FERRIS STATE SQUARES OFF AGAINST WESTERN MICHIGAN THIS WEEK

THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team returns to the ice this weekend (Dec. 3-4) after being idle last week as the Bulldogs square off against the Western Michigan University Broncos in a home-and-home Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series. Ferris State visits WMU this Friday in Kalamazoo, Mich., before hosting the Broncos Saturday in Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Harry W. Lawson Ice Arena (3,667) ; Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/R.L. Ewigleben (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

FSU TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for all 2004-05 FSU home games are available by contacting the Ewigleben Arena Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

THE RECORDS: Ferris State, which was idle last weekend, is currently 4-9-1 overall and 1-6-1 in the CCHA. The Bulldogs are 2-1-1 in their last four outings.

➤ A season ago, FSU was 15-20-3 overall with a 10th-place 10-17-1 mark in the CCHA. The Bulldogs were 10-6-2 at home, 4-14-1 on the road and 1-0-0 at neutral sites in 2003-04.

Western Michigan improved to 7-6-1 overall and is 3-6-1 in the CCHA to date. The Broncos swept a non-league home series against Alabama-Huntsville last weekend (Nov. 27-28), winning 5-1 and 3-1 at Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich. WMU, which has won three of its last four contests, is 6-3-1 at home and 1-3-0 on the road.

➤ A season ago, Western Michigan registered a 17-18-4 overall record with an eighth-place 12-13-3 CCHA mark.

BOB DANIELS: The Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the 2002-03 American Hockey Coaches Association's (AHCA) Division I National Coach of the Year, Daniels was also honored in 2002-03 as the Coach of the Year by the CCHA and *Inside College Hockey (INCH)*. Daniels, who ranked 20th among active NCAA-I coaches in overall victories entering the 2004-05 season, is FSU's all-time winningest coach. Daniels is also tops among Ferris' all-time coaches in CCHA victories with a 143-177-32 (.452) bench mark. He claimed his school-record 120th career victory at Western Michigan with a 7-0 triumph in the

1999-00 regular-season finale (3/4).

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels**

(Michigan State, 1982), 13th season, 199-236-37 (.461) – (15-20-2 vs. Western Michigan – Away 5-12-1, Home 9-7-1, Neutral 1-1-0). **Western Michigan** – **Jim Culhane** (Western Michigan, 1987), 6th season, 93-98-22 (.488) – (10-8-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN: The Broncos have five skaters with double-digit point totals, led by junior right wing Brent Walton (10-12-22) and junior center Vince Bellissimo (7-7-14). Walton presently leads the CCHA in scoring both overall and in the league (7-8-15). Senior right wing Pat Dwyer (4-9-13), sophomore center Paul Szczechura (2-11-13), a 2003-04 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention selection, and junior right wing Mike Erickson (6-6-12) are other leading WMU points leaders. Freshman Daniel Bellissimo (7-5-1, 2.71 GAA, .917sv%) is the Broncos' top goaltender while junior Eric Marvin (0-1-0, 4.15 GAA, .855sv%) has served in a reserve capacity.

GAMES THIS WEEK

BULLDOG BITES: Senior goaltender **Mike Brown (Calgary, Alberta)** is 24 saves away from becoming the school's all-time saves leader and would surpass Rob Hughston (1981-85; 3,044 career saves) for the top honor. Brown has amassed a 3,021 career saves total in 115 contests. Brown was 3-0-1 with a 2.21 goals against average and a .929 saves percentage in four December outings last season . . . Head coach **Bob Daniels**, the Bulldogs' all-time winningest coach, is one win shy of garnering his 200th career victory at FSU . . . Sophomore defenseman **Joe Van Culin (Monticello, Minn.)** has compiled all of his career season-best five points (1-4-5) this season in eight home games . . .

Senior center **Jeff Legue (Cornwall, Ontario)** has netted 50 career goals in 127 contests to tie for 18th place among Ferris' all-time goal-scoring leaders. Tom Rudrud (1979-83) and Ed Turner (1976-80) each tallied 50 career markers in 141 and 84 outings, respectively. Legue, who scored three of the Bulldogs' six goals at Lake Superior State (11/19-20), has a six-game point string with 6-3-9 during that span . . . Sophomore right wing **Zac Pearson (White Lake)** has totaled three points (2-1-3) in his last four contests after notching the same total (2-1-3) in his previous 10 outings . . . The Bulldogs' 41 goals this campaign in their initial 14 contests is one shy of last season's output in the first 14-game period. FSU has 94 points this season compared to last season's 104 total points. Ferris has tallied 14 power-play goals in 2004-05 after garnering nine at this point a season ago . . . Sophomore center **Tim Vokey (Mississauga, Ontario)**, who has three points (2-1-3) in his last four appearances, posted his career-high fourth goal of the year at Lake Superior State (11/20). Vokey has four goals in 14 encounters this campaign after scoring two goals in 21 outings combined over the previous two seasons (2002-03 and 2003-04), which includes a campaign in which he redshirted due to injury . . . Senior right wing **Derek Nesbitt (Egmondville, Ontario)** is one assist away from tying Kevin Swider (1997-01) for 21st place on Ferris' career leaders chart. Nesbitt has produced 67 career helpers in 130 games while Swider notched 68 assists in 148 career contests . . . December was FSU's best month last season as the Bulldogs went 3-0-1 (.875) which included winning the Badger Hockey Showdown championship . . . **Jeff Legue** (7-5-12) and sophomore left wing-center **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)**, with 3-7-10, have combined for 23.4% (23-94) of Ferris' total points production this season . . . FSU has outshot its opposition in its last four games by an average margin of 13.3 shots (155-102).

NEXT OPPONENT: Ferris State continues CCHA play next weekend, Dec. 10-11, as the Bulldogs tangle with the Miami (Ohio) RedHawks at MU's Goggin Ice Arena in Oxford, Ohio.
