### BULLDOG BITES

✓ **FSU BASKETBALL AT A GLANCE:** The Ferris State women's basketball team hosts Lake Superior State in the quarterfinal round of the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Tournament Tuesday (Feb. 27) evening at 7 p.m. (EST) inside Jim Wink Arena at Big Rapids, Mich.

✓ **MEDIA COVERAGE:** The game will be carried live by Bulldog Radio, which can be heard locally on television Channel 21 both via on-campus cable and Charter Communications in Mecosta County. An audio-only webcast will be offered at [www.bulldogradio.org](http://www.bulldogradio.org). A live video and audio webcast will be available through B2 Networks for a charge of \$6 on FSU's Athletics Website at [www.ferris.edu/sports](http://www.ferris.edu/sports). In addition, live stats will be available over the internet at [www.ferris.edu/sports](http://www.ferris.edu/sports). LSSU will have live audio of the game at [www.lssulakers.com](http://www.lssulakers.com).

✓ **TICKET INFO:** Tickets for the quarterfinal round will be sold at the door beginning one hour prior to game time. Tickets are \$7 for reserved seats, \$5 for adult general admission and \$2 for FSU and high school students with identification. For more information, please contact the Ferris Athletics Ticket office at (231) 591-2888.

✓ **BIG SATURDAY:** The Bulldogs defeated defending NCAA-II National Champion Grand Valley State 64-62 in this past Saturday's (Feb. 24) regular-season finale. FSU took a slight 33-31 halftime edge en route to snapping a six-game series' losing streak versus the defending NCAA Division II National Champions ..... Saturday's crowd was the largest crowd to ever witness a women's basketball game inside the new Jim Wink Arena estimated at 1,200 fans ..... Saturday was "Senior Night" as the Bulldogs honored guards **Erin Miller (Niles)** and **Kristin Reinhart (East Lansing)**, forward **Audrey Thwing (Davison)** and student manager **Nicole Bridges** following the final regular-season home contest.

✓ **THE RECORDS:** Ferris State, which has won 12 of its last 14 outings to date this year, presently holds a 20-7 overall record. Lake Superior State is currently 18-8 overall this campaign. Both teams tied for second place in the North Division with 13-5 league regular-season records, but Ferris received the tiebreaker nod and the right to host Tuesday's quarterfinal by virtue of its win over GVSU.

✓ **GLIAC TOURNEY:** Four quarterfinal-round games will be played Tuesday evening. The quarterfinal-round winners will advance to the GLIAC Tournament semifinals and finals set for Friday and Saturday, March 2-3, at the site of the highest remaining seed. The winner of the GLIAC Tournament receives an automatic bid into the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional Tournament slated to be held March 9-12 at a location yet to be determined.

✓ **GLIAC TOURNEY FIELD:** The other quarterfinal round games include Michigan Tech (Wild Card Seed #1) at Grand Valley State (#1 seed North), Wayne State (#3 seed South) at Hillsdale (#2 seed South) along with Saginaw Valley State (Wild Card Seed #2) at Gannon (#1 seed South). The

MTU-GVSU game will take place Tuesday at 6 p.m. (EST) with the other two games set for 7 p.m. (EST) starts. The top three teams from each division plus the next two best overall finishers earned tournament bids. The highest remaining seed following Tuesday's quarterfinals will be selected to host the semifinals/finals Friday and Saturday, March 2-3. Gannon is the top seed overall in the event.

✓ **FSU TOURNEY NOTES:** Ferris has posted a 5-8 overall record in eight previous league women's basketball tournament appearances. FSU, which will be making its eighth-straight women's berth in the GLIAC Tournament, fell last year to Grand Valley State 79-47 in the GLIAC Tournament Quarterfinals (2/28/06) at Allendale, Mich. .... Ferris is 0-2 all-time versus Lake Superior State in GLIAC Tournament play. Both previous meetings took place in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. FSU most recently suffered an 85-73 setback to the host Lakers in the 2004 GLIAC Tournament Championship game ..... FSU also was the tourney runner-up in 1999-00 ..... The tournament remains on campus sites this season for the fifth year in a row.

✓ **LAST SEASON:** Ferris State wrapped up its 2005-06 women's basketball season with an 18-10 overall record and made its seventh consecutive GLIAC Tournament appearance last campaign. FSU, which posted a third-place tying 12-6 mark in GLIAC North Division play a year ago, also registered its 10th consecutive season with 10 or more victories in 2005-06.

✓ **TRACEY BLOODWORTH-FISK:** Ninth-year FSU head coach **Tracey Bloodworth-Fisk** presently ranks as Ferris' all-time winningest coach with a current 155-95 (.620) career record at Ferris State. A 1996 graduate of Western Michigan, she guided FSU to a 22-7 mark and the school's first NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tourney appearance during the 1999-00 campaign. She spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Lake Michigan College (1994-97) and one season at Indianapolis (1997-98).

✓ **THE BULLDOG TRADITION:** The Ferris State women's basketball program, which is midst its 33rd season of varsity competition, has compiled a 408-420 (.493) all-time mark. The Bulldogs won their only GLIAC crown, advanced to their first NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament and recorded the nation's highest grade point average in 1999-2000. FSU, which also claimed GLIAC Tournament runner-up honors in 1999-00, has posted 10 or more victories 10 consecutive seasons to date.

✓ **THE BULLDOG ROSTER:** Ferris' 2006-07 roster includes three seniors, three juniors, five sophomores and two freshmen. Six of the 13 players are guards while the remaining seven are frontcourt players. All 13 players on the roster hail from Michigan. FSU senior guards **Erin Miller** and **Kristin Reinhart** along with junior forward **Rachel Folcik (Powers/Carney-Nadeau)** and senior forward **Audrey Thwing** are the Bulldogs' captains.

✓ **JIM WINK ARENA:** Ferris has recorded a 63-25 (.716) overall record to date in games at Jim Wink Arena, including a 49-22 (.690) mark in league play. The 2,400-seat facility replaced the Old Jim Wink Arena, which was converted into the current Student Recreation Center after the 1997-98 campaign. FSU won its first 14 games in the facility.

### MORE BULLDOG BITES

✓ **REGIONAL RANKINGS:** Ferris State was ranked eighth in last week's (Feb. 21) NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Rankings. The rankings help determine the field for the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional March 9-12 at the site of the highest seed. Eight teams will make the regional field. Lewis (Ill.) topped the latest regional poll followed by Grand Valley State, Northern Kentucky, Drury (Mo.) and Southern Illinois-Edwardsville. Five of the top 10 regional teams were from the Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) with five from the GLIAC including GVSU, Gannon (6th), FSU, Michigan Tech (9th) and Lake Superior State (10th). New rankings will come out Wednesday, Feb. 28.

✓ **AWARD TIMES FIVE:** For the sixth time this season, **Rachel Folcik** was honored as this week's (Feb. 26) GLIAC North Division Player of the Week Award recipient. Folcik posted a game-high 28 points along with five rebounds, three steals and three assists as the Bulldogs secured a conference tournament quarterfinal-round home game with a thrilling 64-62 victory over nationally 12th-ranked archrival Grand Valley State in Saturday's regular-season finale at Jim Wink Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. Folcik's three-pointer with three minutes left to go in the game gave FSU the lead for good as the Bulldogs snapped a six-game series' losing streak to GVSU. She added six points, five rebounds and three assists in only 20 minutes of action as Ferris topped Marygrove 107-81 in non-league play Thursday (Feb. 22). Folcik totaled 34 points, 10 rebounds, six assists and four steals in the two-game stretch while averaging 17 points and five boards per game.

✓ **PLAYER OF THE WEEK NOTES:** Previously, **Rachel Folcik** was selected as the GLIAC North Division Player of the Week for the first time in her career to open the New Year (Jan. 3) and also attained the honor two other consecutive weeks (Jan. 15 & Jan. 22) in addition to last week (Feb. 12). To date, she's attained the league weekly honor five of the last eight times it's been awarded this campaign. Folcik has received the league's weekly honor more than any other male or female conference player this campaign. Her selection as the GLIAC's weekly award winner this week marks the seventh time a Ferris player has earned the distinction this season as both **Kristin Reinhart** and **Erin Miller** were previous recipients on Nov. 20 and Nov. 27, respectively. FSU has presently had a player honored as the league's player of the week 20 times in the last five seasons, including the current year, to date.

✓ **FSU DUO EARNS ACADEMIC HONORS:** FSU's **Erin Miller** and **Rachel Folcik** were recognized as 2006-07 ESPN *The Magazine* Academic All-District IV College Division Women's Basketball Second Team selections. Miller and Folcik were among only five representatives from a GLIAC-member school named to any of the three District IV teams selected in voting conducted by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Miller was a first-team pick last year.

✓ **FOLCIK IN SPORTS ILLUSTRATED:** Ferris' **Rachel Folcik** is featured in last week's (Feb. 19) *Sports Illustrated* magazine issue in the popular "Faces In The Crowd" section of the weekly publication. Folcik was nominated for inclusion following her 37-point performance earlier this year in a 90-70 GLIAC road win at Mercyhurst (Jan. 18). Folcik was one of six athletes included in last week's edition and among four college student-athletes across the nation recognized. The "Faces In The Crowd" section, which can also be found online, honors athletes from all levels of competition on a weekly basis for their accomplishments.

✓ **BULLDOG BITES:** This year marks the 11th consecutive year the Bulldogs have won 10 or more games ..... Ferris' current scoring average of 79.7 points per game is on pace to break the school's single-season record average of 77.2 ppg set in 2003-04 ..... FSU's current free throw (.760) and field goal (.471) percentage totals also presently rank as the best seasonal efforts in school history ..... Ferris has won 18 or more games in a season three of the last four years to date.

✓ **HIGH OUTPUT NIGHT:** The Bulldogs built a 58-42 halftime edge and finished only five points shy of matching the school record of 112 points in a single-game during last Thursday's (Feb. 22) 107-81 non-league home win over Marygrove ..... Ferris shot 67.7% (42-62) from the floor in the outing, which topped the previous school mark of 67.4% set against Aquinas in 1989 (1/31) ..... Sophomore forward/center **Jenna Guay (Escanaba)** tallied a career-high 16 points and nine rebounds on an eight-of-eight performance from the floor. Her 1,000 field goal percentage matched the school single-game record set by Darlene Vondrasek (8-8) against Calvin (12/30/92).

✓ **STATISTICS NOTES:** The Bulldogs were ranked seventh nationally in field goal percentage and scoring offense along with 10th in free throw percentage and 16th in assists according to the latest (Feb. 20) NCAA-II National Statistics. FSU currently leads the GLIAC in scoring offense (79.7 ppg), rebounding offense (41.3 rpg), rebounding margin (+5.4), defensive rebounds (28.5 rpg), assist/turnover ratio (0.99), free throw percentage (.760) and assists (17.7) while ranking second in field goal percentage (.471) and third in three-point percentage (.361) for all games played overall .... **Rachel Folcik** leads the GLIAC in field goal percentage (.566), ranks second in scoring (18.9 ppg) and free throw percentage (.860) in addition to fourth in rebounding (8.2 rpg). She's listed 11th nationally in field goal percentage and 16th in free throw percentage.

### FERRIS STATE VS. LAKE SUPERIOR STATE NOTEBOOK

✓ **SCOUTING LSSU:** The Lakers are 18-8 overall and posted a second-place tying 13-5 GLIAC regular-season mark this year after last Wednesday's (Feb. 21) 63-51 league road win at Northwood. LSSU has currently split its last four outings this year. Last year, the Lakers compiled a 21-8 record and finished tied for third place (12-6) with FSU in GLIAC North Division play. LSSU is coached by first-year head coach Jamie Pewinski, who previously was a Laker assistant coach for seven years.

✓ **SERIES INFORMATION:** The Lakers maintain a 46-28 advantage heading into Tuesday's 75th meeting. LSSU has won 12 of the last 14 meetings, but dropped a 76-66 decision to FSU in the most recent game (2/17/07) at Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. The two teams split two games this year as LSSU defeated the Bulldogs 74-73 in the first meeting (12/18/06) at Big Rapids, Mich. The two teams also split a pair of meetings last campaign with each team winning on the road. FSU head coach **Tracey Bloodworth-Fisk** presently has a 6-14 career coaching mark versus Lake Superior State.
