FERRIS AND WESTERN MICHIGAN SQUARE OFF IN HOME-AND-HOME SERIES

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team begins the final month of Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) regular-season play this weekend (Feb. 3-4) with a home-and-home series against the Western Michigan University Broncos. Ferris State visits WMU this Friday (Feb. 3) in Kalamazoo, Mich., before hosting the Broncos this Saturday (Feb. 4) in Big Rapids, Mich.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 12-10-6 overall and 7-8-5 in the CCHA after losing twice to nationally-ranked Miami (Ohio) this past weekend (Jan. 27-28) at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids. The Bulldogs are 4-4-2 in their last 10 outings to date. FSU is among teams receiving votes in both of this week's *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* and *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)* polls.

➤ Last season, Ferris State finished 13-22-4 overall with a 10th place-tying 7-17-4 CCHA mark. The Bulldogs were 4-12-2 at home, 8-10-2 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites for the 2004-05 campaign.

Western Michigan was 6-17-4 overall and 6-12-3 in CCHA this season after Tuesday's (Jan. 31) 7-3 league loss to Michigan at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. The Broncos went 1-0-1 this last weekend (Jan. 27-28) in a league series against Northern Michigan at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo. Western skated to a 4-2 win over the Wildcats last Friday (Jan. 27) and then posted a 2-2 overtime tie in Saturday's (Jan. 28) rematch. WMU is 2-4-1 in its last seven contests.

➤ A season ago, Western Michigan posted a 14-21-2 overall record with a 10th-place tying 8-18-2 CCHA mark.

(Michigan State, 1982), 14th season, 220-259-46 (.463) – (19-22-2 vs. Western Michigan – 11-8-1 Home, 7-13-1 Away, 1-1-0 Neutral). **Western Michigan – Jim Culhane** (Western Michigan, 1987), 7th season, 106-130-27 (.454) – (12-12-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN: Senior right wing Brent Walton is currently the Broncos' top points leader this season with 30 points (19-11-30). He totaled a team-best 50 points (21-29-50) in 37 contests a season ago. Junior center Paul Szczechura (6-16-22) and senior left wing Mike Erickson (6-8-14) are among six WMU skaters with double-figure points totals this campaign. Sophomore Daniel Bellissimo (5-16-4, 3.83 GAA, .888sv%) has been the Broncos' primary goaltender this campaign.

GAMES THIS WEEK

TUESDAY, JANUARY 31

♦ **A Season's Comparison** – Ferris State is averaging 3.00 goals an outing (84 total) in 28 games this season after generating an average of 2.89 markers (81 total) during the same span a season ago. The Bulldogs have also allowed 2.89 goals per contest (81 total) this season compared to 3.21 goals (90 total) in the 2004-05 campaign.

♦ **Hobey Baker Candidate** – Senior center-right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** is among 193 players who have advanced to the preliminary voting phase in the 2006 Vote for Hobey. To reach the Preliminary Voting ballot, players must have received nominations from at least 25 fans during Vote for Hobey's Nominating Phase. The Preliminary Voting will run through March 5, giving fans the opportunity to help determine the 10 finalists for the Hobey Baker Award. The fans' tally will be combined with the votes of the 59 Division I head coaches to determine the 10 finalists for the award.

♦ **Better Than Before** – Ferris State's 19 league points in 20 CCHA games this season has surpassed last season's 18 league points total (7-17-4 record).

♦ **Nearing The Century Mark** – **Greg Rallo** is two points shy of registering his 100th career point. Rallo, who has accumulated 98 career points (41-57-98) in 140 contests, needs 22 more points to move into a 23rd-place tie with Dean Cowling (1985-89; 120 career pts.) on the school's all-time scoring leaders list.

♦ **February Performers** – **Greg Rallo** (3-2-5) and sophomore center-left wing **Adam Miller** (0-5-5) are the Bulldogs' top returning points leaders in February outings a season ago. Both skated in six contests during that month as Ferris posted a 2-3-1 record (.417 winning pct.).

♦ **Shooting Gallery** – The Bulldogs are averaging 36.2 shots on goal (181 total) in its last five contests and has outshot the opposition in all but one of those outings.

♦ **Pairwise Rankings** – The Bulldogs are presently tied for ninth place with 19 points in the latest 2005-06 U.S. College Hockey Online Pairwise Rankings (PWR). FSU is tied with Providence, Nebraska-Omaha, and Michigan State. Wisconsin is listed first (30 pts.) followed by Minnesota (29 pts.) and Miami (28 pts.). The Pairwise Ranking is a system which attempts to mimic the method used by the NCAA Selection Committee to determine participants for the NCAA Division I men's hockey tournament. Sixteen teams are selected to participate in the NCAA-I men's ice hockey tourney. FSU made its first and only appearance in the 2002-03 season and advanced to the West Regional's championship game.

♦ **Close Encounters** – 11 of Ferris State's last 13 contests have been decided by two goals or less as the Bulldogs are 5-4-2 (.600) in those contests. Four of the last seven have been determined by a single goal.

♦ **Four Score** – Senior right wing **Nick Scheible's (Big Rapids)** goal versus Miami last Friday (1/27) was his fourth of the season and matched his career single-season high set in his previous two seasons (2003-04 and 2004-05). Scheible tallied four markers in 31 2004-05 outings and scored four lamplighters in 25 2003-04 contests.

♦ **Productive Series** – **Greg Rallo** and freshman center **Dan Riedel (Rochester Hills)** each collected a team-high seven points in a two-game series against Western Michigan earlier this season (11/11-12). Rallo (2-5-7) and Riedel (1-6-7) have combined for 48.3% (14-29) of the team's points output in the series.

♦ **Top Scorers** – FSU's top three points leaders this season – **Greg Rallo** (12-17-29), junior left wing **Mark Bomersack** (12-10-22), and **Dan Riedel** (7-14-21) have combined for 33.5% (72-215) of the squad's scoring.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 14th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2005-06 campaign, Daniels ranked 19th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

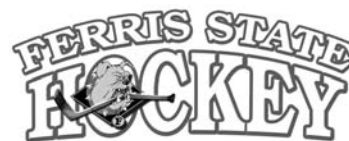

- ◆ Ferris State and Western Michigan will square off for the 106th and 107th times this weekend in a series which dates back to the 1977-78 season. The Broncos have a 62-37-6 lead over the Bulldogs to date.
- ◆ **OVERTIME** -- Ferris State has compiled a 2-1-5 record in such contests versus Western Michigan.
- ◆ **THE SITE** -- Ferris State is 14-35-3 on the road, 22-23-3 at home, and 1-4-0 at neutral sites against Western Michigan.
- ◆ **BOB DANIELS vs. WESTERN MICHIGAN** -- 19-22-2 overall (7-13-1 on the road, 11-8-1 at home, and 1-1-0 at neutral sites).

SERIES NOTES – Ferris State is 15-13-1 (.534) against Western Michigan in the last 29 meetings between the two teams. The Bulldogs are 8-4-1 at home, 6-8-0 on the road, and 1-1-0 at neutral sites versus the Broncos during that period.

- ◆ 50 of the 105 meetings have been determined by two goals or less, which includes three of the last seven meetings to date. In those 50 games, the Bulldogs have registered a 12-32-6 (.300) overall record – 6-14-3 at home, 6-15-3 on the road, and 0-3-0 at neutral sites.
- ◆ Ferris State is averaging 3.51 goals per game (369 total) in the all-time series while Western Michigan has averaged 4.34 goals an outing (456 total) for a 0.83 goals differential.
- ◆ Ferris State is 25-30-0 (.455) in games decided by three goals or more – 16-9-0 at home and 8-20-0 on the road.
- ◆ The Bulldogs are 12-32-6 (.300) in contests decided by two goals or less – 6-14-3 at home, 6-15-3 on the road, and 0-3-0 at neutral sites.
