, Ontario)**, who was the CCHA's Rookie of the Week earlier this campaign (10/24), was rated as the eighth-best incoming freshmen goaltender by *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) for the 2005-06 season. O'Keefe is 1-1-2 with a 2.64 goals-against average (11 goals allowed) and a .918 saves percentage (123 saves) in his last four outings after going 1-0-2 mark with a 2.21 goals-against average (seven allowed) and an .889 save percentage (56 saves) in his initial three appearances.
- **Did You Know?** – The Bulldogs have outscored their opponents 10-5 in the first period this season but have been outscored in the second frame by a 10-3 margin.
- **Impressive Frosh Class** – Ferris State's incoming freshmen class for the 2005-06 season is ranked 10th best among the nation's top 15 recruiting classes according to *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) 2005 Recruiting Rankings. Besides O'Keefe, freshman right wing **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** was listed seventh on INCH's Top 20 Incoming Forward Rankings while frosh defenseman **Chris Zarb (Waterford)** landed into 11th place on the top 15 incoming defensemen chart.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

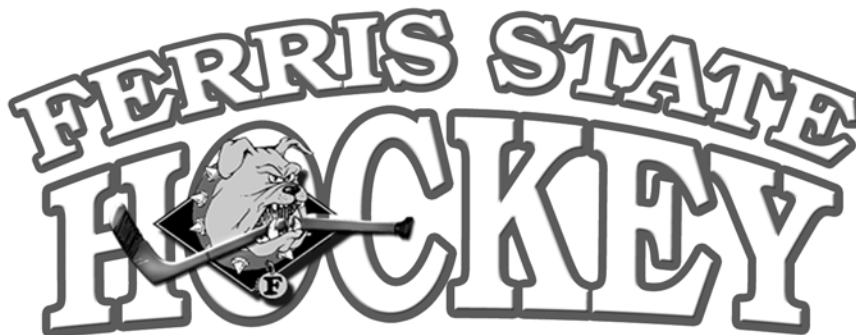
SERIES NOTES

- ◆ Ferris State and Western Michigan will square off for the 104th and 105th times this weekend in a series which dates back to the 1977-78 season. The Broncos have a 62-35-6 lead over the Bulldogs going into this Friday's series opener.
- ◆ **OVERTIME** -- Ferris State has compiled a 2-1-5 record in such contests versus Western Michigan.
- ◆ **THE SITE** -- Ferris State is 21-23-3 at home, 13-35-3 on the road, and 1-4-0 at neutral sites against Western Michigan.
- ◆ **BOB DANIELS vs. WESTERN MICHIGAN** -- 17-25-2 overall (10-9-1 at home, 6-14-1 on the road, and 1-2-0 at neutral sites).

SERIES NOTES – Ferris State is 13-13-1 (.500) against Western Michigan in the last 27 meetings between the two teams. The Bulldogs are 7-4-1 at home, 5-8-0 on the road, and 1-1-0 at neutral sites versus the Broncos during that period.

- ◆ 49 of the 103 meetings have been determined by two goals or less, which includes two of the last five meetings to date. In those 49 games, the Bulldogs have registered an 11-32-6 (.286) overall record – 6-14-3 at home, 5-15-3 on the road, and 0-3-0 at neutral sites.
- ◆ Ferris State is averaging 3.48 goals per game (358 total) in the all-time series while Western Michigan has averaged 4.39 goals an outing (453 total) for a 0.91 goals differential.
- ◆ Ferris State is 24-30-0 (.434) in games decided by three goals or more – 15-9-0 at home and 8-20-0 on the road.
- ◆ The Bulldogs are 11-32-6 (.286) in contests decided by two goals or less – 6-14-3 at home, 5-15-3 on the road, and 0-3-0 at neutral sites.
