2005-06 Ferris State Record: 18-13, 13-5 GLIAC

The Bulldogs advanced to the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional Tournament for the second-straight year in 2005-06

BULLDOG BITES

✓**FSU BASKETBALL AT A GLANCE:** The Ferris State men's basketball team will take part in the 25th annual John L. Griffin/Lions Club Classic hosted by Northern Kentucky University this Friday and Saturday, Nov. 17-18, in Highland Heights, Ky. FSU squares off against the host Norse in Friday's (Nov. 17) 7:45 p.m. (EST) contest before taking on Christian Brothers (Tenn.) Saturday (Nov. 18) starting at 5:30 p.m. (EST).

✓**MEDIA COVERAGE:** There will be no Ferris radio or internet broadcast coverage available for either contest. The game against Northern Kentucky can be heard live through NKU's athletics website at www.nku.edu/~athletics. "Live Stats" will also be offered at the site for both of FSU's games.

✓**ABOUT FERRIS STATE:** Ferris State University is a NCAA Division II school located in Big Rapids, Mich., with an enrollment of 12,578. The Bulldogs are a member of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC). Big Rapids is located in West Michigan approximately 60 miles north of Grand Rapids or 40 miles west of Mount Pleasant, Mich.

✓**FSU DROPS EXHIBITION OPENER:** Ferris State dropped a 97-71 decision to NCAA Division I Toledo (Ohio) in its exhibition opener last Tuesday (Nov. 8) inside UT's Savage Hall at Toledo, Ohio. The host Rockets, who were the preseason pick to win the Mid-American Conference (MAC) West Division this campaign, shot 62.7% (37-59) from the floor and held FSU to a three-of-22 (13.6%) performance from three-point range. Senior forward **Terrance Shaw (Saginaw/Bridgeport)** tallied a game-high 27 points for the Bulldogs while senior forward **Michael Daniels (Detroit/Murray-Wright)** netted 14 points and a game-best 13 rebounds. Four different FSU players saw action for the first time in a Bulldog uniform.

✓**FERRIS FALLS IN DETROIT:** Ferris closed out the exhibition portion of its schedule with a 68-53 setback at the University of Detroit Mercy last Friday (Nov. 10). The contest against the NCAA Division I Titans took place in U of D's Calihan Hall at Detroit, Mich. The host Titans took a 40-20 half-time edge and held on for the victory despite being outscored by the Bulldogs 33-28 in the final frame. **Terrance Shaw** led the Bulldog lineup with 16 points, seven rebounds and three steals. **Michael Daniels** netted 13 points, four boards and four blocked shots.

✓**LAST CAMPAIGN:** Ferris State posted an 18-13 overall mark en route to making its second consecutive NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament berth during the 2005-06 campaign. FSU posted a second-place 13-5 mark in GLIAC North Division regular-season action after claiming back-to-back league crowns in 2003-04 and 2004-05. Ferris also received GLIAC Tournament runner-up accolades last season.

✓**TWO YEARS AGO:** Ferris State capped off a banner 2004-05 season with

a runner-up finish in the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament (March 12-15) held in Findlay, Ohio. FSU reached the regional championship game for only the third time in school history. The Bulldogs, who won their second-straight GLIAC North Division Championship in 2004-05, concluded the year with a 24-7 overall record and fell one game shy of advancing to the NCAA-II Elite Eight for the second time ever. FSU's 24 victories represented the third-most wins in school history.

✓**HEAD COACH BILL SALL:** A 1994 Calvin graduate, fifth-year FSU head coach **Bill Sall** previously held assistant coaching positions at Calvin (1992-95), Ferris State (1995-98) and Hillsdale (1998-02) prior to being named Ferris State's 11th head coach. The Zeeland, Mich., native served as Ferris' interim head coach for a portion of the 1995-96 campaign and led the Bulldogs to a 5-8 mark. Before joining the coaching ranks, Sall was a standout player at Calvin from 1985-90. He twice (1989-90) received second-team National Association of Basketball Coaches Division III All-America honors and led Calvin to three Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAA) championships, four NCAA-III Tournament bids and the 1990 NCAA-III Final Four. Sall has a current 72-57 (.558) career mark.

✓**THE BULLDOG TRADITION:** The 2006-07 campaign marks the 79th season of Bulldog men's basketball. The program began in 1925 although Ferris did not field a team from 1942-45 due to World War II. FSU has compiled a 934-856 (.522) all-time mark. The Bulldogs have won 11 GLIAC titles, made eight NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and reached the 1988 NCAA-II Elite Eight. Ferris, which captured a league-record four consecutive GLIAC titles from 1986-90, notched its 900th all-time win in the 2004-05 campaign with a 110-104 overtime triumph over Indianapolis (12/21/04) in the Lions Club Holiday Classic at Jim Wink Arena in Big Rapids, Mich.

✓**SUCCESS UNDER SALL:** The Bulldogs had posted only a 21-82 (.204) mark in the four seasons prior to head coach **Bill Sall's** arrival, but have since went 67-49 (.578) and claimed two divisional titles while making two NCAA-II Tournament appearances in his four seasons at the helm. FSU won only four games (4-22) the year before Sall arrived in 2001-02.

✓**BACK IN THE MIX:** Ferris returns three starters and six letterwinners from last campaign. The Bulldogs, who played only eight players the majority of last season, lost three seniors from last year's squad.

✓**LEADING THE TROOPS:** Among the returnees for Ferris this season is **Terrance Shaw**, who received All-GLIAC Second Team accolades a year ago. He had a personal career-high 25 points and 14 rebounds in FSU's 74-69 NCAA-II Tournament loss at nationally second-ranked Saint Joseph's (Ind.) last March (3/11). The 6-5 Shaw averaged 13 points and a team-best 6.8 rebounds per outing in 2005-06. Shaw along with **Michael Daniels** and senior guard **Julius Vines (Muskegon Heights)** will serve as team captains this year.

✓**THE BULLDOG ROSTER:** Ferris' 2006-07 roster includes three seniors, four juniors, two sophomores and six freshmen. Eight of the 15 players are guards while the remaining seven are frontcourt players. All 15 players on the Bulldogs' 2006-07 roster hail from Michigan.

MORE BULLDOG NOTES

✓**FSU COACHING STAFF:** FSU head coach **Bill Sall** returns all four of his assistant coaches from a year ago, including top assistant coach **Cory Anderson**. Anderson, who played for Ferris from 1996-98, is in his eighth season as a full-time assistant coach. Volunteer Assistant Coach **Bill Killian** also returns for his fifth season on Sall's staff while **Jim Lake** is in his fourth season as a volunteer assistant. Longtime West Michigan high school coach **Dave Schlump**, who formerly coached at Cedar Springs (Mich.), will be in his third campaign as a volunteer assistant for the Bulldogs.

✓**IMPRESSIVE HISTORY:** Ferris State's impressive basketball tradition includes 11 GLIAC titles, eight NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and a berth in the 1988 NCAA-II Elite Eight. Ferris, which last won the GLIAC Tournament championship during the 1997-98 campaign, captured a league record four consecutive conference titles from 1986-90. FSU has won more GLIAC Championships (11) than any other league member.

✓**KEEP ON WINNING:** Ferris' 18 victories last year were the program's third-most in the last 16 seasons. FSU's most during the stretch was 24 wins (24-7) in 2004-05 while the 1997-98 squad posted a 21-12 overall record. Last campaign marked the third-straight season the Bulldogs had recorded a .500 record or better as Ferris was 14-14 overall in 2003-04.

✓**SEASON OPENERS:** Ferris State will officially open its 79th season against Northern Kentucky in the John L. Griffin Lions Club Classic. The Bulldogs, who have won four of their last 10 season openers, currently hold a 40-38 all-time record in opening day contests. Last season (11/15/05), Ferris dropped a 103-85 decision at Saint Joseph's (Ind.). In 2000-01, FSU toppled NCAA-I Oakland (11/21/00) 75-70 on opening day at Rochester, Mich. The win over Oakland represented Ferris' first opening day road victory since the 1987-88 campaign.

✓**LEAGUE OPENER:** Ferris State's 2006-07 GLIAC opener is set for Thursday, Nov. 30, versus Northwood beginning at 8 p.m. (EST) in NU's Bennett Sports Center at Midland, Mich.

✓**BACK ON TOP:** Last season represented the third-straight year the Bulldogs finished either first or second in the GLIAC North Division. Ferris claimed back-to-back divisional titles in 2003-04 and 2004-05 with 14-4 and 13-5 conference marks, respectively. FSU's 13-5 league ledger last season trailed only rival Grand Valley State's first place 16-2 division record. Ferris had not won a GLIAC Championship since 1994-95 prior to its first title run in 2003-04 under head coach **Bill Sall**.

✓**BULLDOG BITES:** Ferris State has posted 38 winning campaigns and 43 non-losing seasons in its previous 78 seasons FSU will play 12 home games this campaign inside Jim Wink Arena Ferris' 2006-07 home opener will be against nationally-ranked Southern Illinois-Edwardsville Saturday, Nov. 25, with tipoff set for 3 p.m. (EST) in Wink Arena.

✓**FSU ROSTER NOTES:** The Bulldogs have four players on their roster from Muskegon Heights High School where former Bulldog guard Keith Guy (1995-97) serves as head coach FSU also has four other players from the Lansing or East Lansing areas in Michigan Among the nine newcomers to the roster this season are three transfers, including a NCAA Division I transfer in junior forward **Jason Holder (Saginaw/Arthur Hill)** from Cleveland State.

✓**FERRIS PICKED SECOND:** Ferris State was picked to finish second in the 2006-07 GLIAC Men's Basketball Coaches Preseason North Division Poll. The Bulldogs totaled 27 points but had no first-place votes in the balloting, which was conducted by the conference's head coaches. Defending GLIAC North Division Champion Grand Valley State was selected as this year's divisional favorite as the Lakers recorded 36 points along with six of a possible seven first-place votes. Findlay took the top spot in the South Division with 25 points and five first-place votes. The league's 13 head coaches voted for the division in which they play.

JOHN L. GRIFFIN/LIONS CLUB CLASSIC NOTEBOOK

✓**SCOUTING NORTHERN KENTUCKY:** The Norse maintain a 4-0 series edge and beat the Bulldogs 85-65 in the last meeting (12/28/02) at the Hillsdale Rotary Christmas Classic in Hillsdale, Mich. FSU last took part in the John L. Griffin/Lions Club Classic during the 2001-02 campaign and suffered a 79-71 setback (11/16/01) to the Norse at Highland Heights, Ky. NKU posted a 17-11 overall record during the 2005-06 campaign and dropped exhibition games to NCAA Division I opponents Cincinnati (87-41) and Xavier (58-44) during preseason action. The Norse are guided by third-year head coach Dave Bezold, who owns a 31-26 overall record during his two previous seasons at the helm. Northern Kentucky was the preseason favorite to claim the Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) East Division title this campaign. NKU returns three starters and eight letterwinners from last year's team, which compiled a 12-7 overall league record. Senior swingman Kevin Schappell averaged 11.2 points per game last season and is NKU's top returner. A trio of Division I transfers are also expected to make impacts in 2006-07.

✓**SCOUTING CHRISTIAN BROTHERS:** Ferris will square off against Christian Brothers for the second time ever. The Bucs previously recorded an 87-79 triumph over FSU in the 2001 John L. Griffin/Lions Club Classic at Highland Heights. Christian Brothers, which opens its season with a non-league home contest versus Lynn (Fla.) Wednesday (Nov. 15), also dropped two exhibition outings against NCAA-I schools. CBU fell at Ohio 72-63 (Nov. 4) and lost to Memphis 78-47 (Nov. 6) at the FedEx Forum in Memphis, Tenn. The Bucs will take on GLIAC-member Wayne State in Friday's opening game of the John L. Griffin/Lions Club Classic. Christian Brothers was picked to finish fourth in the Gulf South Conference West Division Preseason Coaches Poll. The Bucs return four starters and eight lettermen from a team that finished fifth in the GSC West last season with a 15-13 overall record. Mike Nienaber is in his eighth season as CBU's head coach.

✓**CLASSIC NOTES:** Ferris will be taking part in the John L. Griffin/Lions Club Classic for only the second time ever after falling to both NKU and Christian Brothers in the 2001-02 season This will be Christian Brothers' fifth appearance in the last six years of the event, including its fourth-straight trip to Highland Heights The event started in 1982.

** Fifth-year FSU head coach **Bill Sall**, who served for four seasons (1998-2002) as the assistant men's basketball coach at GLIAC-member Hillsdale (Mich.) College, previously was the top assistant coach at Ferris State for three seasons (1995-98) and spent part of the 1995-96 campaign as the Bulldogs' interim head coach. In his brief tenure, Ferris recorded a 5-8 start under Sall before finishing the year with a 6-20 overall record.

** Ferris State's impressive basketball tradition includes 11 GLIAC titles, eight NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and a berth in the 1988 NCAA-II Elite Eight. Ferris, which last won the GLIAC Tournament championship during the 1997-98 campaign, captured a league record four consecutive conference titles from 1986-90. FSU has won more GLIAC Championships (11) than any other league member.

** The Bulldogs had posted only a 21-82 (.204) mark in the four seasons prior to **Bill Sall's** arrival, but has since went 67-49 (.578) and claimed two divisional titles while making two NCAA-II Tournament appearances in his four seasons at the helm. FSU won only four games (4-22) the year before Sall arrived in 2001-02.

** Ferris returns three starters and six letterwinners from the last campaign. Among the players lost from last season was three-time all-conference point guard Dennis Springs, who concluded his career with a school-record 713 career assists. He was a National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Great Lakes Region All-District First Team pick as a senior.

** Senior forward **Terrance Shaw** received All-GLIAC Second Team accolades last season. The 6-5 Shaw averaged 13 points and a team-best 6.8 rebounds per outing in 2005-06. Shaw along with senior forward **Michael Daniels** and senior guard **Julius Vines** will serve as team captains this year.

BILL SALL

Head Coach ♦ Fifth Season
Calvin, 1994



The Bulldog men's basketball program began its ascent to the top of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) when Bill Sall was named the program's 11th head coach on April 23, 2002.

After leading the Bulldogs to an 11-15 overall record in his first season at the helm, Sall guided Ferris to the GLIAC North Division Regular-Season Championship in 2003-04. FSU finished the season with a 14-14 overall record, including a first place 14-4 league mark.

During the 2004-05 campaign, Sall led FSU to its second-straight league divisional crown and a berth in the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament where the Bulldogs earned runner-up honors. FSU posted a 24-7 overall record and earned a spot in the national rankings over the course of the campaign.

Sall, who served for four seasons (1998-2002) as the assistant men's basketball coach at GLIAC member Hillsdale (Mich.) College, was the unanimous choice of a five-member search committee.

In four seasons at Hillsdale, Sall was instrumental in leading the Chargers to a 72-41 (.637) record and two consecutive (2001-02) NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional tourney berths while being involved with the program's administrative, recruiting and on-floor coaching aspects under head coach Ed Douma. The Chargers reached the regional semifinals during the 2000-01 campaign while posting a 24-8 overall mark en route to a first-place 13-4 GLIAC South Division title.

Prior to his appointment at Hillsdale, Sall was the top assistant coach at Ferris State for three seasons (1995-98) and spent the first year (1995-96) as an assistant to head coach Tom Ludwig. During the 1995-96 campaign, he had the opportunity to serve a portion of the season as the Bulldogs' interim head coach. In his brief tenure, Ferris recorded a 5-8 start before finishing the year with a 6-20 overall record. As an assistant under former head coach Edgar Wilson, Sall helped guide FSU to a 21-12 finish along with a GLIAC Tournament Championship title and a NCAA Division II National Tournament berth during the 1997-98 season.

A nine-year collegiate assistant coach, Sall received his coaching start under Douma at his alma mater Calvin College in Grand Rapids, Mich., from 1992-95. The Knights made two NCAA-III National Tournament appearances, claimed the 1993-94 Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (MIAA) Championship and were 37-17 (.685) during his two seasons as an assistant.

Before joining the coaching ranks, Sall was a standout player at Calvin from 1985-1990. A two-time (1989-90) MIAA Co-Most Valuable Player, Sall currently ranks as the Knights' third-leading all-time scorer with 2,063 points, which included a 70-game double-figure scoring streak. The 6-5 forward also grabbed 738 career rebounds as Calvin captured three (1986, 89-90) MIAA championships, earned four NCAA-III tournament bids and advanced to the 1990 NCAA Division III Final Four. During his collegiate career, the three-time (1987, 89-90) first-team All-MIAA honoree reached double-figure scoring in 100 of 109 outings, which presently ranks second on the all-time Calvin chart. Sall, a two-time (1989-90) second-team National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Division III All-America performer, is currently listed 10th (864 points) among the MIAA's all-time scoring leaders and is seventh (.586; 341-582) on the league's field goal percentage chart.

As a prepster, Sall attained honorable mention all-state and all-area basketball laurels at Unity Christian High School in Hudsonville, Mich. The Zeeland, Mich., native displayed his athletic versatility by winning the 1985 Michigan High School Athletic Association (MHSAA) Class B State 400-meter run title. He also competed in cross country.

A member of the National Association of Basketball Coaches, Sall is married to the former Karen Brower. The couple has a daughter, Delaney (born 7/19/02), and welcomed the birth of triplets Quentin, Hannah and Lydia in March 2005 (3/9). Sall graduated from Calvin in 1994.

THE BULLDOG BASKETBALL TRADITION

The Ferris State men's basketball program ranks second to none in terms of its impressive tradition among the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) member institutions.

Ferris has won more league titles (11) and made more NCAA Championship appearances (eight) than any other conference member. In the 34-year history of the GLIAC, only the Bulldogs have won four-straight (1987-90) league championships.

In the history of men's basketball, the Bulldogs have made 12 previous national tournament appearances including an NCAA Division II Elite Eight berth in 1988. FSU also reached the national quarterfinal round at the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) level in 1962.

Besides the school's 11 league titles, Ferris has also made eight GLIAC Tournament appearances and won the 1997-98 GLIAC Tourney championship. Along the way, the Bulldogs have produced 29 first-team all-conference selections and 54 All-GLIAC honorees since 1981. Five FSU players have went on to earn All-America accolades.

Ferris State has posted 38 winning campaigns and 43 non-losing seasons in its rich history. The Bulldogs have won 20 or more games in a season 17 times. The Bulldogs' 934 all-time wins includes 316 league victories along with a combined 349 triumphs at the Old and New Jim Wink Arenas.
