THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will go up against the Ohio State University Buckeyes this weekend (Feb. 2-3) in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series at Big Rapids, Mich. The two-game set represents the first and only meetings between the two teams for the 2006-07 regular season.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Ewingleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

BROADCAST INFORMATION: All of Ferris State's 2006-07 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is presently 7-18-3 overall and 4-14-2 in the CCHA following a pair of league losses to the nationally-ranked Michigan Wolverines last weekend (Jan. 26-27) at UM's Yost Ice Arena in Ann Arbor, Mich. The Bulldogs, who are 3-7-0 in their last 10 contests, are 4-8-1 in home outings this season.

➤ Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall which included a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home, 8-8-3 on the road and 1-1-1 at neutral sites.

Ohio State is 10-11-5 overall and 8-8-4 in the CCHA after gaining a split last weekend (Jan. 26-27) in a two-game league series versus the nationally-ranked Lake Superior State Lakers at LSSU's Taffy Abel Arena in Sault Ste. Marie, Mich. OSU dropped a 4-2 decision to LSSU in last Friday's (Jan. 26) opener before registering a 5-3 triumph in Saturday's (Jan. 27) series finale. The Buckeyes, who are listed among others receiving votes in this week's *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll, are 6-3-2 in their last 11 encounters. OSU is 5-4-2 on the road, 5-6-3 at home and 0-1-0 at neutral sites this campaign. ➤ A season ago, Ohio State finished 15-19-5 overall with a 10th-place 11-14-3 CCHA mark.

(Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 232-282-51 (.456) – (18-26-3 vs. Ohio State – 13-9-2 Home, 5-16-1 Away, 0-1-0 Neutral). **Ohio State – John Markell** (Bowling Green State, 1979), 12th season, 225-203-42 (.523) – (23-15-2 vs. Ferris State).

ABOUT OHIO STATE: Senior defenseman Sean Collins (8-15=23), a 2005-06 All-CCHA Honorable Mention selection, is currently tops among 10 Buckeye skaters in double-figure points totals this season. He's listed seventh among the nation's top scoring defensemen with an 0.88 points per game average. Senior forward Tommy Goebel (9-12=21), a Michigan State transfer, and junior defenseman Jason DeSantis (2-18=20) have also reached the 20-point plateau this campaign for Ohio State, which is presently ranked 16th nationally in scoring offense (3.27 avg.). Junior forward Dominic Maiani (8-11=19) along with senior forward Mathieu Beaudoin (9-6=15) and senior forward Andrew Schembri (6-9=15) are other leading Buckeye points producers. Freshman goaltender Joseph Palmer (10-9-4, 2.84 GAA, .892sv%) has appeared in 23 outings this season with fellow frosh Nick Fillion (0-2-1, 4.51 GAA, .828sv%) has received playing time in six contests.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

➤ **Goal Scorer** - Senior left wing **Eric Vesely's** (Woodstock, Ill.) last six points have all been goals, which included a season-best tying two lamplighters in at Michigan last Friday (1/26). His team-high tying eight goals in 28 games this season is two shy of his career-best 10 markers set a season ago in 40 contests. Vesely has amassed 35 career points in 111 contests with 60% (21-35) being goals scored.

➤ **Streak Continues** - Senior left wing **Matt Verdone** (Summerstown, Ontario) extended his point streak to a career-best seven games with a pair of assists at Michigan last Saturday (1/27). Verdone, who picked up a helper at Michigan last Friday (1/26), has accumulated eight points (3-5=8) during the seven-game period.

➤ **No Place Like Home** - Senior right wing **Zac Pearson** (5-6=11) and **Matt Verdone** (5-5=10) have combined to produce 22.3% (21-94) of the Bulldogs' points production in 13 home encounters this campaign. A season ago, Pearson totaled eight points (2-6=8) in 18 home outings while Verdone produced eight points (5-3=8) in 18 Ewingleben Ice Arena appearances.

➤ **Approaching A Milestone** - Ferris State enters this weekend's (2/2-3) home series against Ohio State needing two victories to attain its 250th victory at the Ewingleben Ice Arena since the 1979-80 season. The Bulldogs, who started playing in the facility in 1979-80, are currently 248-206-49 (.542) all-time. FSU's best home mark was in the 1979-80 campaign as the Bulldogs posted a 16-5-0 ledger. Ferris has attained double-digit home victories in a season 12 times with the most recent occurring in the 2003-04 campaign (10-6-2). FSU registered an 8-6-4 home ledger last season.

➤ **One For All** - All 18 Ferris State skaters in last Friday's (1/26) game at Michigan recorded a shot on goal with **Matt Verdone's** six shots leading the way. The Bulldogs concluded the contest with 40 shots on net, which represented the sixth time FSU has racked up 40 shots or more in a game. Ferris posted a season-high 50 shots on goal versus Lake Superior State earlier this season (12/8).

➤ **Vote For Joe** - Senior defenseman **Joe Van Culin** (Monticello, Minn.) has been selected as finalist for the Pontiac Frozen Four Skills Challenge on April 6 as part of the 2007 NCAA Men's Ice Hockey Frozen Four to be held at the Scottrade Center in St. Louis, Mo. Van Culin, who has nine points (4-5=9) in 28 contests this season, was among 89 hockey student-athletes chosen by the selection committee. Voting is presently underway through Feb. 12 and fan votes will be used to help the committee decide the 32 skills challenge participants (16 male and 16 female). Ferris State fans can vote online at www.ncaasports.com or through the link on the hockey homepage at www.ferris.edu/sports/hockey. Van Culin was FSU's 2004-05 CCHA Scholar-Athlete of the Year honoree.

➤ **Productive February** - Senior center **Mark Bomersback** (Rochester, Alberta) generated a team-best tying eight points (3-5=8) in eight February 2006 contests while junior center **Adam Miller** (Livonia) garnered seven points (2-5=7) in eight games. Bomersback has compiled 10 points (3-7=10) in 19 career February encounters while Miller has notched 12 points (2-10=12) in 14 career February appearances.

➤ **Blueline Scoring** - Ferris State's eight defensemen have combined to produce 55 points on 13 goals and 42 assists in 28 games this season to date, which represents 27.9% (55-197) of the team's points output. Sophomore **Chris Zarb's** (Waterford) 14 points (1-13=14) is tops among the Bulldogs' blueliners. A season ago in its initial 28 outings, FSU's defensive corps had combined for 39 points with three goals and 36 assists. Junior **Jim Jorgensen** (Sault Ste. Marie) had a squad-high 13 points (1-12=13) in 25 contests at this time last season.
