### BULLDOG BITES

➤ **HOMECOMING GAMES:** Ferris State is 30-32-2 (.484) in its Homecoming contests dating back to 1931 and has won 11 of its last 15 outings. The Bulldogs had their three-game Homecoming streak snapped last season (10/23) with a 28-6 home loss to Michigan Tech. FSU's longest win streak is nine (1981-89). Ferris posted a 19-6 victory over Albion in its initial Homecoming in 1931 (10/17). The Bulldogs are 1-1-1 (.500) against NMU in such encounters with the last Homecoming game occurring in 1957 (10/19) which resulted in a 20-7 Wildcats' win.

➤ **CLOSING IN:** Senior split end **Brandis Bowie (Lansing/Sexton)** is 76 receiving yards away from tying Brian Busen (1995-98; 1,244 yds.) for 11th place among Ferris State's all-time receiving yardage leaders. Bowie, who accounted for the Bulldogs' lone score at North Dakota last Saturday (Oct. 8) on a 23-yard TD catch, has presently compiled 1,168 career yards on 104 receptions in 38 contests.

➤ **FIFTH BEST:** Senior flanker **Carlton Brewster's (Grand Rapids/Creston)** 4,635 career all-purpose yards (118.8 ypg.) currently ranks fifth on the school's all-time leaders list and is 411 yards away from tying Derek Fudge (2000-03; 5,046 yds.) for fourth place. Brewster is 209 yards shy of reaching the 1,000-yard single-season mark in all-purpose yards for the third consecutive campaign. The FSU wideout compiled a career-best 1,650 yards in 11 2004 contests.

➤ **A LEG UP:** Sophomore punter **Levi Slager (Polo, Ill.)** is nine yards shy of moving into an eighth-place tie with Kelly Goodsel (1985-86) for eighth place on FSU's career punting leaders chart. Slager has recorded 3,974 career yards on 106 punts in 18 contests for a 37.5 career average while Goodsel amassed 3,983 yards on 105 punts for a 38.7 yard average.

➤ **BEST SEASON EVER:** Senior split end **Larry Burton (Lansing/Eastern)** has totaled 105 more receiving yards this fall than in the previous campaign. Burton has accumulated 147 yards on eight catches in eight games this season after generating 42 yards on four grabs in nine outings for the 2004 campaign.

➤ **THE EIGHTH GAME:** Ferris State sports a 30-20-3 mark (.594) in its eighth contest of a season dating back to 1900. The Bulldogs are 18-10-2 (.633) at home and 12-10-1 (.543) on the road in such encounters during that period.

➤ **HISTORIC MILESTONE:** Head coach **Jeff Pierce** became Ferris' all-time winningest coach last season (9/4) with the Bulldogs' 23-17 overtime win at Ashland. Pierce surpassed current Hillsdale head coach Keith Otterbein (1986-94; 60-39-3) for the program's top honor.

### GAME FACTS

➤ **LAST GAME:** Ferris State had its two-game winning string snapped as the Bulldogs suffered a 44-7 non-conference loss to nationally second-ranked North Dakota last Saturday (Oct. 8) at UND's Alerus Center in Grand Forks, N.D. A season ago, Ferris went 6-5-0 overall and placed fifth in the GLIAC at 6-4-0 last season. The Bulldogs were 4-2-0 on the road last fall.

Northern Michigan dropped its second straight outing with a 27-10 conference loss to Ashland last Saturday (Oct. 8) at AU's Community Stadium in Ashland, Ohio. Last season, NMU registered a 2-8-0 record both overall and in the GLIAC (11th place). The Wildcats were 1-4 both on the road and at home last fall.

➤ **THE COACHES: FERRIS STATE – Jeff Pierce** (Ferris State, 1979), 11th season, 68-49-0 (.581) – (7-3-0 vs. Northern Michigan). Pierce has compiled a 35-21-0 (.625) coaching mark in home outings and is 26-17-0 (.605) in October contests to date. Pierce, who played collegiately (defensive back) at Ferris from 1974-77, is the 12th head coach in Ferris State's history.

**NORTHERN MICHIGAN – Doug Sams** (Oregon State, 1978), 4th season, 13-25-0 (.342); Career – 15th season, 71-77-0 (.479) – (2-1-0 vs. Ferris State). Sams served as head coach at Fairmont State (W.Va.) for 10 years and compiled a 53-47-0 coaching mark. He won two (1996 and 2000) West Virginia Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (WVIAC) football titles at FSC and was named the WVIAC's Coach of the Year in 1996.

➤ **OCT. 15 CONTESTS:** Ferris State is 5-8-0 (.385) all-time in outings played on Oct. 15. The Bulldogs, who are 1-3-0 at home and 4-5-0 on the road, posted a 34-14 league win at Wayne State in their last contest on this particular date. FSU celebrated its 1988 Homecoming with a 37-10 victory over Hillsdale.

➤ **DID YOU KNOW?:** Ferris has registered a winning season in 11 of its last 16 campaigns and in six of **Jeff Pierce's** 10 years at the helm. The Bulldogs won five consecutive conference championships from 1992-96 and were co-champs with Northwood in the 1999 campaign.

## HEAD COACH JEFF PIERCE



Jeff Pierce is in his 11th year at Ferris State and owns the distinction of being the Bulldogs' all-time winningest coach. He reached the milestone a season ago (9/4) in Ferris' overtime win at Ashland. Under Pierce, FSU has won or shared three GLIAC titles (1995-96, 99) while earning consecutive (1995-96) NCAA-II Playoffs berths, including a semifinal-round appearance in 1995.

### ALL-TIME SERIES INFORMATION

- Ferris State has won 10 of the last 13 meetings, including five of the last seven contests.
- Fifteen of the 31 meetings have been determined by 15 points or more and the Bulldogs are 8-7-0 (.533) in those encounters.
- In the last five contests, Ferris State is averaging 13.8 points per game (69 pts.) while Northern Michigan has averaged 14.0 points a contest (70 pts.) for a +0.2 points margin.
- Ferris State is 5-5-6 in contests decided by 10 points or less (3-1-3 home) and 7-8-0 in games decided between 11 or more points (4-4-0 home).
- The Bulldogs are averaging 23.7 points a contest (71 pts.) in their last three home appearances. The Wildcats have averaged 17.3 points per game (52 pts.) during that span.
- Ferris is averaging 279.3 yards in total offense (838 yds.) for the last three matchups. The Bulldogs have rushed for a 125.7 yard average (377 yds.) and passed for 153.7 yards (461 yds.) in those three games.

**NOTES:** Ben Keur kicked a 44-yard field goal in overtime for the winning margin as Ferris State spoiled Northern Michigan's Homecoming. The Bulldogs began the extra session with the first series on NMU's 25-yard line and after three plays, including a pair of incomplete passes, settled for the field goal. The Wildcats then took possession in the overtime but on their first play, quarterback Kelly Reed's pass was intercepted by outside linebacker Kevin Myers along the right sideline at the Bulldog two-yard line to preserve the victory. NMU had an opportunity to win the game in regulation, but kicker Thomas Lubuz's field goal attempt from 26 yards out sailed wide right with eight seconds remaining in the contest. Middle linebacker Mike Klobucher's 15 tackles (eight solos) was tops on the Ferris defense while outside linebacker Rob Mida had 10 stops (eight solos). Myers, who had eight tackles, reached the 100 tackles mark for the third straight season while tailback Andrew Terry eclipsed the 1,000-yard single-season rushing plateau with his 81-yard performance.

### MORE BULLDOG BITES

• **PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN:** Carlton Brewster has been selected as a 2005 preseason All-American by several gridiron publications and online services, which include *Lindy's* magazine, *Hansen's Football Gazette*, *www.CollegeSportsReport.com*, and *D2Football.com*. Brewster was recently named to *Detroit Free Press'* All-Small College Football Team, which is comprised exclusively of student-athletes from Michigan colleges only. The 2004 All-GLIAC First-Team pick was recognized as a honorable mention All-America honoree by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* and *D2Football.com* a season ago.

• **A SEASON'S COMPARISON:** FSU is averaging 315.7 yards per game in total offense after its initial seven outings this campaign compared to 379.6 yards a season ago. The Bulldogs have passed for an average of 206.9 yards to date and threw for 209.0 yards in 2004. Ferris' 108.9 rushing yards is 61.7 yards below last fall's 170.6 yards average. In scoring, the Bulldogs are at a 17.4 per game clip (122 pts.) after averaging 20.0 points (140 pts.) last season. The FSU defense has allowed 28.1 points (197 pts.) this fall to 20.3 points (142 pts.) in the 2004 campaign.

• **A KAUL TO PASS:** Senior quarterback Ryan Kaul (Clarkston) is 95 passing yards away from reaching the 1,000-yard mark this season for the second straight time. Kaul, who currently has thrown for 905 yards in five 2005 games, passed for a career-high 1,375 yards in 10 appearances last year. He enters this Saturday's tilt ranked eighth among Ferris' all-time passing leaders with 2,465 career yards in 26 contests.

• **NCAA DIVISION II LEADERS:** Among this week's (Oct. 8) NCAA-II leaders, Ferris is 65th in pass offense (206.9 ypg.), 65th in turnover margin (-0.1), 80th in total defense (346.0 ypg.), 97th in total offense (315.7 ypg.) and 99th in scoring defense (28.1 ppg.). Individually, Mike Klobucher is seventh in total tackles (12.1) and 24th in solo stops (5.4 avg.). Jim Skodak ranks 37th in punt returns (11.4 ypr.). Offensively, Carlton Brewster is 36th in receptions (5.6 avg.) and 47th in receiving yards (79.3 ypg.).

The Bulldogs only lead of the contest came late in the opening quarter when a long snap on a GVSU punt attempt sailed over punter Matt Regnery's head and was picked up near the goal line where junior cornerback Lenald Mombo proceeded to block Regnery's attempt and recovered the ball before dashing six yards for the TD to give Ferris a 6-3. Junior kicker Josh Eichler split the uprights on the point after attempt as the Bulldogs held a 7-3 advantage. GVSU controlled the game from rest of the way with 17 straight second-quarter points. A 23-yard field goal by Eichler early in the third quarter capped off an eight-play, 57-yard Ferris scoring drive.

Each team had other scoring chances but Eichler missed a pair of field goal attempts (33 and 39 yds. in the second and third quarter, respectively) while Indianapolis kicker Nick Parker was unsuccessful on a 28-yarder in the third quarter. The Bulldogs made a last-ditch effort to overcome the deficit with less than two minutes to go in the game, but quarterback C.J. Van Wieren's pass was intercepted by cornerback Kenneth Akridge at the FSU 49-yard line and returned back to the Ferris 25-yard line with 1:17 remaining where the Hounds proceeded to run out the clock. Indy prevailed for the third time in the last four series meetings. C.J. Van Wieren, who was making his first collegiate start, paced the Bulldogs in rushing with 67 yards while tailback Devon Mitchell had 57 yards on the ground. Outside linebacker Nick Maeder had a 16-yard interception return while free safety Chris Beaudry also had a pass theft.

**NOTES:** North Dakota came into the contest as the nation's second-ranked team and demonstrated why with 44 unanswered points in maintain its perfect record this season. The Fighting Sioux also extended their school-record home winning streak to 23 games with the non-conference decision. Unlike a season ago when Ferris State was shutout (45-0) by UND in the first-ever meeting between the two teams, the Bulldogs actually were the first to score as the visitors took the ball to start the contest and marched 74 yards on seven plays. The drive culminated in a 23-yard TD pass play from quarterback Ryan Kaul to split end Brandis Bowie. The FSU first-quarter TD marked the first time all season UND has trailed at home. The Bulldogs hoped to increase their lead after recovering a fumble on the Sioux's 12-yard line, but the UND defense blocked a field goal attempt and the momentum swung in its favor the remainder of the game.
