Logged a season-best 65 minutes between the posts against Nebraska-Omaha (1/14) in a 2-2 overtime tie . . . Selected nation's fifth-best incoming freshman netminder by *Inside College Hockey*.

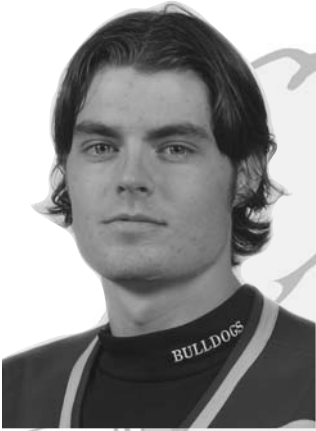
