FERRIS STATE FACES NEBRASKA-OMAHA IN LEAGUE SERIES THIS WEEK

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will entertain the nationally-ranked University of Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks this weekend, Jan. 14-15, in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series at Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewigleben Ice Arena (pronounced A-VAH-glave-in) (2,493).

FSU TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2004-05 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State, which is currently 5-1-1 in its last seven outings, has a 9-11-2 overall mark and is 4-8-2 in the CCHA to date. FSU is coming off a league series split against nationally-ranked Ohio State last weekend (Jan. 7-8) at OSU's Value City Arena in Columbus, Ohio.

➤ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

➤ Nebraska-Omaha improved to 10-9-1 overall and 8-7-1 in the CCHA with a pair of 3-1 league home victories over Northern Michigan last weekend (Jan. 7-8) at Qwest Center Omaha in Omaha, Neb. The Mavericks, who are ranked 18th in this week's *Inside College Hockey.com* poll, are 4-5-1 in their last 10 outings and 3-2-0 in the past five. UNO presently sports a 1-7-0 road ledger and is 9-2-1 at home this season.

➤ A season ago, Nebraska-Omaha compiled an 8-26-5 overall record which included a 12th-place 5-19-4 CCHA mark.

BOB DANIELS: The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering 2004-05, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 146-179-33 (.454) bench mark. He claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the 1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4) and picked

up his 200th career win this campaign with a 6-2 home victory over Western Michigan (12/4).

THE COACHES: Ferris State – Bob Daniels (Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 204-238-38 (.465) – (5-8-1 vs. Nebraska-Omaha – Home 3-4-1, Away 2-4-0). Nebraska-Omaha – Mike Kemp (Gustavus Adolphus, 1975), 8th season, 115-149-28 (.442) – (8-5-1 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT NEBRASKA OMAHA: The Mavericks have eight skaters with double-figure points led by freshman forward Bill Thomas (9-17-26) and sophomore forward Scott Parse (10-14-24), a 2003-04 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention selection. Thomas currently ranks tied for 13th nationally in points per game (1.30 avg.) and is 16th in assists (0.85 avg.). Thomas is also fourth among the CCHA's overall scoring leaders while Parse is listed in a fifth-place tie. Fresh forward Bryan Marshall (6-12-18) and sophomore defenseman Dan Knapp (3-11-14) are other top points producers. Sophomore Chris Holt (10-8-1, 2.73 GAA, .904sv%) is UNO's primary goaltender and is backed up by freshman Eric Aarnio (0-1-0, 6.02 GAA, .800sv%). The Mavericks are tied for 13th place nationally in scoring offense (3.30 avg.) this week.

BULLDOG BITES: Ferris State is 7-3-2 in its last 12 contests and 5-1-1 in its last seven outings to date. In the 12-game span, the Bulldogs have outshot the opposition by 129 shots (445-316) and outscored their opponents by 11 goals (43-32). FSU is operating at 12.5% (9-72) efficiency on power plays and 86.3% (63-73) on the penalty kill. . . Freshman goaltender **Derek MacIntyre (Stanwood)** is 2-0-0 with a 1.46 goals against average and a .956 saves percentage (65 total saves) in 123:01 minutes of playing time over his last two appearances. In his first six appearances, MacIntyre was 1-3-0 with a 3.82 goals against average (16 goals allowed) and an .875 saves percentage (112 total saves) in 251:14. . . Senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** is the Bulldogs' leading scorer at home this season with eight points (5-3-8) in seven outings. Senior right wing **Derek Nesbitt (4-3-7)** and sophomore left wing **Mark Bomersback (3-4-7)** are both tied for second place and have skated in nine games apiece. . .

Sophomore center **Tim Vokey (Mississauga, Ontario)** recorded his first career multi-point game with 1-1-2 against Ohio State last Saturday (Jan. 8). Vokey has established career highs in points (eight), goals (five) and assists (three) in 22 games this campaign. He totaled a combined 2-0-2 in 21 games played over the past two seasons. . . Junior defenseman **Andrew Winnik (Mississauga, Ontario)** scored in overtime at Ohio State in his career game-winning lamplighter. He has a goal in each of the past two series and is a point away from matching his career best set in each of his previous two seasons (1-2-3 in 2002-03 and 0-3-3 in 2003-04). . . Ferris State snapped a 10-game series losing streak at Columbus, Ohio with last Saturday's 3-2 overtime triumph over the Buckeyes. The last FSU win on OSU's ice was 11/18/95 with a 3-2 victory. . . The extra-session win also halted the Buckeyes' 13-game winning string at Value City Arena that included an 8-0-0 home ledger this season. . . **Jeff Legue** has seven more points (15-6-21) in Ferris' initial 22 contests this campaign compared to 14 points (5-9-14) in the same period a season ago. Legue skated in all 22 outings a season ago and has been involved in 20 games this campaign to date. . . Starting with this weekend's home series (1/14-15) against Nebraska-Omaha, the Bulldogs will play six of their next eight CCHA contests at home. . . Junior right wing **Nick Scheible's (Big Rapids)** seven points (4-3-7) in 19 games this season represents a career high, bettering his six points (4-2-6) in 25 outings a campaign ago. . . Senior left wing **Carter Thomson (Milden, Saskatchewan)** is two points shy of matching his career-best 10 points (3-7-10) set in 2002-03 over a 35-game span. Thomson has compiled eight points (4-4-8) in 19 appearances this season. . . Senior defenseman **Matt York (Woodhaven)** is one assist shy of tying Jim Dube (1997-01) for 10th place among FSU's all-time defensemen assists leaders. York has currently amassed 56 career helpers in 118 contests. . . **Jeff Legue (10-15-25), Derek Nesbitt (6-13-19) and Matt York (1-12-13)** are Ferris' leading points getters in January contests. Both Legue and Nesbitt have played in 27 career January outings while York has skated in 21 games. Legue notched 12 points (5-7-12) in nine 2002-03 January encounters. . . FSU's top three scorers - Legue (15-6-21), Nesbitt (8-10-18) and Bomersback (5-11-16) have

generated 34.4% (55-160) of the squad's points production and 41.8% (28-67) of the Bulldogs' goal-scoring output this campaign.
