



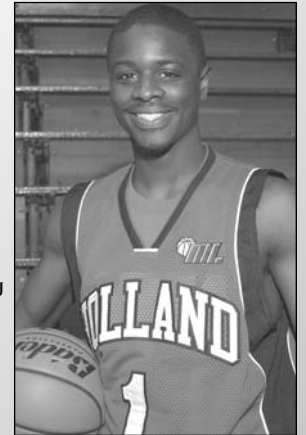
**JIM WINK ARENA HISTORY**

**FORMER BULLDOG NAMED IBL ALL-STAR**

Former Ferris State men's basketball guard Dennis Springs has been honored as a International Basketball League (IBL) All-Star in each of his initial three pro seasons (2006-08) with the Holland (Mich.) Blast.



The 5-6 Springs, who concluded his collegiate eligibility by leading FSU to its second consecutive NCAA Division II National Tournament appearance in 2005-06, placed third among the IBL's leading scorers in 2008 by averaging 26.8 points per game over 17 contests.

During his playing career, Springs led Ferris to back-to-back GLIAC North Division Championships (2003-04 & 2004-05), guided FSU to a runner-up league regular-season finish in 2005-06 and directed the Bulldogs to consecutive NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament appearances his final two seasons.

Spings was recognized as both Ferris State's Most Valuable Player and Defensive Player Award recipient during the 2005-06 campaign. He was also honored with Ferris' 2005-06 Dean Davenport "Bulldog of the Year" Award.

In addition to the Blast, Springs has also played overseas in Sweden for the Boras/Marbo Basket in the Swedish Basketettan League and previously competed for stints in both Mexico and Germany on an American Tour Team.
