Ferris Advances To GLIAC Tournament Semifinals

FERRIS AT A GLANCE:

The Ferris State University men's basketball team will square off against Wayne State Friday, March 4, in the semifinal round of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Tournament at Findlay, Ohio. Tipoff is set for 7:30 p.m. (EST). FSU, which is currently 22-5 overall this season, has won 11-straight contests to date this campaign.

FSU WINS QUARTERFINAL:

Ferris State jumped out to a 22-point lead with seven minutes remaining and held on to post a 103-98 triumph over Northern Michigan in the quarterfinal round of the GLIAC Tournament held Tuesday (March 1) at FSU's Jim Wink Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. Senior guard **Carlton Epps (Benton Harbor)** netted a team-best 30 points along with seven steals. Junior guard **Dennis Springs (Toledo, Ohio/Scott)** chipped in 20 points and 12 assists while senior guard **Corey Epps (Benton Harbor)** totaled 18 points. Senior forward **Willie Burrell (Muskegon Heights)** scored 14 points as four players reached double-figure scoring. The win was FSU's third over the Wildcats this campaign.

THE TOURNEY FIELD: The first semifinal game at Croy Gymnasium between top-seeded host Findlay and fourth-seeded Michigan Tech is set to start at 5:30 p.m. (EST). Ferris State heads into the semifinal round as the tournament's number two seed while WSU is seeded third overall in the field. The winner of Friday's semifinals will move into the tournament championship game Saturday, March 5, at 7:30 p.m. (EST) in Findlay.

MEDIA COVERAGE: Live coverage of Friday's contest and Saturday's final should the Bulldogs advance will be provided by local radio station WBRN (1460 AM) with Rob Bentley providing the play by play coverage. The contest is also tentatively slated to be accessible via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcast icon at www.ferris.edu/sports.

TICKET INFORMATION: Tickets for the tournament may be purchased at the door one hour prior to the start of both Friday's and Saturday's sessions. Ticket prices are \$8 for general admission seats and \$4 for students. More information can be obtained by calling the UF Athletics Ticket Office at (419) 434-4651.

GLIAC CHAMPIONS: Ferris State claimed its second-straight GLIAC North Division Regular-Season Championship with a 72-68 win over Michigan Tech in the regular-season finale last Saturday (Feb. 26) in Houghton, Mich. The Bulldogs also defeated Northern Michigan 74-65 in last Thursday's (Feb. 24) first contest of the trip to Michigan's Upper Peninsula at Marquette, Mich. This season marks the first time the Bulldogs have swept both Michigan Tech and Northern Michigan on the road in the same season since the 1988-89 campaign. FSU was 13-5 in league play this year.

ANOTHER LEAGUE TITLE: Ferris won its 11th GLIAC title with last Saturday's win at Michigan Tech. The Bulldogs have presently won more league crowns than any other conference member. FSU had not won a GLIAC championship since 1994-95 prior to last season's (2003-04) initial title run under head coach **Bill Sall**.

REGIONALLY-RANKED: Ferris is ranked third in the latest (March 2) NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional rankings. The Bulldogs are currently 16-5 versus regional teams this campaign. Findlay holds the top spot in the regional poll with Southern Indiana currently listed second. The Great Lakes Region consists of all GLIAC and Great Lakes Valley Conference schools.

NATIONALLY-RANKED: FSU entered the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC)/Division II Bulletin Top 25 Poll in the 24th spot last week (Feb. 23) and moved up to 19th in this week's (March 1) rankings. This season marks the school's first appearance in the national rankings since

the 1988-89 campaign. The Bulldogs are one of only two league schools ranked in the latest poll along with second-ranked Findlay. Ferris had not been ranked prior to the last two weeks since holding down the number one spot in the final poll of the 1988-89 season (March 6, 1989). The current national listing represents the 19th time the program has been ranked in the Division II poll. Bowie State (Md.) holds the top position in the latest rankings followed by Findlay, Metropolitan State (Colo.), Southern Indiana and Nebraska-Omaha in the top five. Ferris received 55 points in this week's poll.

LAST SEASON: Ferris State, which also claimed the 2003-04 GLIAC North Division Regular-Season Championship, finished the 2003-04 campaign with a 14-14 overall record and a 14-4 league mark. FSU was 0-10 in non-conference games last season.

HEAD COACH BILL SALL: A 1994 Calvin graduate, third-year FSU head coach Bill Sall previously held assistant coaching positions at Calvin (1992-95), Ferris State (1995-98) and Hillsdale (1998-02) prior to being named Ferris State's 11th head coach. The Zeeland, Mich., native served as Ferris' interim head coach for a portion of the 1995-96 campaign and led the Bulldogs to a 5-8 mark. Before joining the coaching ranks, Sall was a standout player at Calvin from 1985-90. He twice (1989-90) received second-team National Association of Basketball Coaches Division III All-America honors and led Calvin to three Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (MIAA) championships, four NCAA-III Tournament bids and the 1990 NCAA-III Final Four. Sall has a current 52-42 (.553) career mark and picked up his 50th career win this season at Northern Michigan (Feb. 24).

THE BULLDOG TRADITION: The 2004-05 campaign marks the 77th season of Bulldog men's basketball. The program began in 1925 although Ferris did not field a team from 1942-45 due to World War II. FSU has compiled a 914-841 (.521) all-time mark. The Bulldogs have won 11 GLIAC titles, made six NCAA Division II Tournament appearances and reached the 1988 NCAA-II Elite Eight. Ferris, which captured a league-record four consecutive GLIAC titles from 1986-90, notched its 900th all-time win this season with a 110-104 overtime triumph over Indianapolis (Dec. 21) in the Lions Club Holiday Classic at FSU.

FSU PICKED SECOND: Ferris was picked to finish second in the 2004-05 GLIAC North Division Preseason Poll. The Bulldogs totaled 32 points along with two first-place votes in the balloting conducted by the GLIAC's head coaches. Michigan Tech was selected as the North Division favorite while Findlay took the top spot in the South Division. WSU was picked third in the South.

JIM WINK ARENA: Ferris has recorded a 35-37 (.486) overall record to date in home contests at Jim Wink Arena, including a 23-31 (.426) mark in league play. The 2,400-seat facility replaced Old Jim Wink Arena, which was converted into the current Student Recreation Center after the 1997-98 season. FSU is 15-1 (.938) at home this year.

ON THE ROAD: Ferris is 371-310 (.545) overall since 1980-81 and sports a 171-212 (.446) record in road/neutral site contests during that span. The Bulldogs are 7-4 (.636) on the road this season.

BULLDOG BITES

FSU's current 337 steals this campaign ranks as the program's best-ever single-season performance to date..... Junior guard **Dennis Springs (Toledo, Ohio/Scott)** surpassed Tim Herman's school single-season assists record set in 1977-78 in Tuesday's quarterfinal win. Springs has posted 189 assists to date this season while Herman netted 186. Springs also registered his 500th career assist versus NMU and is only 21 away from tying Jarvis Walker's (1985-89) school-record career mark of 532 assists..... Senior guard **Carlton Epps (Benton Harbor)** is three three-pointers shy of matching Willie Thomas' single-season best of 91 treys a year ago..... **Dennis Springs**, who has scored 10 points or more in nine consecutive outings this season, notched his 900th career point at Northern Michigan (2/24)..... **Carlton Epps** presently has 89 steals to date this season and has passed Day Smith's single-season record of 69 thefts recorded back in 1997-98. He has reached double-figure scoring in 27 of his last 28 contests dating back to last season..... **Corey Epps** needs three rebounds to garner his 300th career board. He has scored 10 points or more in five of his last seven outings to date, including each of the last three contests.

GLIAC TOURNEY HISTORY: The Bulldogs made their first league tourney appearance since 1997-98 a year ago and dropped a 72-71 quarterfinal round home decision to Northwood (3/2/04) in Wink Arena..... FSU is presently 5-8 all-time in seven tournament appearances after Tuesday's win over Northern Michigan..... This season represents the second consecutive year FSU has hosted a GLIAC Tourney quarterfinal round game. The 1994-95 season marks Ferris' only other previous league tourney home games as FSU lost to Hillsdale (semifinals) and Michigan Tech (consolation) at Old Jim Wink Arena during that campaign..... Ferris captured its only tourney title in 1997-98..... Ferris dropped a 72-67 semifinal round decision to Wayne State in the only previous tournament meeting between the two schools back in the 1992-93 season at Marquette, Mich.

NCAA REGIONAL INFO: The winner of this season's GLIAC Tournament will receive the league's automatic berth into the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament slated for March 12-15 at a site to be determined. Eight teams, including six at-large teams, will participate in the regional with the official announcement set to be released Sunday, March 6. The announcement can be seen live on Altitude Sports and Entertainment found on DirecTV Channel 644 or Dish Network 410 beginning at 10:30 p.m. (EST). It is also available on at www.ncaasports.com.

MORE BULLDOG BITES: Ferris has totaled more turnovers than its opponent only twice this season..... Ferris has won its last 14 games held in the month of February dating back to last season. The Bulldogs were 8-0 during the month this year..... Prior to **Bill Sall's** arrival, the Bulldogs had posted only a 21-82 (.204) mark in the four previous seasons (1998-2002) combined. Since his debut, Ferris is currently 47-34 (.580)..... Ferris' 22 victories to date this season represents FSU's most wins since advancing to the NCAA-II Elite Eight win a 24-6 overall record in 1988-89 and only the second time in the last 10 seasons Ferris has won 20 or more games..... FSU's last seven losses dating back to last season have all been by seven points or less..... Ferris' current 11-game winning streak is the program's longest since winning 18-straight contests in 1988-89..... The Bulldogs' only loss at home this year was against Findlay 87-85 (12/2/04) on a tip-in at the buzzer.

A Look At The Opponent

WAYNE STATE: Wayne State enters Friday's meeting with an 18-10 overall record following Tuesday's (March 1) 75-70 victory over Gannon in the tournament quarterfinals at Detroit, Mich. WSU concluded the regular season tied for second place (11-6) in the GLIAC South Division and previously defeated FSU 76-69 during the regular-season (Jan. 15) in Detroit. The Bulldogs maintain a 33-31 edge heading into Friday's 65th series' encounter, but have lost eight-straight series' contests and have not defeated WSU since the 1996-97 season. The Warriors, who are coached by fourth-year head coach David Greer, are led in scoring by senior guard Morris Hall (17.7 ppg) and have won six of their last eight dates to date this campaign. FSU head coach **Bill Sall** currently holds an 0-5 career coaching mark versus Wayne State.

LOOKING AT THE OTHER TEAMS

Findlay: The Oilers maintain an 8-2 series edge over the Bulldogs and defeated Ferris 87-85 in the last meeting (12/2/04) at Big Rapids, Mich. UF, which has won 18 of its last 19 contests to date this campaign, is presently 25-3 overall entering the semifinals after recording a 71-54 home win over Hillsdale Tuesday (March 1) in the quarterfinal round. The Oilers, who are guided by 20th-year head coach Ron Niekamp, were 25-7 overall during the 2003-04 campaign and advanced to the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament semifinal round following a first-place 13-4 GLIAC South Division finish. Sophomore center Chris Commons is the leading scorer (16.1 ppg) to date for Findlay, which won its fourth consecutive GLIAC South Division title with a 16-1 league mark this season. The Oilers, who are ranked first regionally and second in the national poll, captured the 2003-04 GLIAC Tourney Championship in Findlay, Ohio. Ferris head coach Bill Sall is 0-3 versus the Oilers in his head coaching career.

Michigan Tech: The Huskies maintain a 48-46 series' lead over Ferris State. MTU had won 11 consecutive series contests prior to FSU's current three-game streak, which includes a 72-68 win in the most recent contest (2/26/05) at Houghton, Mich. Michigan Tech enters the semifinals with an 18-9 overall record this season following Tuesday's (March 1) 56-48 league tourney quarterfinal round win at Grand Valley State. The Huskies, under 11th-year head coach Kevin Luke, were 22-8 overall during the 2003-04 campaign and compiled a second-place 13-5 GLIAC North Division record. MTU, which is led in scoring by senior forward Josh Buettner (19.6 ppg), placed third in the league's North Division this season with a 10-8 league mark. Michigan Tech has won five of its last six games to date this campaign. FSU head coach Bill Sall has a current 3-3 mark against MTU.



BULLDOG NOTES

✓ Ferris has tallied a school-record 15 victories at home this campaign. This season also represents the first time Ferris has won 10 or more home games in a season since the 1995-96 campaign (13-1). It is only the third time in the last 17 years FSU has achieved 10 or more home wins. The Bulldogs have won 21 of their past 23 games in Wink Arena.

✓ The GLIAC Tourney remains on campus sites this season for the third year in a row. Prior to the 2002-03 season, the four previous GLIAC tournaments were held at a neutral site location, with the final three taking place at the DeltaPlex in Grand Rapids, Mich.

✓ FSU is midst its seventh all-time league tournament appearance, including its second-straight berth. The Bulldogs last reached the semifinals in 1997-98 en route to winning their only conference tournament title.

✓ Senior forward **Willie Burrel (Muskegon Heights)** needs 22 points to notch his 500th career point entering Friday's semifinal. Burrel has seven double-figure scoring performances in his last nine outings this year.

✓ Ferris last earned a NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament appearance in 1997-98 after winning the league's postseason tournament for the only time in school history. The Bulldogs made four-straight trips to the regional tournament from 1987-90.

✓ Current FSU assistant coach **Cory Anderson** started for the Bulldogs when Ferris won the 1997-98 GLIAC Tournament title. Head coach **Bill Sall** was an assistant coach at the time under former Bulldog coach Edgar Wilson.

✓ Senior guard **Carlton Epps (Benton Harbor)** is currently 29 points away from scoring his 1,500th career point. He is 126 points shy of tying Adam Anderson (1998-03) for seventh place on the school's career scoring chart.

✓ Junior guard **Dennis Springs (Toledo, Ohio/Scott)** needs 64 points entering the semifinal round to become the 24th player in school history to notch 1,000 career points at FSU.

✓ FSU's **Carlton Epps** garnered GLIAC North Division First-Team honors for the second consecutive year this season while **Dennis Springs** attained second-team kudos for the second year in a row as announced by the league office Thursday (March 3). Both players also received GLIAC North Division All-Defensive Team plaudits.

✓ Senior guard **Corey Epps (Benton Harbor)** is two three-pointers away from matching Joe Blankenship's (1991-93) fourth-place FSU mark of 143 treys entering Friday's contest.

✓ Ferris' current 22-5 record this year marks only the sixth time in school history the Bulldogs have achieved 22 wins or more in a single-season.

✓ The Bulldogs finished non-conference play with a 9-0 regular-season mark this year. Last campaign (2003-04), the Bulldogs were 0-10 in non-conference contests.

✓ Ferris State won its final six regular-season contests en route to winning the 2003-04 GLIAC North Division title. FSU followed that up by picking up victories in each of its final 10 regular-season games this season to win a second-straight championship. The Bulldogs started GLIAC play with a 3-5 mark this year before the 10-game stretch.

✓ The Bulldogs' **Carlton Epps** tallied GLIAC North Division Player of the Week accolades three times this season. He was awarded the honor on Nov. 29, Jan. 3 and Feb. 7.

✓ FSU is 2-2 versus the remaining teams in the GLIAC Tournament this campaign. Ferris swept Michigan Tech in two meetings while the Bulldogs fell to Wayne State on the road and Findlay at home.

THE BULLDOG BASKETBALL TRADITION

The Ferris State men's basketball program ranks second to none in terms of its impressive tradition among the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) member institutions.

Ferris has won more league titles (11) and made more NCAA Championship appearances (six) than any other conference member. In the 33-year history of the GLIAC, only the Bulldogs have won four-straight (1987-90) league championships.

In the history of men's basketball, the Bulldogs have made 11 national tournament appearances including an NCAA Division II Elite Eight berth in 1988. FSU also reached the national quarterfinal round at the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) level in 1962.

Besides the school's 11 league titles, Ferris will be making its seventh GLIAC Tournament appearance this year and won the 1997-98 GLIAC Tourney championship. Along the way, the Bulldogs have produced 27 first-team all-conference selections and 49 All-GLIAC honorees since 1981. Four FSU players have went on to earn All-America accolades.

Ferris State has posted 37 winning campaigns and 41 non-losing seasons in its rich history. The Bulldogs have won 20 or more games in a season 17 times. The Bulldogs' 914 all-time wins includes 303 league victories along with a combined 339 triumphs at the Old and New Jim Wink Arenas.
