✓**FSU BASKETBALL AT A GLANCE:** The Ferris State women's basketball team will square off against Hillsdale in the Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (GLIAC) Tournament Semifinals Friday (March 2) evening inside Gannon University's Hammermill Center in Erie, Pa. Tipoff is set for 8 p.m. (EST). GU earned the right to host the semifinals/finals.

✓**MEDIA COVERAGE:** Friday's game, along with Saturday's if necessary, will be carried live by local radio station News Talk 1460 AM (WBRN) in Big Rapids with Rob Bentley providing the play-by-play coverage. A live audio-only webcast is tentatively slated to be offered at www.ferris.edu/sports. In addition, Gannon University will offer live internet statistics and live audio for each tournament game at www.gannon.edu/sports. A live video and audio webcast is also slated to be available for all three games at a \$6 cost per contest through Penn Atlantic and can be accessed via the GLIAC website at www.gliac.org.

✓**TICKET INFO:** Tickets for semifinals/finals may be purchased at the door one hour prior to the start of each session. Plush seat tickets are \$7 while general admission tickets are \$5 and student tickets \$2 per session. GLIAC guidelines do not permit any complimentary tickets to be issued. For additional ticket information, please contact the GU's Athletics Office at (814) 871-7476.

✓**TOURNEY NOTES:** The Bulldogs are seeded second and the Chargers third entering the semifinal round Host and top-seeded Gannon will meet fourth-seeded Michigan Tech in the 6 p.m. (EST) game with the two winners squaring off Saturday (March 3) in the 7 p.m. (EST) title contest.

✓**WHAT'S AT STAKE:** The eventual tournament champion will receive the league's automatic bid into the NCAA Division II Great Lakes Regional Women's Basketball Tournament slated for March 9-12 at a site to be determined. Eight teams, including six at-large squads, will participate in the regional with the official announcement set to be released late Sunday (March 4) evening.

✓**QUARTERFINAL RESULTS:** The Bulldogs are currently 21-7 overall this season following Tuesday's (Feb. 27) 91-79 tournament quarterfinal round home win over Lake Superior State in FSU's Jim Wink Arena at Big Rapids, Mich. HC advanced to the semifinals with a 76-59 triumph over Wayne State Tuesday in Hillsdale, Mich. In the other quarterfinal games, MTU upset Grand Valley State 63-57 on the road in Allendale, Mich., while Gannon posted a 75-61 win over Saginaw Valley State at home.

✓**QUARTERFINAL HOME WIN:** Ferris State advanced to the GLIAC Tournament Semifinals with a 91-79 quarterfinal-round win over visiting Lake Superior State Tuesday evening at Wink Arena. The Bulldogs improved to 21-7 overall this season with the win. FSU jumped out to a 48-30 halftime lead and held on for the victory. Junior forward **Rachel Folcik (Powers, Mich./Carney-Nadeau)** led the way for Ferris with a game-high 28 points. Senior guard **Kristin Reinhart (East Lansing)** added 24 points and senior forward **Audrey Thwing (Davison)** chipped in 18 points for the Bulldogs.

✓**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State, which has won 13 of its last 15 outings to date this year, presently holds a 21-7 overall record. Hillsdale is currently 18-8 overall this campaign. Both teams finished second in their respective divisions as FSU posted a 13-5 North Division record and the Chargers compiled a 12-5 mark in South Division action.

✓**BIG SATURDAY:** The Bulldogs defeated defending NCAA-II National Champion Grand Valley State 64-62 in Saturday's (Feb. 24) regular-season finale. FSU took a slight 33-31 halftime edge en route to snapping a six-game series' losing streak versus the defending NCAA Division II National Champions Saturday's crowd was the largest crowd to ever witness a women's basketball game inside the new Jim Wink Arena estimated at 1,200 fans Saturday was "Senior Night" as the Bulldogs honored guards **Erin Miller (Niles)** and **Kristin Reinhart**, forward **Audrey Thwing** and student manager **Nicole Bridges** following the final regular-season home contest.

✓**FSU TOURNEY NOTES:** In its ninth league women's basketball tourney appearance, Ferris has posted a 6-8 overall record. FSU, which is making its eighth-straight women's berth in the GLIAC Tournament, fell last year to Grand Valley State 79-47 in the GLIAC Tournament Quarterfinals (2/28/06) at Allendale, Mich. Ferris is 0-2 all-time versus Hillsdale in GLIAC Tournament play. Both previous meetings took place on a neutral floor at the DeltaPlex in Grand Rapids (Mich.) with the Chargers winning 85-78 in double overtime in 2000-01 and by a 90-71 count in 2001-02 FSU was the tourney runner-up in 1999-00 and 2003-04 The tournament remains on campus sites this season for the fifth year in a row.

✓**LAST SEASON:** Ferris State wrapped up its 2005-06 women's basketball season with an 18-10 overall record and made its seventh consecutive GLIAC Tournament appearance last campaign. FSU, which posted a third-place tying 12-6 mark in GLIAC North Division play a year ago, also registered its 10th consecutive season with 10 or more victories in 2005-06.

✓**TRACEY BLOODWORTH-FISK:** Ninth-year FSU head coach **Tracey Bloodworth-Fisk** presently ranks as Ferris' all-time winningest coach with a current 156-95 (.622) career record at Ferris State. A 1996 graduate of Western Michigan, she guided FSU to a 22-7 mark and the school's first NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tourney appearance during the 1999-00 campaign. She spent three seasons as an assistant coach at Lake Michigan College (1994-97) and one season at Indianapolis (1997-98).

✓**THE BULLDOG TRADITION:** The Ferris State women's basketball program, which is midst its 33rd season of varsity competition, has compiled a 409-420 (.493) all-time mark. The Bulldogs won their only GLIAC crown, advanced to their first NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Tournament and recorded the nation's highest grade point average in 1999-2000. FSU, which also claimed GLIAC Tournament runner-up honors in 1999-00, has posted 10 or more victories 10 consecutive seasons to date.

✓**THE BULLDOG ROSTER:** Ferris' 2006-07 roster includes three seniors, three juniors, five sophomores and two freshmen. Six of the 13 players are guards while the remaining seven are frontcourt players. All 13 players on the roster hail from Michigan. FSU senior guards **Erin Miller** and **Kristin Reinhart** along with junior forward **Rachel Folcik** and senior forward **Audrey Thwing** are the Bulldogs' captains.

✓**JIM WINK ARENA:** Ferris has recorded a 64-25 (.719) overall record to date in games at Jim Wink Arena, including a 49-22 (.690) mark in league play. The 2,400-seat facility replaced the Old Jim Wink Arena, which was converted into the current Student Recreation Center after the 1997-98 campaign. FSU won its first 14 games in the facility.

MORE BULLDOG BITES

✓ **REGIONAL RANKINGS:** Ferris State is ranked sixth in this week's (Feb. 28) NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional Rankings. The rankings help determine the field for the NCAA-II Great Lakes Regional March 9-12 at the site of the highest seed. Eight teams will make the regional field. Lewis (Ill.) topped the latest regional poll followed by Grand Valley State, Northern Kentucky, Drury (Mo.) and Southern Illinois-Edwardsville. Five of the top 10 regional teams were from the Great Lakes Valley Conference (GLVC) with five from the GLIAC including GVSU (2nd), FSU (6th), Gannon (8th), Michigan Tech (9th) and Lake Superior State (10th).

✓ **SELECTION BRACKETS:** The official brackets for the NCAA Division II Basketball Tournaments will be announced late Sunday (March 4) evening starting at 10:30 p.m. (EST). The show can be watched live via the NCAA website at www.ncaasports.com.

✓ **AWARD TIMES FIVE:** For the sixth time this season, **Rachel Folcik** was honored as this week's (Feb. 26) GLIAC North Division Player of the Week Award recipient. Folcik posted a game-high 28 points along with five rebounds, three steals and three assists as the Bulldogs secured a conference tournament quarterfinal-round home game with a thrilling 64-62 victory over nationally 12th-ranked archrival Grand Valley State in Saturday's regular-season finale at Jim Wink Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. Folcik's three-pointer with three minutes left to go in the game gave FSU the lead for good as the Bulldogs snapped a six-game series' losing streak to GVSU. She added six points, five rebounds and three assists in only 20 minutes of action as Ferris topped Marygrove 107-81 in non-league play Thursday (Feb. 22). Folcik totaled 34 points, 10 rebounds, six assists and four steals in the two-game stretch while averaging 17 points and five boards per game.

✓ **PLAYER OF THE WEEK NOTES:** Previously, **Rachel Folcik** was selected as the GLIAC North Division Player of the Week for the first time in her career to open the New Year (Jan. 3) and also attained the honor two other consecutive weeks (Jan. 15 & Jan. 22) in addition to last week (Feb. 12). She attained the league weekly honor six of the final nine times it was awarded this campaign. Folcik received the league's weekly honor more than any other male or female conference player this campaign. Her selection as the GLIAC's weekly award winner this week marked the eighth time a Ferris player earned the distinction this season as both **Kristin Reinhart** and **Erin Miller** were previous recipients on Nov. 20 and Nov. 27, respectively. FSU has presently had a player honored as the league's player of the week 21 times in the last five seasons, including the current year, to date.

✓ **FSU DUO EARNS ACADEMIC HONORS:** FSU's **Erin Miller** and **Rachel Folcik** were recognized as 2006-07 ESPN *The Magazine* Academic All-District IV College Division Women's Basketball Second Team selections. Miller and Folcik were among only five representatives from a GLIAC-member school named to any of the three District IV teams selected in voting conducted by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA). Miller was a first-team pick last year.

✓ **FOLCIK IN SPORTS ILLUSTRATED:** Ferris' **Rachel Folcik** was featured in last week's (Feb. 19) *Sports Illustrated* magazine issue in the popular "Faces In The Crowd" section of the weekly publication. Folcik was nominated for inclusion following her 37-point performance earlier this year in a 90-70 GLIAC road win at Mercyhurst (Jan. 18). Folcik was one of six athletes included in last week's edition and among four college student-athletes across the nation recognized. The "Faces In The Crowd" section, which can also be found online, honors athletes from all levels of competition on a weekly basis for their accomplishments.

✓ **BULLDOG BITES:** This year marks the 11th consecutive year the Bulldogs have won 10 or more games Ferris' current scoring average of 80.1 points per game is on pace to break the school's single-season record average of 77.2 ppg set in 2003-04 FSU's current free throw (.763) and field goal (.474) percentage totals also presently rank as the best seasonal efforts in school history Ferris has won 18 or more games in a season three of the last four years to date.

✓ **STATISTICS NOTES:** The Bulldogs were ranked second nationally in field goal percentage and sixth in scoring offense along with 12th in assists and 14th in free throw percentage according to the latest (Feb. 26) NCAA-II National Statistics. FSU currently leads the GLIAC in scoring offense (80.1 ppg), rebounding offense (41.5 rpg), rebounding margin (+5.8), defensive rebounds (28.8 rpg), assist/turnover ratio (1.00), free throw percentage (.763) and assists (17.9) while ranking second in field goal percentage (.474) and third in three-point percentage (.357) for all games played overall **Rachel Folcik** leads the GLIAC in field goal percentage (.570), ranks second in scoring (19.2 ppg) and free throw percentage (.860) in addition to fifth in rebounding (8.1 rpg). She's listed 10th nationally in field goal percentage and 24th in scoring on a national basis.

FERRIS STATE VS. HILLSDALE NOTEBOOK

✓ **SCOUTING HILLSDALE:** Hillsdale, which is coached by sixth-year head coach Claudette Charney, is presently 18-8 overall after Tuesday's quarterfinal win over Wayne State. The Chargers compiled a 17-11 overall record and a second-place 10-7 GLIAC mark in 2005-06. Senior forward Lauren Fewins presently ranks as Hillsdale's leading scorer (12.3 ppg) this campaign. HC, which was picked to finish second in the 2006-07 GLIAC South Division Preseason Coaches Poll, has won four of its last five outings to date this year. Charney previously spent seven seasons (1995-02) as the head coach at Grand Valley State along with 10 seasons at Saginaw Valley State and is the wife of former FSU Faculty Athletics Representative Mark Kosciuszko.

✓ **SERIES INFORMATION:** Ferris holds a 32-17 series edge entering Friday's 50th encounter, but dropped a 72-67 decision in this season's only meetings (Jan. 6) at Jim Wink Arena in Big Rapids. The Bulldogs have won six of the last 11 series' matchups overall. FSU head coach **Tracey Bloodworth-Fisk** currently has a 6-5 career coaching mark versus HC.

Scouting Michigan Tech: MTU maintains a 34-21 lead and has won 10 of the last 15 series' encounters. Ferris recorded a 77-64 road triumph in the first regular-season meeting earlier this year (1/13) at Houghton, Mich. The Huskies then responded with a 69-65 triumph 2/8/07 in the second meeting at Big Rapids, Mich. FSU head coach **Tracey Bloodworth-Fisk** presently has a 5-14 career coaching record against the Huskies. Michigan Tech, which is led in scoring by sophomore guard Sarah Stream (13.9 ppg), was chosen third in the 2006-07 GLIAC North Division Preseason Coaches Poll. The Huskies, who are guided by fourth-year head coach John Barnes, were 19-9 overall during the 2005-06 campaign and compiled a second-place 14-4 GLIAC North Division record. MTU has presently won eight of its last nine games going into the semifinals, including a 63-57 quarterfinal-round win at Grand Valley State on Tuesday (Feb. 27). The Huskies are 19-8 overall entering Friday evening's semifinal round.

Scouting Gannon: Ferris holds a 10-3 series' edge and has won nine of the last 11 contests. The Bulldogs claimed a 90-63 victory in this year's only regular-season meeting (1/20/07) at Erie, Pa. FSU head coach **Tracey Bloodworth-Fisk** currently has a 8-2 career coaching record against the Knights. Gannon, which is coached by fifth-year head coach Cleve Wright, compiled a 14-15 overall record in 2005-06 and were picked to finish third in the 2006-07 GLIAC South Division Preseason Coaches Poll following a third-place 8-9 GLIAC mark a season ago. Senior forward Christina Jackson presently ranks as GU's leading scorer (17.8 ppg) this season. Gannon has won each of its last seven outings to date this campaign entering Friday's semifinals. GU, which beat Saginaw Valley State 75-61 at home in Tuesday's (Feb. 27) quarterfinals, holds a 22-5 overall mark going into Friday's game and was 15-2 in GLIAC regular-season action this year.

BULLDOGS AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

The Ferris State women's basketball team has achieved success in more ways than one under eighth-year head coach Tracey Bloodworth-Fisk.

The 2005-06 squad was honored for having the nation's 20th-highest cumulative grade point average in the Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Division II Academic Top 25 Team Honor Roll. It marks the seventh consecutive year Ferris has placed among the nation's top 25 academic teams.

The Bulldogs compiled a 3.350 grade point average in 2005-06. FSU was ranked the highest of the two GLIAC member institutions ranked in the top 25 as Gannon placed 21st (3.343).

The Bulldogs, who previously compiled the nation's highest gpa (3.534) in 1999-00, also finished 21st (3.313) in 2001-02 and were 20th (3.388) for the 2000-01 academic year. Ferris' 3.604 gpa in 2002-03 placed second and also represented the fifth-best figure among teams from both the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Divisions I, II and III levels along with those representing National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) and National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) institutions. FSU was 17th overall (3.384) in 2003-04 before placing 14th overall (3.432) in the 2004-05 campaign.

The WBCA Top 25 Team Honor Roll list annually recognizes the nation's highest programs based upon nominations submitted by WBCA-member head coaches.

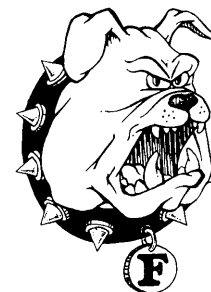
