### BULLDOG BITES

- ☛ **MOMBO NUMBER NINE:** Junior cornerback **Lenald Mombo (Chicago, Ill./Hales Franciscan)** registered a season-best nine tackles and had a pass interception for a one-yard return at Michigan Tech last Saturday (10/22). Mombo's previous high was seven stops set in this season's opener at Grand Valley State (8/27).
- ☛ **SCORING STREAK:** Senior split end **Brandis Bowie (Lansing/Sexton)** recorded a receiving touchdown in his third straight game with a six-yard TD pass reception at Michigan Tech. Bowie has currently compiled a combined four TD catches in his last three contests to go with 127 yards receiving on nine grabs. In his previous six appearances this fall, Bowie accumulated 121 yards on 10 catches.
- ☛ **THE STREAK CONTINUES:** Senior flanker **Carlton Brewster (Grand Rapids/Creston)** kept his single-game reception streak intact with one catch for 58 yards at Michigan Tech. Brewster presently has at least one pass reception in 36 consecutive games during his Ferris State career. The last time the FSU wideout didn't catch a pass was in 2002 (10/12) against Michigan Tech. Brewster has notched at least one reception in 40 career outings to date.
- ☛ **THE FIRST TIME:** Junior split end **Matt Hohne (Jackson/Lumen Christi)** garnered his first collegiate TD on a 16-yard pass reception late in the fourth quarter at Michigan Tech. Hohne finished the game with a career-high 36 yards in receiving on two grabs.
- ☛ **SEEING DOUBLE AGAIN:** Redshirt freshman outside linebacker **Jeff Hollandsworth's (Livonia/Stevenson)** team-leading 10 tackles (five solos) at Michigan Tech represented his third double-digit single-game tackle performance this season and snapped a personal four-game non double-figure string in the process. He posted a season-best 15 tackles (seven solos) at Hillsdale earlier this season (9/10).
- ☛ **SCORING MACHINE:** Junior fullback-tight end **John Vandenberg (Trenton)** tallied a touchdown for the second straight week with a first-quarter one-yard plunge at Michigan Tech. Vandenberg hadn't scored a TD in 23 straight outings until posting a pair of rushing scores of two and one yards versus Northern Michigan (10/15).
- ☛ **HISTORIC MILESTONE:** Head coach **Jeff Pierce** became Ferris' all-time winningest coach last season (9/4) with the Bulldogs' 23-17 overtime win at Ashland. Pierce surpassed current Hillsdale head coach Keith Otterbein (1986-94; 60-39-3) for the program's top honor.

### GAME FACTS

☛ **LAST GAME:** Ferris State suffered a 35-19 conference setback to nationally 25th-ranked Michigan Tech last Saturday (Oct. 22) at MTU's Sherman Field in Houghton, Mich. A season ago, Ferris went 6-5-0 overall and placed fifth in the GLIAC at 6-4-0 last season. The Bulldogs were 2-3 at home last fall.

Northwood had its seven-game winning string snapped with a 30-14 conference loss to nationally top-ranked Grand Valley State last Saturday (Oct. 22) at NU's Hantz Stadium in Midland, Mich. The Timberwolves, who are ranked 15th nationally this week by the American Football Coaches Association (AFCA), are 3-0-0 on the road and 4-2-0 at home this campaign. Northwood posted a 10-2 overall mark last season and was GLIAC co-champions with a 9-1 league record. The Timberwolves, who earned a share of their third GLIAC title since 1999, set a school-record for most wins in a campaign and competed in the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second time in the program's history. NU dropped a 10-7 home decision to Grand Valley State (11/20) in the semifinal round. The Timberwolves are sixth in the current NCAA-II Northwest Region rankings as released by the NCAA-II Football Committee.

☛ **THE COACHES:** **FERRIS STATE** – **Jeff Pierce** (Ferris State, 1979), 11th season, 69-50-0 (.579) – (7-3-0 vs. Northwood). Pierce has compiled a 36-21-0 (.632) coaching mark in home outings and is 27-18-0 (.600) in October contests to date. Pierce, who played at Ferris (defensive back) from 1974-77, is the 12th head coach in Ferris State's history.

**NORTHWOOD** – **Pat Riepma** (Hillsdale, 1983), 13th season, 74-60-2 (.551) – (3-9-0 vs. Ferris State). Riepma is a four-time GLIAC Coach of the Year recipient, which is the most among active conference head coaches. He also is the second all-time winningest coach in NU history.

☛ **HOME FINALES:** Ferris State has compiled a 14-6-0 (.700) record in its final home regular-season appearance per campaign since 1985. The Bulldogs sport a 10-8-0 (.556) mark since 1990 and have won three of their last six such outings to date. FSU suffered a 47-14 season-ending home loss to Saginaw Valley State last season (11/6). Ferris State's last win in a regular-season home finale contest was in 2002 (11/9) with a 30-8 decision over Ashland.

## HEAD COACH JEFF PIERCE



Jeff Pierce is in his 11th year at Ferris State and owns the distinction of being the Bulldogs' all-time winningest coach. He reached the milestone a season ago (9/4) in Ferris' overtime win at Ashland. Under Pierce, FSU has won or shared three GLIAC titles (1995-96, 99) while earning consecutive (1995-96) NCAA-II Playoffs berths, including a semifinal-round appearance in 1995.

### ALL-TIME SERIES INFORMATION

- Ferris State has won 14 of the last 18 games, including 10 of the past 13 contests after Northwood was victorious in 11 of the previous 13 encounters.
- Seventeen of the 31 meetings have been determined by 15 points or more and Ferris State is 10-7-0 (.588) in those games – (5-2-0 home & 5-5-0 away).
- Three of the last eight contests have been decided by 15 points or less, but not the last three outings to date.
- In the last five meetings, Ferris State is averaging 26.0 points per game (130 pts.) to Northwood's 28.4 points a contest (142 pts.) for a +2.4 points margin.
- Ferris State is 4-5-0 in contests decided by 10 points or less (3-2-0 home and 1-3 away) and 12-10-0 in games decided between 11 or more points (5-4-0 home and 7-6-0 away).
- The Bulldogs are averaging 42.0 points a game (210 pts.) in their last five home appearances while the Timberwolves have scored an average of 24.2 points (121 pts.) an outing for a +17.8 points difference.
- Ferris is averaging 295.0 yards in total offense the last two games while Northwood has averaged 303.5 yards during that span.

**NOTES:** A combination of nationally-ranked Northwood's high-powered offense and inconsistency by Ferris State's offense proved too much as the Bulldogs dropped their season road finale. FSU scored the game's first points but the Timberwolves reeled off 22 straight second-quarter points to claim a 28-6 halftime lead. Ferris, which was outgained 338 to 184 yards in total offense, only could muster 33 yards in passing as Ryan Kaul was intercepted three times. Outside linebacker Kevin Myers and defensive tackle Whitney Bell totaled 12 and 11 tackles, respectively. Cornerback Jim Skodak recorded a pass theft to go with a 26-yard fumble return as the Bulldogs recovered four Northwood fumbles.

### MORE BULLDOG BITES

• **PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN:** Carlton Brewster has been selected as a 2005 preseason All-American by several gridiron publications and online services, which include *Lindy's* magazine, *Hansen's Football Gazette*, *www.CollegeSportsReport.com*, and *D2Football.com*. The 2004 All-GLIAC First-Team pick was recognized as a postseason honorable mention All-America honoree by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* and *D2Football.com* a season ago.

• **FINAL HOME APPEARANCES:** Eight seniors will be making their final Top Taggart Field appearance in this Saturday's contest – **Brandis Bowie**, center **Jamie Bretl** (Elmhurst, Ill./York), **Carlton Brewster**, split end **Larry Burton** (Lansing/Eastern), tight end-tackle **Ryan Fritz** (Elkton/Pigeon Laker), tackle **Phil Teeple** (Bancroft/Durand), guard **Jeff Williams** (West Branch/Ogemaw Heights), and tight end **Nate Wruble** (Harbor Beach). Quarterback **Ryan Kaul** (Clarkston) and cornerback **Jim Skodak** (Lennon/Corunna), a pair of seniors, have elected to return next season and use their final year of eligibility.

• **MEMORABLE CATCH:** Redshirt freshman flanker **Cole Meredith** (Paris/Big Rapids) recorded his first career pass reception with an 11-yard catch at Michigan Tech.

• **BIG FOOT:** Redshirt frosh punter **Jim Yates** (Goshen, Ind.) 161 yards on three punts (53.7 ypp) at Michigan Tech marked a season best.

• **NCAA DIVISION II LEADERS:** Among this week's (Oct. 22) NCAA-II leaders, Ferris is 60th in pass offense (217.6 ypg.), 61st in turnover margin (0.2 avg.), 81st in total offense (341.4 ypg.), 87th in scoring offense (22.6 avg.), 102nd in rush offense (123.9 ypg.), 115th in scoring defense (30.4 ppg.), and 116th in rush defense (194.2 ypg.). Individually, **Mike Klobucher** is 16th in total tackles (11.1) and 42nd in solo stops (4.9 avg.). **Jake Visser** is 36th in forced fumbles (0.33 avg.) and **Jim Skodak** ranks 32nd in punt returns (13.2 ypr.). Offensively, **Carlton Brewster** is 36th in receiving yards (83.3 ypg.) and 45th in receptions (5.3 avg.) while **Ryan Kaul** is 32nd in passing efficiency (138.8 rating pts.) and 41st in total offense (230.9 ypg.).

The drive culminated in a 23-yard TD pass play from quarterback Ryan Kaul to split end Brandis Bowie. The FSU first-quarter TD marked the first time all season UND has trailed at home. The Bulldogs hoped to increase their lead after recovering a fumble on the Sioux's 12-yard line, but the UND defense blocked a field goal attempt and the momentum swung in its favor the remainder of the game.

**NOTES:** Michigan Tech's Lee Marana was virtually a one-person wrecking crew as the junior halfback not only scored four rushing TD's, but also set two MTU single-game records for yards rushing (333) and rush attempts (51). Ferris State opened the scoring after its biggest play of the game – a 58-yard pass from quarterback Ryan Kaul to flanker Carlton Brewster to set up fullback John Vandenberg's one-yard plunge. But the 25th-ranked Huskies would eventually hit paydirt with two second-quarter scores as quarterback Drew Schaft's TD just before halftime gave MTU the lead for good. A 43-yard Jim Skodak punt return in the final frame put the Bulldogs at the Tech seven yard line and Ferris capitalized as Kaul tossed a six-yard TD pass to senior split end Brandis Bowie to get Ferris back within reach at 21-13. The Huskies, behind Marana, wasted no time in answering the Bulldogs' score with a 15-yard run at the 7:22 mark and then tallied again with 3:41 left from four yards out. He had 156 rushing yards in the fourth quarter.
