GAME 32 ▲ 2006-07 SEASON

THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team will face off against the nationally-ranked Michigan State University Spartans this Tuesday (Feb. 13) in a Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) contest at Big Rapids, Mich.

FACEOFF/ARENA: 7:35 p.m. (EST)/Ewingleben Ice Arena (*pronounced A-VAH-glave-in*) (2,493).

THE BROADCAST: All of Ferris State's 2006-07 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM** with **Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports.

TELEVISION BROADCAST: This Tuesday's (Feb. 13) game will be televised live on FSN Detroit (DirecTV channel 636 and Dish Network channel 430). Fred Pletsch will serve as the play-by-play announcer with Lyle Phair providing analysis. Shireen Saski is the rinkside reporter. The telecast from Ewingleben Ice Arena will be the first one in the regular season since Oct. 17, 1986, when PASS (Pro Am Sports System) televised Michigan State's 3-2 win over the Bulldogs. FSN Detroit televised FSU's 3-0 home win over Ohio State in the opening game (March 3) of the 2005-06 CCHA Tournament First-Round series.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State dropped to 9-19-3 overall and 6-15-2 in the CCHA after suffering a 2-1 overtime league loss to Michigan State last Friday (Feb. 9) at MSU's Munn Ice Arena in East Lansing, Mich. The Bulldogs, who are 3-4-0 in their last seven outings to date, have registered a 6-8-1 home record this campaign.
 ● Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall with a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-6-4 at home.

Michigan State is 18-8-3 overall and 14-6-3 in the CCHA following a 3-3 league overtime tie against nationally-ranked Michigan last Saturday (Feb. 10) at Joe Louis Arena in Detroit, Mich. The Spartans claimed a 2-1 overtime home victory over Ferris State last Friday (Feb. 9). MSU remains fifth nationally in this week's *Inside College Hockey.com's* poll (INCH) while the Spartans are sixth in the *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV* poll and moved up into fifth place in the *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine* poll. MSU, which is 5-7-1 on the road this season, is midst a nine-game (7-0-2) unbeaten streak.
 ● A season ago, Michigan State was 25-12-8 overall which included a second-place 14-7-7

CCHA mark. The Spartans won the Mason Cup with a 2-1 win over top-seeded Miami (Ohio) in the 25th anniversary CCHA Championship game at Joe Louis Arena and claimed their CCHA-record 11th tourney title.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 234-283-51 (.457) – (9-31-7 vs. Michigan State – 1-12-5 Home, 7-18-1 Away, 1-1-1 Neutral). Michigan State – **Rick Comley** (Lake Superior State, 1972), 5th season, 109-68-19 (.605); Career: 706-543-90 (.561) – (7-2-2 vs. Ferris State at MSU and 44-15-4 vs. FSU all time).

ABOUT MICHIGAN STATE: The Spartans, who rank 14th nationally in scoring offense (3.31 avg.), are led by junior forward Bryan Lerg (20-11=31) and sophomore forward Tim Kennedy (13-15=28). Sophomore Jeff Lerg (18-8-3, 2.42 GAA, .915sv%) has been named this week's CCHA Goaltender of the Week. MSU is listed 12th among the national leaders in scoring defense (2.41 avg.).

➤ **Ten and Counting?** – Senior left wing **Matt Verdone's** (Summerstown, Ontario) current point streak has reached a career-best 10 games as a result of his short-handed tally in last Friday's (2/9) 2-1 overtime loss at Michigan State. In those 10 outings, Verdone has accumulated 13 points (6-7=13). He's also one point shy of matching his career single-season best 23 points (15-8=23) set in 38 contests last season and has 22 points (10-12=22) in 31 encounters to date this campaign.

➤ **He Likes The CCHA** – Sophomore left wing **Brendan Connolly** (Canmore, Alberta) has compiled a career-best 17 points (10-7=17) in 30 contests this season with 14 (8-6=14) occurring in CCHA play. Connolly produced seven points (1-6=7) in 36 games for the 2005-06 season.

➤ **Career High** – Senior defenseman **Joe Van Culin's** (Monticello, Minn.) 12 points (4-8=12) in 31 contests this season represents a career high, eclipsing his 11 points (3-8=11) in 39 outings for the 2004-05 campaign. Van Culin, who has tallied at least a point in three (0-4=4) of his last four contests, was selected as a finalist for the Pontiac Frozen Four Skills Challenge at the 2007 NCAA Men's Ice Hockey Frozen Four (April 6) in St. Louis, Mo. Voting concluded Feb. 12 and the participants will be announced in mid to late February. Van Culin, FSU's 2004-05 CCHA Scholar-Athlete of the Year, had three points (1-2=3) in 27 games a season ago in the squad's first 31 contests.

➤ **Productive 2007** – Junior goaltender **Derek MacIntyre** (Stanwood) is 4-1-0 with a 3.80 goals-against average (21 goals allowed) and .878 saves percentage (151 saves) in six 2007 contests. MacIntyre, a 2004-05 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention Team selection, is coming off a season-high 38-saves performance in a 6-2 home victory over Ohio State (2/3). The 2004 eighth-round draft pick of the San Jose Sharks began the new year with three consecutive victories – at Northern Michigan (1/6), at Wayne State (1/13), and versus Nebraska-Omaha (1/20) with 35 stops. MacIntyre appeared in just one 2006 contest during the 2005-06 campaign and had 20 saves in a 5-0 loss at Northern Michigan (1/13).

➤ **On The Shelf** – Sophomore defenseman **Chris Zarb** (Waterford) will be sidelined indefinitely after suffering an injury at Michigan State last Friday (2/9). Zarb is the team's top-scoring defenseman this season with a career-high 14 points (1-13=14) in 29 games and is a 2004 fifth-round draft pick of the Philadelphia Flyers. He generated 10 points (0-10=10) in 29 contests as a freshman last season.

➤ **A Season's Comparison** – The Bulldogs are averaging 2.71 goals (84 total) in their initial 31 games this season compared to 3.09 (96 total) a season ago. Defensively, Ferris has allowed 3.48 goals (108 total) this campaign after giving up an average of 2.87 (89 total) last season at this time.

➤ **Last Three Home Games** – Ferris State has posted an 8-9-0 (.471) record in its last three regular-season home encounters per campaign dating back to 2000-01. The Bulldogs went 1-1-1 in their final three regular-season outings last season, which included a 7-2 win over Western Michigan (2/4) and a 3-3 overtime tie versus Michigan (2/24) in FSU's regular-season home finale.

➤ **The Power Play** – Ferris State went zero for seven in power-play chances at Michigan State last Friday (2/9) after registering at least one power-play lamplighter in its previous six outings. The Bulldogs were operating at 26.3% (10-38) efficiency during man-advantage situations in that six-game span. Ferris is at 23.8% (5-21) in its three games this month after converting 17.3% (9-52) in its nine January encounters.

➤ **Seniors To Be Honored** – The Bulldogs will honor its six seniors prior to this Saturday's (2/17) Bowling Green contest. The class is comprised of forwards **Mark Bomersback**, **Zac Pearson**, **Matt Verdone**, and **Eric Vesely** along with defensemen **Jeremy Scherlinck** and **Joe Van Culin**.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.

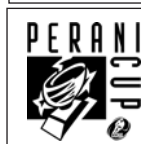
