THIS WEEK: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will begin Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) play for the 2006-07 season this weekend (Oct. 20-21) with a home-and-home series versus the Western Michigan University Broncos. Ferris State visits Western this Friday (Oct. 20) in Kalamazoo, Mich., before hosting the Broncos in this Saturday's (Oct. 21) series finale in Big Rapids, Mich.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 2-2-0 overall and 0-0-0 in the CCHA following a home non-league series sweep of the Mercyhurst Lakers last weekend (Oct. 13-14) at FSU's Ewingleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids. FSU is among teams receiving votes in both this week's *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* and *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)* polls. Last season, Ferris State compiled a 17-15-8 overall mark which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites for the 2005-06 campaign.

Western Michigan is presently 1-1-0 both overall and in the CCHA after registering a 3-2 league victory over nationally-ranked Michigan State last Sunday (Oct. 15) at WMU's Lawson Ice Arena in Kalamazoo, Mich. WMU dropped a 4-1 decision to the Spartans in last Friday's (Oct. 13) series opener at MSU's Munn Ice Arena in East Lansing, Mich. The Broncos are also among other teams receiving votes in the *U.S. College Hockey Online/College Sports Television (CSTV)*

▲ A season ago, Western Michigan posted a 10-24-6 overall record and placed 11th with a 7-16-5 CCHA mark. The Broncos were 7-8-2 at home, 3-15-4 on the road, and 0-1-0 at neutral sites.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 227-266-48 (.464) – (21-22-2 vs. Western Michigan – 9-13-1 Away, 12-8-1 Home, 1-1-0 Neutral). **Western Michigan** – **Jim Culhane** (Western Michigan, 1987), 8th season, 111-138-29 (.451) – (12-14-0 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT WESTERN MICHIGAN: Freshman forward Mark Letestu presently leads the Broncos in scoring with three points (1-2=3) in two games this season and is tied for fourth among the nation's top rookie points leaders (1.50 avg.). Letestu was the 2005-06 Alberta Junior Hockey League (AJHL) scoring champion. Junior forward Brian Bicek (1-1=2) and junior forward Jeff Pierce (0-2=2) are other top WMU points getters. Junior Daniel Bellissimo (1-1-0, 3.00 GAA, .891sv%) is the Broncos' primary goaltender this season and led the NCAA in saves a season ago with 1,121 total

➤ **First One Counts** – Junior defenseman **Jim Jorgensen (Sault Ste. Marie)** tallied his first career game-winning goal in last Saturday's (10/14) 5-4 non-league win over Mercyhurst with an unassisted marker at 14:18 of the third period. Jorgensen was the Bulldogs' top scoring defenseman last season with a career-high 16 points (1-15=16) in 32 contests. In 70 career games, Jorgensen has totaled 25 points (4-21=25).

➤ **Firepower** – Ferris State has outshot its opponents in all four games this season and is averaging 40.8 shots per outing (163 total shots) compared to the opposition's 23.8 shots per game (95 total shots). The Bulldogs have recorded 40 or more shots on net in their initial three contests this campaign.

➤ **Productive Freshmen** – The Bulldogs are getting solid production from their freshmen class which has accounted for six of the team's 17 goals (35.3%) and 14-of-45 scoring points (31.1%) to date. Center **Aaron Lewicki (Livonia)** and right wing **Blair Riley (Kamloops, British Columbia)** each have a team-high tying five points (2-3=5) in four outings this season.

➤ **League Openers** – Since the 2000-01 season, Ferris is 3-6-3 (.375) in conference-opening series and 1-4-1 (.250) in its CCHA opener. The Bulldogs skated to pair of overtime ties (4-4 and 1-1) in last season's (10/21-22) conference-opening series at Lake Superior State. In the 2003-04 campaign, Ferris suffered a 4-2 loss at Western Michigan (10/10) before recording a 5-2 home triumph over the Broncos in the series finale (10/11).

➤ **No Relation** – The Bulldogs have two skaters on this season's squad with the same last name (Case) and the two are defensemen. However any similarities end there as sophomore **Evan Case (Grosse Pointe Woods)** and freshman **Matt Case (Plymouth, Minn.)** are no relation.

➤ **Still Together** – A pair of freshmen forwards, **Casey Haines (Indiana, Pa.)** and **Aaron Lewicki** were teammates a season ago in the junior ranks for the Texarkana (Texas) Bandits. Haines earned second-team North American Hockey League (NAHL) honors in 2005-06 with a team-high 73 points (29-44=73) in 58 games while Lewicki tallied a squad-best 34 goals as part of his 56 points (34-22=56) in as many games. Haines concluded his three-year (2003-06) as Texarkana's second all-time leading points getter.

➤ **Home Product** – Freshman center **Cody Chupp (Big Rapids)** is the most recent local product to be on the Bulldogs' roster. Chupp, who inked with FSU during last November's early-signing period, played at Waterloo (Iowa) last season and was named team MVP after producing 42 points (14-28=42) in 57 contests. Chupp was a three-time (2000-03) prep all-stater at Big Rapids (Mich.) High School and a 2003 graduate.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
