FERRIS OFF TO ALASKA FAIRBANKS THIS WEEKEND FOR TWO GAMES

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will venture to Fairbanks, Alaska this weekend (Jan. 21-22) for a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series versus the University of Alaska Fairbanks Nanooks. The two-game set represents the only meetings between the teams during the 2004-05 regular-season campaign.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday – 11:05 p.m. (EST)/Carlson Center (4,350).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is presently 9-12-3 overall and 4-9-3 in the CCHA. The Bulldogs went 0-1-1 in a two-game league home series against Nebraska-Omaha last weekend (Jan. 14-15) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs have registered a 5-2-2 mark in their last nine appearances and are 2-2-1 in the last five outings. FSU is 3-6-2 in road contests this campaign.

☛ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

Alaska Fairbanks is 6-11-1 overall with a 5-10-1 CCHA record. The Nanooks, who are midst a five-game losing skid and are 1-8-1 in their last 10 games, were dealt a pair of league losses by nationally-ranked Michigan last weekend (Jan. 14-15) at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. UAF suffered a pair of 5-2 defeats to the Wolverines to extend their road losing string to six straight. The Nanooks are 3-2-1 at home and 3-9-0 on the road this campaign. UAF will play eight of their next 10 contests at home.

☛ A season ago, UAF posted a 16-19-1 overall record and finished sixth in the CCHA standings with a 14-13-1 league mark.

BOB DANIELS: The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering 2004-05, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 146-180-34 (.453) bench mark. He claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the 1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4) and picked up his 200th career win this campaign with a 6-2

home victory over Western Michigan (12/4).

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 204-239-39 (.464) – (19-14-1 vs. Alaska Fairbanks – Away 8-12-1, Home 11-2-0). **Alaska Fairbanks** – **Tavis McMillan** (Alaska Fairbanks, 1994), 1st season, 6-11-1 (.361) – (0-0-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT ALASKA FAIRBANKS: The Nanooks have four players with double-figure points totals led by junior right wing Kelly Czuy (7-11-18) and sophomore center Curtis Fraser (8-6-14). Czuy was a 2003-04 All-CCHA Honorable Mention selection while Fraser earned honorable mention CCHA All-Rookie accolades a season ago. Freshman left wing Kyle Greentree (4-9-13) and frosh center Ryan McLeod (7-4-11) are UAF's other leading point getters. Freshman Wylie Rogers (5-8-1, 2.98 GAA, .903sv%) is the Nanooks' primary goaltender with senior Keith Bartusch (1-3-0, 4.27 GAA, .846sv%) serving as the backup.

BULLDOG BITES: Senior center **Jeff Legue** (11-2-13) and sophomore left wing **Mark Bomersback** (3-7-10) have accounted for 27.4% (23-84) of the Bulldogs' total points production in CCHA play this season. The pair has also generated 38.9% (14-36) of the squad's total goal-scoring output in league action . . . Ferris State skated in its sixth overtime contest with last Friday's 2-2 overtime tie versus Nebraska-Omaha and is 2-1-3 in such outings. The last time FSU competed in as many extra-session affairs was in the 2000-01 campaign when the Bulldogs played in eight 60-minute plus games and recorded a 1-2-5 ledger . . . Senior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)**, who scored his first goal in 27 games last Friday against UNO, is one point shy of tying Keith Sergott (1992-96) for

11th place on FSU's top scoring defense list. York has totaled 71 career points (15-56-71) in 120 contests while Sergott, a CCHA assistant referee, amassed 72 career points (13-59-72) in 148 outings. York's 12 points (1-11-12) in 23 outings this season equals last season's points output (4-8-12) in 27 contests . . . The Bulldogs have outshot their opponents in 12 of the last 14 games and are 6-6-2 this season when outshooting the opposition. FSU is averaging 38.5 shots on net (462 total) during the 12-game period . . . **Mark Bomersback's** 18 points (6-12-18) in 24 appearances this campaign equals his scoring total of a season ago in which he accumulated 18 points (8-10-18) in 37 games . . . **Jeff Legue** is the Bulldogs' top points getter on the road this season with 12 points (9-3-12) in as many away contests. Senior right wing **Derek Nesbitt** (3-6-9) and **Mark Bomersback** (2-7-9) are tied for second place . . . **Jeff Legue** picked up his 77th career assist in last Saturday's encounter and moved past Chris Kunitz (1999-03; 76 career assists) into 16th place among FSU's all-time leaders. Legue is now two helpers away from tying Rob Collins (1998-02) for 15th place . . . Ferris State will be making its sixth consecutive season trek to the Last Frontier this weekend. The last time FSU didn't venture to Alaska was in the 1998-99 campaign . . . **Jeff Legue** has compiled a team-high seven multi-point contests this season while **Derek Nesbitt** has racked up six such game efforts . . . Six of the Bulldogs' last eight outings to date have been decided by two goals or less . . . **Derek Nesbitt** is one assist shy of moving into an 18th-place tie with Tom Rudrud (1979-83; 74 career assists in 141 games) on Ferris' all-time leaders list. Nesbitt has accumulated 73 career assists in 140 contests . . . Ferris State's upperclassmen (seniors and juniors) have accounted for 55.7% (39-70) of the Bulldogs' goals production this season . . . Freshman right wing **Matt Stefanishion (Daysland, Alberta)** has notched a point in three of his last four games and is (1-2-3) in that span . . . Frosh defenseman **Adam Welch's (Hastings, Minn.)** uncle, Russ Welch, was a teammate of Bulldogs' bench boss Bob Daniels at Michigan State. Russ was also Adam's prep hockey coach at Hastings High School.
