## GAME 24-25 ▲ 2006-07 SEASON

**THIS WEEKEND:** The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team returns to Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) play this weekend (Jan. 19-20) as the Bulldogs entertain the University of Nebraska-Omaha Mavericks in a two-game series at Big Rapids, Mich.

**FACEOFF/ARENA:** Friday & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewingleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

**BROADCAST INFORMATION:** All of Ferris State's 2006-07 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. **TICKET INFORMATION:** Tickets for all 2006-07 Ferris State Hockey home games are available by contacting the Ferris State Athletics Ticket Office at (231) 591-2888. Hours are Monday thru Friday – 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. (ET) and Saturday (home games only) – 12 to 5 p.m. (ET).

**THE RECORDS:** Ferris State is currently 6-14-3 overall and 3-10-2 in the Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) this season. The Bulldogs split a non-league series against Wayne State last weekend (Jan. 12-13) at the Michigan State Fairgrounds Coliseum in Detroit, Mich. The Bulldogs claimed a 7-3 win over the Warriors in Saturday's (Jan. 13) tilt after suffering a 2-1 overtime loss in Friday's (Jan. 12) contest. Ferris, which is 2-3-1 in its last six games, has compiled a 3-7-1 home record this campaign.

➤ Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites.

**Nebraska-Omaha** is 10-10-6 overall and 7-7-2 in the CCHA following Tuesday's (Jan. 16) 3-2 overtime non-league loss to Minnesota State at the Qwest Center Omaha in Omaha, Neb. UNO registered a home league series sweep of Bowling Green State last weekend (Jan. 12-13). The Mavericks skated to a 2-1 victory in last Friday's (Jan. 12) opener and then posted a 7-0 win over the Falcons in Saturday's (Jan. 13) series finale. UNO, which is among other teams receiving votes in this week's *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll, sports a 7-3-2 record in its last 12 outings. The Mavericks are 2-6-4 in away encounters this campaign. UNO is

celebrating its 10th anniversary this 2006-07 campaign.

➤ Nebraska-Omaha concluded the 2005-06 season at 20-15-6 overall with a fourth-place tying 12-10-6 CCHA mark. UNO made its first appearance in the NCAA Tournament as the Mavericks dropped a 9-2 decision to Boston University in the first round (3/24) of the Northeast Regional.

**THE COACHES:** Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 231-278-51 (.458) – (5-11-2 vs. Nebraska-Omaha – 3-5-2 Home, 2-6-0 Home). **Nebraska-Omaha** – **Mike Kemp** (Gustavus Adolphus, 1975), 10th season, 154-181-43 (.464) (11-5-2 vs. Ferris State).

**ABOUT NEBRASKA-OMAHA:** The Mavericks have 10 players with double-digit points, led by senior forwards Scott Parse (17-21=38) and Alex Nikiforuk (8-23=31). Parse, who ranks eighth nationally in points per game (1.44 avg.), was the CCHA Player of the Year and a first-team AHCA All-America pick last season. The Mavericks are listed fifth among the national scoring leaders (3.96 avg.). Freshman Jeremie Dupont (6-5-4, 2.92 GAA, .888sv%) and sophomore Jerad Kaufmann (4-4-2, 2.87, .897sv%) have shared goaltending duties this season.

### GAMES THIS WEEK

TUESDAY, JANUARY 16

➤ **Productive Link** – Senior defenseman **Jeremy Scherlinck's (Grosse Pointe)** three points (1-2=3) against Wayne State Saturday matched his career high. Scherlinck, who's on a three-game point streak with five points (1-4=5), collected three assists in a home-ice win over Niagara (11/29/03). His seven points (2-5=7) in 12 games this season is one shy of equalling last season's output of eight points (3-5=8) in 30 contests.

➤ **First Lamplighter** – Sophomore defenseman **Chris Zarb (Waterford)** tallied his first collegiate goal on Saturday at Wayne State in the third period. Zarb, who has compiled a career-best 12 points (1-11=12) in 21 outings this season, hadn't scored a lamplighter in his previous 49 contests prior to Saturday. Zarb, a 2004 fifth-round selection by the Philadelphia Flyers, finished third among FSU defensemen in points a season ago with 10 total (0-10=10) in 29 appearances.

➤ **Congrats!** – Head coach **Bob Daniels** registered his 100th career road victory with Saturday's victory at Wayne State. Daniels, the 2003 recipient of the Spencer Penrose Award as the AHCA's Division I National Hockey Coach of the Year, claimed his 100th career win March 6, 1999 with a 2-1 regular-season finale triumph at Michigan State.

➤ **Season Best** – Freshman center-right wing **Cody Chupp (Big Rapids)** totaled three points (2-1=3) at Wayne State to surpass his two-points total (1-1=2) earlier this season at Western Michigan (10/20). Chupp also produced the Bulldogs' second short-handed marker this campaign against the Warriors.

➤ **Seven High** – Ferris State's seven goals at Wayne State Saturday matched a season high set on Oct. 13 in a 7-1 non-league decision over Mercyhurst. The last time FSU scored seven or more goals on multiple occasions in a season was 2003-04 when the Bulldogs accomplished the feat three times.

➤ **Outshot** – The Bulldogs have been outshot in three of their last four contests to date and are averaging 25.2 shots per game (101 total) to the opposition's 27.2 average (109 total). In its initial 19 outings this campaign, Ferris outshot its opponent in 14 contests while averaging 34.3 shots (652 total) compared to the opposition's 27.1 average (515 total).

➤ **On The Winning Path** – Junior goaltender **Derek MacIntyre (Stanwood)** registered his second win this season with 25 saves at Wayne State last Saturday. A 2004 eighth-round draft pick by the San Jose Sharks, MacIntyre turned aside 27 shots at Northern Michigan (1/6) to achieve his first victory this campaign.

➤ **Frosh Group** – Ferris' six-member freshmen class has combined for 20.9% (33-158) of the team's points production and 27.6% (16-58) of the goal-scoring output this season. **Cody Chupp** (6-5=11) and freshman center **Aaron Lewicki** (5-4=9) lead the way.

➤ **Warming Up** – **Aaron Lewicki (Livonia)** has compiled four points (3-1=4) during a current three-game point streak. Lewicki, who had went scoreless in his previous nine contests, also strung together a three-game point string (2-3=5) earlier this season (10/7-14).

➤ **No Jinx** – Sophomore left wing **Justin Lewandowski (Naperville, Ill.)** five points (1-4=5) in 14 games this campaign represents a career high, bettering his four points (2-2=4) in 25 contests last season.

➤ **Out For The Season** – Junior defenseman **Jim Jorgensen (Sault Ste. Marie)** will be sidelined the remainder of the 2006-07 season as a result of a broken leg injury suffered at Northern Michigan (1/6). Jorgensen had 10 points (3-7=10) in 20 games which ranked second among the squad's defensemen.

## HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
