GAME 22-23 ▲ 2006-07 SEASON

THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team continues play on the road for the third consecutive week as the Bulldogs skate against the Wayne State University Warriors this weekend (Jan. 12-13) in a two-game non-league series at Detroit, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Michigan State Fairgrounds Coliseum (5,500).

BROADCAST INFORMATION: No FSU radio broadcast is scheduled for this weekend's contests against Wayne State. Live internet stats are available on the CCHA website at <http://ccha.collegesports.com> and clicking on the Games/Results section near the CCHA standings.

TELEVISION BROADCAST: This Friday's (Jan. 12) contest versus Wayne State will be televised live on Comcast Local Detroit with Dan Gutosky calling the play-by-play and Lyle Phair serving as the analyst. Comcast Local is the premiere network for southeast Michigan customers to receive unprecedented coverage of local events, entertainment and sports.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is presently 5-13-3 overall and 3-10-2 in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) this season. The Bulldogs are coming off a CCHA series split against Northern Michigan last weekend (Jan. 5-6) at NMU's Berry Events Center in Marquette, Mich. Ferris lost a 4-1 decision to the Wildcats in last Friday's (Jan. 5) opener, but then registered a 5-3 victory in Saturday's (Jan. 6) rematch. FSU, which sports a 2-6-1 road mark this season, is 2-5-2 in its last nine contests.

☛ Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites.

Wayne State has compiled a 4-16-0 overall record with a fifth-place tying 1-7-0 mark in College Hockey America (CHA) to date. The Warriors suffered a pair of league road losses to nationally-ranked Bemidji State last weekend (Jan. 5-6) at BSU's John S. Glas Fieldhouse in Bemidji, Minn. WSU dropped a 3-2 decision in the series opener (Jan. 5) and then suffered a 7-5 setback in the finale (Jan. 6). The Warriors, who are 1-4-0 at home this season, are 1-7-0 in their last eight encounters.

☛ Wayne State registered a 6-23-6 overall record for the 2005-06 season, which included a

sixth-place 3-12-5 mark in the CHA.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 230-277-51 (.458) – (3-1-0 vs. Wayne State – 2-0-0 Away, 1-1-0 Home). **Wayne State** – **Bill Wilkinson** (St. Lawrence, 1970), 8th season, 105-138-24 (.438) (1-3-0 vs. Ferris State); Career: 25th season, 418-439-77 (.489). Wilkinson served 17 seasons (1982-99) as head coach at Western Michigan and compiled a 313-301-53 (.509) bench mark. He registered a 42-17-5 (.695) career record against Ferris State while at Western Michigan.

ABOUT WAYNE STATE: The Warriors currently have four skaters with double-figure points totals, paced by senior forward Jason Bloomingburg (7-7=14) and senior forward Nate Higgins (7-5=12). Junior forward Derek Bachynski (6-5=11) and senior forward Jason Baclig (3-8=11) are the other WSU players to record double digits in points. Senior Will Hooper (1-11-0, 4.08 GAA, .858sv%) is the Warriors' primary goaltender having started 12 of 13 contests this campaign. Freshman netminder Brett Bothwell (3-5-0, 4.06 GAA, .894sv%) has started in all eight of his appearances this season.

Did You Know?: Ferris State is 17-9-0 (.654) all-time against current College Hockey America (CHA) teams. The Bulldogs split a non-league home series against Bemidji State last season (Nov. 18-19) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. Ferris won the opener by a 6-1 score, but then suffered a 4-3 loss in the series finale. Ferris State's best mark versus a CHA opponent is Niagara with the Bulldogs sporting a 3-0-1 ledger (.875). FSU's most victories over a CHA foe is five (5-3-0) versus Bemidji State.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

➤ **Top Non-League Scorers** – Senior left wings **Matt Verdone (Summerstown, Ontario)** and **Eric Vesely (Woodstock, Ill.)** have tallied a team-leading three goals apiece. Verdone (3-2=5) is among five skaters with five points while Vesely (3-1=4) is tied for sixth place with two others.

➤ **Making His Case** – Freshman defenseman **Matt Case (Plymouth, Minn.)** posted his first collegiate points with a pair of assists in last Saturday's (1/6) victory at Northern Michigan. Case assisted on the game's first goal and then notched the first helper on the Bulldogs' game-winning lamplighter.

➤ **Big Mac** – Junior goaltender **Derek MacIntyre (Stanwood)** posted his first win of this season with a season-high 27-saves against Northern Michigan in last Saturday's (1/6) win. MacIntyre, a 2004 eighth-round draft pick by the San Jose Sharks, made his second start of the campaign after getting the nod in a home non-conference tilt against Union (10/7) but didn't figure into the decision in a 6-5 loss. He had eight saves in 25:03 of action and also saw playing time as a reserve at Miami (12/2), finishing with 11 saves in 27:38 of ice time.

➤ **Streak Ends** – Ferris State snapped a seven-game winless streak (0-5-2) with a 5-3 league triumph at Northern Michigan (1/6). The Bulldogs also ended a four-game losing skid to the Wildcats and won for the first time in Marquette since Feb. 2, 2002 (4-1 victory).

➤ **Little Big Man** – Sophomore left wing **Brendan Connolly (Canmore, Alberta)** turned in his first career two-goal game in Saturday's (1/6) win at NMU. He also recorded his third multi-point game of his career and the second this season after getting a goal and an assist in a 7-1 win over Mercyhurst earlier this campaign (10/13). The 5-6, 173-pound forward has already bettered his performance from a season ago with 11 points (6-5=11) in 20 outings this season compared to seven points (1-6=7) in 36 games for the 2005-06 campaign.

➤ **Moving Up** – Sophomore goaltender **Mitch O'Keefe (Almonte, Ontario)** moved into 11th-place among Ferris State's all-time saves leaders last Friday (1/5) at Northern Michigan with 17 stops in the contest. O'Keefe, the 2005-06 FSU Rookie of the Year, surpassed Phil Osaer (1998-01; 1,273 saves) and is now 284 stops away from moving into a 10th-place tie with Glenn Raeburn (1985-87; 1,561 saves). O'Keefe has presently registered 1,277 career saves in 53 appearances and is averaging 24.1 stops a game during that span.

➤ **Non-CCHA Scorer** – Senior center **Mark Bomersback (Rochester, Alberta)** has tallied 26 career points (10-16=26) in 36 non-league contests, which includes 13 points (5-8=13) in 12 non-league outings last season. The assistant captain has compiled 34.7% (26-75) of his career points production in non-league games.

➤ **Milestone Attained** – **Mark Bomersback**, who has missed 16 games this season after suffering an injury in the season opener versus Union (10/6), picked up his 75th career point last Saturday (1/6) at Northern Michigan with an assist. Bomersback has presently totaled 75 career points (31-44=75) in 121 contests, which included a career-high 32 points (16-16=32) in 40 outings a season ago.

➤ **Double-Digit Scorers** – Ferris State has five skaters with double-figure points totals to date this season, led by senior right wing **Zac Pearson (5-10=15)**, junior center **Dan Riedel (3-9=12)**, **Brendan Connolly (6-5=11)**, sophomore defenseman **Chris Zarb (0-11=11)**, and junior defenseman **Jim Jorgensen (3-7=10)**. The group has combined for 43.4% (59-136) of the squad's points production and 34.0% (17-50) of the team's goal scoring this season.

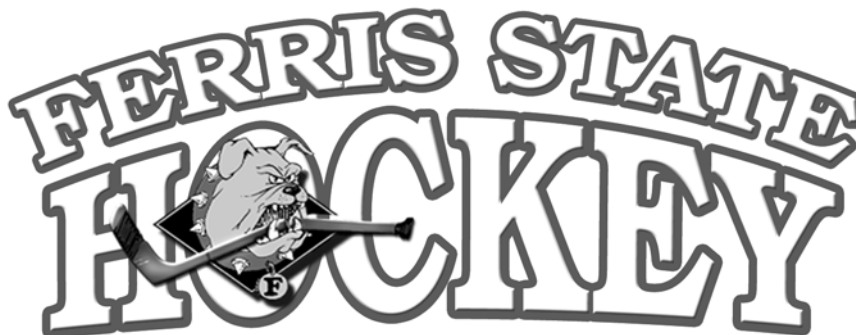
