### BULLDOGS FINISH CCHA HOMESTAND AGAINST BOWLING GREEN STATE

**THIS WEEK:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team wraps up its four-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) homestand this weekend (Feb. 4-5) as the Bulldogs entertain the Bowling Green State University Falcons in a two-game set at Big Rapids, Mich. The series represents the only regular-season meetings between the two teams during the 2004-05 campaign.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 5:35 p.m. (EST)/Ewigleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

**FSU TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2004-05 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State dropped to 9-16-3 overall and 4-13-3 in the CCHA as a result of suffering a pair of home league setbacks to Miami (Ohio) last weekend (Jan. 28-29). The Bulldogs, who are midst a five-game losing skid, are 4-8-1 at home this season.

➤ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

**Bowling Green State** improved to 12-9-3 overall and 9-7-2 in the CCHA with a home-and-home league series sweep of Notre Dame last weekend (Jan. 28-29). The Falcons notched a 4-1 win last Friday (Jan. 28) at the BGSU Ice Arena in Bowling Green, Ohio and then recorded a 6-2 triumph in Saturday's (Jan. 29) rematch at UND's Joyce Center in Notre Dame, Ind. BGSU is 4-2-0 in its last six outings and sports a 6-4-1 road mark this campaign.

➤ Last season, Bowling Green State registered an 11-18-9 overall record and finished with a ninth-place 9-13-6 CCHA ledger.

**BOB DANIELS:** The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering 2004-05, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 146-184-34 (.448) bench mark. He claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the

1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4) and picked up his 200th career win this campaign with a 6-2 home victory over Western Michigan (12/4).

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 204-243-39 (.459) – (18-14-5 vs. Bowling Green State – Home 10-4-2, Away 8-10-3). **Bowling Green State** – **Scott Paluch** (Bowling Green State, 1991), 3rd season, 31-52-15 (.393) – (0-5-1 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT BOWLING GREEN STATE:** Junior forward Brett Pilkington (3-18–21) leads 11 Falcons with double-digit point totals this season and ranks fifth nationally in assists per game (0.95 avg.) this week. Freshman forward Jonathan Matsumoto (9-11–20), frosh forward Alex Foster (4-16–20), sophomore forward James Unger (7-10–17) and senior forward Ryan Minnabarriet (5-12–17) are other top BGSU points producers. Senior goaltender Jordan Sigalet (12-6-3, 2.58 GAA, .925sv%), a 2003-04 All-CCHA First-Team selection, is sixth among the nation's leaders in save percentage and 18th in winning percentage (.643). The Falcons are listed 13th in nationally in power-play percentage (.205; 35-171).

### GAMES THIS WEEK

Friday, February 4

**BULLDOG BITES:** Sophomore right wing **Zac Pearson (White Lake)** registered his third career short-handed goal against Miami last Saturday and half of his goals this season have been with the Bulldogs playing a man down . . . Senior left wing **Carter Thomson (Milden, Saskatchewan)** tallied his fifth goal of the season in Saturday's contest and is one shy of matching his career-high of six markers set last season in 35 outings. His nine points (5-4-9) equals last season's points total (6-3-9) and is one shy of tying his career-best 10 points (3-7-10) established in 2002-03 . . . Senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** was the Bulldogs' top points leader for February a season ago with seven points (4-3-7) in five contests . . . Senior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ontario)** netted his second consecutive two-assist game with a pair of helpers versus Miami last Friday.

Nesbitt, who picked up two assists at Alaska Fairbanks (1/22), has generated five points (1-4-5) in his last three appearances . . . Ferris State's 4-3 overtime setback to Miami last Friday represented its seventh extra-session affair of this campaign. The Bulldogs are 2-2-3 in those contests to date this season . . . Sophomore left wing **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** has a career-high 12 points (5-7-12) in 28 outings this season compared to six points (1-5-6) in 27 games a season ago . . . **Jeff Legue** has compiled at least a point in 18 of 26 encounters played in this campaign, which includes a team-best tying eight multi-point game performances . . . **Legue** (5-3-8) and **Derek Nesbitt** (2-6-8) were FSU's leading point getters in nine January outings this season . . . **Legue**, who's amassed 139 career points (60-79-139) in 141 contests, is one shy of tying Tim Christian (1991-95) for 13th place on the school's all-time scoring leaders chart. Christian had 140 career points (65-75-140) in 148 outings . . . Senior defenseman **Matt York's (Woodhaven)** 57 career assists in 123 games ranks tied for 10th place on FSU's all-time assists list for defensemen and is one shy of tying Troy Milam's (1999-03) ninth-place 58 helpers total.

**YORK TO BE FEATURED ON FSN:** **Matt York** will be featured in the February edition of Fox Sports Net's college sports magazine program *NCAA On Campus*, which is a monthly, 30-minute show highlighting NCAA student-athletes and competitions throughout the country. The York feature is scheduled to air Monday, Feb. 14, at 3 p.m. (EST) and will re-air on Wednesday, Feb. 16, at 1 p.m. (EST) on FSN Detroit. York graduated from Ferris State last May and is now working towards a master's degree in criminal justice at FSU. He spent this last summer as a member of Ludington's (Mich.) Police Department while receiving his certification. York comes from a family involved in law enforcement as his father (Mike York) and older brother (Mike Jr.) are both police officers.
