

Bostic Heads Daktronics Midwest All-Region Unit

University of Findlay senior forward Josh Bostic might have to build an addition to his trophy case.

Bostic is the 2009 Daktronics Midwest Region player of the year and a first team all-region selection. The Midwest Region team is selected by sports information directors throughout the region. Bostic received the highest point total of all players on the ballot.

The Findlay standout is also the 2009 GLIAC player of the year. He is a first team All-GLIAC selection, the GLIAC Tournament MVP and the preseason GLIAC player of the year. He was also tabbed as a preseason All-America.

Bostic is averaging 17.9 ppg., 6.3 rpg., and 2.6 steals per game. He is the GLIAC leader in steals, is third in scoring and 10th in rebounding. The forward has helped the Oilers run up a 30-0 record, 22-0 in GLIAC play. Findlay is the nation's top-ranked team.

Joining Bostic on the Midwest Region team are Lake Superior State guard Tim VanOudheusden, Bellarmine guard Chartrael Hall, Lewis guard Brandon Dragans and Wisconsin-Parkside forward LaVontay Fenderson. All five of these players will have their names placed on the Daktronics All-America national ballot. Each player on the first team is a senior.

The Midwest Region second team consists of Rockhurt guard Aaron Hill, Southern Indiana guard Jamar Smith, Hillsdale center Tony Gugino, Ferris State forward-center Justin Keenan and Northern Kentucky guard Dustin Maguire.

VanOudheusden was the anchor for a dream season at Lake Superior State. The 6-4 guard is second in the GLIAC in scoring (18.1 ppg.) and ninth in field goal percentage (.516). A four-year starter, he helped lead the Lakers to the GLIAC North Division championship. The Lakers are 21-8, 17-5 in the conference. This is Lake Superior State's first 20-win campaign since 1995-96. The Lakers are also part of the NCAA postseason.

Hall has been an exceptional all-around performer for a Bellarmine team that is 24-6, 13-5 in the GLVC. Hall's Knights are in the NCAA playoffs and are the second seed in the regional tournament. Bellarmine advanced to the championship game of the GLVC Tournament before falling to Northern Kentucky. Hall, a first team all-conference choice, is averaging 14.0 ppg., 5.7 rpg., 5.8 apg., and 1.8 spg.

Dagans, a 6-1 guard, helped Lewis finish 16-12, 10-8 in league action. Dagans is a first team All-GLVC pick and he averaged 19.4 ppg., and 4.0 rpg. He shot 49.3 percent from the floor and 81.6 percent at the free throw line. Dagans scored 28 points in a win over nationally-ranked Bellarmine and averaged 20.4 ppg., in games against regionally-ranked foes.

Fenderson is a prolific scorer, he ended the year averaging 26.3 ppg. That figure leads all of NCAA Division II. The W-P guard scored 709 points this season, the second highest single-season total in school history. Fenderson is a member of the All-GLVC First Team.
