GAME 35-36 ▲ 2006-07 SEASON

THIS WEEKEND: The Ferris State University men's ice hockey team concludes its 2006-07 regular season this weekend (Feb. 23-24) as the Bulldogs take on nationally number-one ranked the University of Notre Dame Fighting Irish in a two-game Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) series in Notre Dame, Ind. The games represent the first and only regular-season meetings between the two teams for the 2006-07 campaign.

FACEOFF/ARENA: Friday – 7:35 p.m. (EST) & Saturday – 7:05 p.m. (EST)/Joyce Center (2,713).

THE BROADCAST: All of Ferris State's 2006-07 CCHA games will be carried live by local radio station **Big Country WWBR-100.9 FM with Bill Beckwith** calling the action. The contests can be accessed live via the internet by clicking on the Bulldog Athletics Webcasts icon at www.ferris.edu/sports. **TELEVISION BROADCAST:** This Saturday's (Feb. 24) contest at Notre Dame will be televised live on Comcast Local with Ben Holden calling the play-by-play and Lyle Phair serving as an analyst.

THE RECORDS: Ferris State is 12-19-3 overall and 9-15-2 in CCHA play after recording a pair of league victories over the Bowling Green State Falcons last weekend (Feb. 16-17) at FSU's Ewigleben Ice Arena in Big Rapids, Mich. The Bulldogs have currently won five of their last six outings and are midst a three-game winning streak. FSU is 3-11-1 on the road, 9-8-1 at home and 0-0-1 at neutral sites this season. Last season, Ferris State was 17-15-8 overall with a sixth place-tying 10-11-7 CCHA record. The Bulldogs were 8-8-3 in away encounters.

Notre Dame improved to 26-5-3 overall and 20-3-3 in the CCHA as the Fighting Irish captured its first-ever CCHA regular-season championship title with a two-game league series sweep of the Alaska Nanooks last weekend (Feb. 16-17) at UA's Carlson Center in Fairbanks, Alaska. UND claimed a 1-0 win versus Alaska in last Friday's (Feb. 16) series opener and then extended its unbeaten streak to nine games (7-0-2) with a 3-2 overtime decision in Saturday's (Feb. 17) rematch. The Irish are the nation's top-ranked team this week in all three polls – *U.S. College Hockey Online/CSTV*, *USA Today/USA Hockey Magazine*, and *Inside College Hockey.com (INCH)*. UND is 10-1-2 at home, 12-4-1 on the road, and 4-0-0 at neutral sites to date this campaign.

• A season ago, Notre Dame posted a 13-19-4

mark overall and tied for eighth place in the final CCHA standings at 11-13-4.

THE COACHES: Ferris State – **Bob Daniels** (Michigan State, 1982), 15th season, 237-283-51 (.459) – (22-14-4 vs. Notre Dame – 14-9-3 Away, 6-5-1 Home, 2-0-0 Neutral). **Notre Dame – Jeff Jackson** (Michigan State, 1978), 2nd season, 39-24-7 (.607); Career: 221-76-32 (.720) – (2-0-0 vs. Ferris State). Jackson was 17-1-3 against Ferris State in his six seasons (1990-96) as head coach at Lake Superior State.

ABOUT NOTRE DAME: The Irish are ranked first nationally in scoring defense (1.71 avg.) and are eighth in scoring offense (3.53 avg.). Sophomore center Erik Condra (13-26=39), a finalist for the CCHA's 2005-06 Rookie of the Year, is tops among 13 skaters in double-digit points totals and ranks 34th nationally. Freshman right wing Ryan Thang (17-15=32), freshman center Kevin Deeth (15-17=32), and junior center Mark Van Guilder (15-15=30) have also reached the 30-points total. Senior David Brown (24-4-3, 1.66 GAA, .929sv%) is listed first in goals-against average, second in winning percentage (.823), and sixth in save percentage among the national leaders.

☛ **A Warm Spell** - Ferris State has won five of its last six contests and is midst a season-best tying three-game winning streak. Ferris is averaging 3.33 goals per game in its last six outings. The Bulldogs have outscored the opposition 20 to 10 in that span.

☛ **Hats Off To Miller** - Junior center **Adam Miller (Livonia)** recorded his first career hat trick, including two third-period markers, in last Saturday's 5-2 home regular-season finale win over Bowling Green State. Miller's nine goals in 26 games to date is one shy of equaling his career season-high of 10 goals in 40 games last season. Prior to Miller's feat, the last Bulldog to register three goals in a game was Dan Riedel a season ago (1/16) in FSU's 6-5 league win at Bowling Green State.

☛ **Productive Month** - The Bulldogs' current 5-1-0 February record is not only the team's most successful month this campaign, but also the best since the 2002-03 regular-season championship season when Ferris State won all of its six February contests.

☛ **The Final Two** - Ferris State is 22-28-4 (.444) all-time in its final two regular-season games, which includes a 7-8-1 ledger (.469) since the 1998-99 campaign. A season ago, the Bulldogs went 1-0-1 in a two-game home-and-home series (2/24-25) versus Michigan. FSU posted a 3-3 overtime tie against the Wolverines at home (2/24) and then notched a 4-3 overtime road victory (2/25) thanks to senior right wing **Zac Pearson's (White Lake)** game-winning goal 42 seconds into the extra frame.

☛ **Weekly CCHA Honoree** - Junior goaltender **Derek MacIntyre (Stanwood)** has been selected as this week's (2/19) CCHA Goaltender of the Week for his performance last week in the Bulldogs' three victories. MacIntyre, a 2004-05 CCHA All-Rookie Honorable Mention Team pick and a 2004 eighth-round draft pick of the NHL's San Jose Sharks, blocked 80-of-84 shots on net for a .952 save percentage and also posted a 1.33 goals-against average (four goals allowed) in 179:56 minutes of action. MacIntyre previously earned the league honor on one occasion during his 2004-05 sophomore season.

☛ **Four More** - **Zac Pearson's** four points (1-3=4) against Bowling Green (2/17) represents a career best, eclipsing his three-point game totals on as many occasions. Pearson, who tallied three points (2-1=3) versus Nebraska-Omaha (1/20), has produced both a team-leading and career-high 29 points (9-20=29) in 32 games this campaign. He had 26 points (6-20=26) in 40 outings last season.

☛ **There's No Place Like Home** - The Bulldogs will close out the 2006-07 regular season with a six-game home winning streak at the Ewingleben (*A-VAH-glave-in*) Ice Arena. FSU was able to outscore the opposition by a 25-to-11 margin with **Zac Pearson's** 10 points (3-7=10) and **Adam Miller's** nine (7-2=9) leading the way in those six home affairs.

☛ **A Happy New Year** - **Derek MacIntyre** has compiled a 7-1-0 mark since the start of 2007. The Ferris netminder has a .902 save percentage (231 saves) and a 2.93 goals-against average (25 goals allowed) in 511:25 of action. MacIntyre made 27 saves in a 5-3 victory at Northern Michigan (1/6) and was victorious in his next two appearances - at Wayne State (1/13) and against Nebraska-Omaha (1/20). In his current personal four-game win streak, MacIntyre has a 1.50 goals-against average (six goals allowed) and a .952 save percentage (118 saves). Four of the opposition's six goals have been on the man-advantage.

☛ **Best For Last** - Senior left wing **Matt Verdone's (Summerstown, Ontario)** 24 points (10-14=24) in 34 games this season is a career high, surpassing his 23-points total (15-8=23) in 38 2005-06 contests. Verdone has racked up 15 points (6-9=15) in his last 13 outings, which included a 10-game point string.

HEAD COACH BOB DANIELS

Bob Daniels, the 2002-03 Spencer Penrose Award recipient as the American Hockey Coaches Association



(AHCA) Division I Coach of the Year and the all-time winningest coach in Ferris State hockey history, is currently in his 15th year at FSU. Under his guidance, the Bulldogs posted a school-record 31-10-1 overall record in 2002-03 while claiming their first-ever Central Collegiate Hockey Association (CCHA) Regular-Season Championship title with a first-

place 22-5-1 league mark.

For his efforts, Daniels was honored as the 2002-03 Coach of the Year by the CCHA, *Inside College Hockey* (INCH) and the March of Dimes West Michigan Sports Awards. Prior to the 2006-07 campaign, Daniels ranked 16th among active NCAA-I hockey coaches in overall victories and 29th in winning percentage.

Daniels became Ferris State's all-time winningest coach on March 4, 2000, when the Bulldogs posted a 7-0 regular-season finale victory at Western Michigan. In 1998-99, Daniels notched his 100th career coaching win as the Bulldogs skated to a 2-1 regular-season finale victory at Michigan State, which snapped both the Spartans' 23-game unbeaten streak and 27-game home unbeaten string. He posted his 200th victory with a 6-2 home triumph over Western Michigan on Dec. 4, 2004.

Daniels was appointed FSU's head coach on the eve of the 1992-93 season and in his first campaign, the Bulldogs registered 21 victories and earn a CCHA Tourney Semifinal berth. It signified only the fourth time a Ferris team had won 20 games in a season and the second time in which a rookie coach won more than 16 games at FSU.

An AHCA member, Daniels served a four-year term on the AHCA's Board of Governors and currently is a representative of the NCAA Tournament West Regional Selection Advisory Committee.
