NCAA TOURNAMENT HISTORY

FERRIS GARNERS FIRST POSTSEASON BERTH

The Ferris State women's basketball team made its first and only NCAA Division II Tournament appearance during the 1999-2000 campaign. The Bulldogs lost in the opening round of the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament versus Missouri-St. Louis on March 9, 2000, by a score of 90-77. The tournament took place at Northern Kentucky in Highland Heights, Ky.

Junior center Tianna Kirkland led Ferris State with 18 points and 12 rebounds in the contest while senior guard Carrie Roys added 13 rebounds for FSU. Senior Amy Pickard chipped in 12 points, sophomore Debbie Killips added 11 points and senior Amy Popielarz also tallied 11 points for the Bulldogs. Missouri-St. Louis jumped out to a 50-38 halftime advantage by shooting 58-percent from the floor in the first half.

The regional tournament field also included Northern Michigan, Gannon and Michigan Tech. NKU won the regional championship and advanced to the NCAA Division II Elite Eight with a 77-70 win over Northern Michigan in the regional championship game.

FERRIS STATE'S ALL-REGION HONOREES

Lucy DeMartin and Bridget Horwitz became only the third and fourth players in school history to earn all-region accolades as they were named to the 2002-03 Daktronics Division II All-Great Lakes Region list.

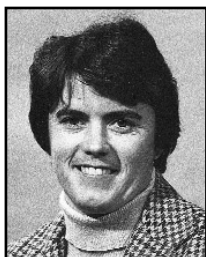
DeMartin joined Lake Superior State's Alice Duesing and Stephanie Heid of Hillsdale as first-team all-region representatives from a GLIAC-member institution. Horwitz was one of three league players named to the all-region second-team.

DeMartin's team-leading scoring average (20.2 ppg) ranked first among the school's all-time leaders. She compiled a school-record 525 points while attaining 2002-03 Verizon Academic All-District IV College Division Women's Basketball Team First-Team accolades.

Horwitz totaled 420 points (16.8 ppg) and a team-leading 210 rebounds (8.4 rpg) in 25 appearances. The 6-2 Horwitz scored 10 points or more in 22 games while notching nine double-double performances. She was also named to the All-GLIAC Second-Team.

Prior to DeMartin and Horwitz's selections, FSU's only other all-region honorees were Tianna Kirkland (2000-01) and Debbie Killips (2001-02). Kirkland garnered first-team laurels while Killips was a second-team selection.
