LESA BICKLEY

Lesa Bickley begins her second season in 2004 as an assistant coach on the Ferris State Softball staff and works primarily with the Bulldogs' pitching corps.

Last season, she along with fellow assistant Chad Haberland served as interim co-head coaches as a result of head coach Keri Becker being called to active military service prior to the start of the 2003 softball campaign. A volunteer assistant for Ferris in the 2002 campaign, Bickley is certainly no stranger to the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) after having served as head coach at the University of Findlay (Ohio) for three seasons (1998-00). While at UF, Bickley compiled a 64-64-1 coaching record and guided the Oilers to a 21-16-0 overall record in her final year. In 1999, she coached Findlay to the NAIA Independent Great Lakes

Regional sectional tournament title as the Oilers made a regional tourney appearance.

Prior to Findlay, Bickley was head softball coach at New Riegel (Ohio) High School (1995-97) where her teams won three sectional championships along with a district and regional title in 1996.

A four-year letterwinner in softball at Ashland (Ohio) University, Bickley earned All-Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) honors and was the conference's pitcher of the year as a junior. She also was a two-time all-region selection and was recognized as an Academic All-American. Bickley, who graduated from Ashland in 1991 with a bachelor's degree in education, is currently working towards completing her Masters of Education degree.

CHAD HABERLAND

The 2004 softball campaign represents the return of assistant coach Chad Haberland for the second consecutive season after a two-year (2001-02) absence.

A season ago, Haberland along with fellow assistant Lesa Bickley served as interim co-head coaches as a result of head coach Keri Becker being called to active military service prior to the start of the 2003 softball campaign.



Haberland, who spent two seasons (1999-00) as an assistant under Becker and one season (1998) as a volunteer, will continue instructing the position players. In 1999, he helped guide Ferris State to its second straight NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional title after winning the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Tournament. As a result, the Bulldogs made their second consecutive NCAA-II National Championship Tourney appearance.

Before Ferris, Haberland spent three seasons (1996-98) as an assistant varsity softball coach at Midland (Mich.) Bullock Creek High School. From 1988-95, he was an assistant varsity softball coach at Sanford (Mich.)-Meridian High. During his tenure at SMHS, Haberland helped the Mustangs to four Jackpine Conference titles, one district and one regional championship. Haberland has participated in four softball national championships as a player. In 1998, he traveled to Nashville, Tenn., to participate in the Class E Slowpitch National Championships. For three straight years (1992-94), Haberland played in the Class A Modified National Championships. A 1986 graduate of Sanford-Meridian High School, Haberland was a two-time all-conference selection in baseball, basketball and football. He set a school record for batting average as a senior and was named the team's Most Valuable Player.
