FERRIS STATE BATTLES CONNECTICUT AT HOME THIS WEEKEND

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team hosts the University of Connecticut Huskies this weekend (Nov. 12-13) in a two-game non-league set at Big Rapids, Mich. UConn will be making its first-ever appearances on the Bulldogs' home ice.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) and Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is currently 2-8-0 overall and 1-5-0 in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) after suffering a pair of setbacks to Michigan State last weekend (Nov. 5-6) in a league home-and-home series. A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

Connecticut dropped to 1-5-1 overall and is 0-1-0 in the Atlantic Hockey Association (AHA) after suffering a 6-3 league setback to Mercyhurst last Saturday (Nov. 6) at UConn's Mark Freitas Ice Forum in Storrs, Conn. The Huskies lost a 5-2 non-league decision to Northeastern last Friday (Nov. 5) at NU's Matthews Arena in Boston, Mass. UConn, which is 1-4-0 on the road this season, is 1-4-0 in its last five appearances and is midst a current three-game losing streak. The Huskies compiled a 12-16-7 overall record last season, which included a fifth-place 9-10-5 mark in the AHA.

BOB DANIELS: The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering the 2004-05 season, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 143-176-31 (.453) bench mark.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 197-235-36 (.459) – (1-0-0 vs. Connecticut – Home 0-0-0, Away 1-0-0, Neutral 0-0-0). **Connecticut** – **Bruce Marshall** (Connecticut, 1985), 17th season, 235-203-46 (.533) – (0-1-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT CONNECTICUT: The Huskies are led in scoring by sophomore forward Cole Koidahl (2-4-6) along with senior forward Tim Olsen (4-1-5) and sophomore forward J.R. Corkery (1-4-5). Sophomore forward Matt Scherer (3-1-4) and freshman forward Mike Neilon (2-1-3) are also among the team's leading points producers. Freshman Brad Smith (1-4-1, 3.73 GAA, .905sv%) is UConn's primary goaltender with sophomore Scott Tomes (0-1-0, 3.32 GAA, .884sv%) serving in a backup capacity. The Huskies have been outscored 28-14 and are averaging 2.0 goals an outing (14 total) this season. UConn is operating at 12.7% (7-55) efficiency in its power play chances and 76.7% (33-43) in penalty killing.

BULLDOG BITES: Senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** is two points shy of tying Dean Cowling (1985-89) for 21st place on FSU's all-time scoring leaders. Legue has amassed 118 career points (46-72-118) in 123 career outings while Cowling posted 120 points (51-69-120) in 154 games. Legue's 72 career assists total is two away from tying Tom Rudrud (1979-83; 74 assists) for 17th place among Ferris' career leaders . . . Head coach **Bob Daniels** is three wins shy of posting his 200th career victory . . . A season ago, senior left wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ontario)**

registered eight points (3-5-8) in seven November contests which was second best on the squad . . . Freshman right wing Matt Stefanishion (**Daysland, Alberta**) has compiled a team-leading six points (3-3-6) in four non-league encounters this campaign while senior left wing **Carter Thomson (Milden, Saskatchewan)** and sophomore center **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** have five points apiece - Thomson (3-2-5) and Bomersback (1-4-5). All three have a current four-game non-league point string with Stefanishion producing a pair of multiple-point outings - 1-1-2 vs. Colgate (10/8) and 1-1-2 at Bemidji State (10/23) . . . The Bulldogs are 51-36-6 (.581) versus non-league competition dating back to 1990, which includes a 26-6-3 (.786) mark in home contests . . . Senior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)**, the school's all-time winningest netminder with a 57-49-4 career record, is 79 saves away from tying Rob Hughston (1981-85; 3,044 career saves) as Ferris' all-time saves leader. Brown has 2,965 career saves in 112 career appearances to date . . . Connecticut is the lone American Hockey Association representative which Ferris State has ever skated against. The AHA is comprised of eight other member schools - American International, Army, Bentley, Canisius, Holy Cross, Mercyhurst, Quinnipiac and Sacred Heart . . . Senior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** is two penalty minutes shy of moving into a tie as FSU's all-time penalty minutes leader with Tim Corkery (1986-90). York has 343 career penalty minutes on 134 penalties in 107 games and Corkery had 345 career minutes on 156 penalties in 135 career games . . . Junior right wing **Greg Rallo (Gurnee, Ill.)** returned to the lineup in last Saturday's Michigan State contest after being sidelined the previous six due to an aggravated injury suffered this summer. Rallo, who has 47 career points (22-25-47) in 83 outings, is three points away from garnering his 50th career point
